James Jones woke up to find his pet cat singing to him and waving a large gift under his nose.

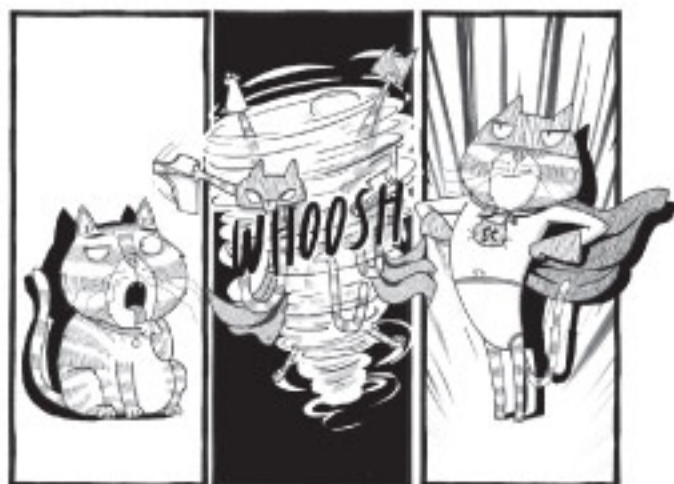
This wasn't any old cat. This was Supercat.
