Zoë and the Mermaids

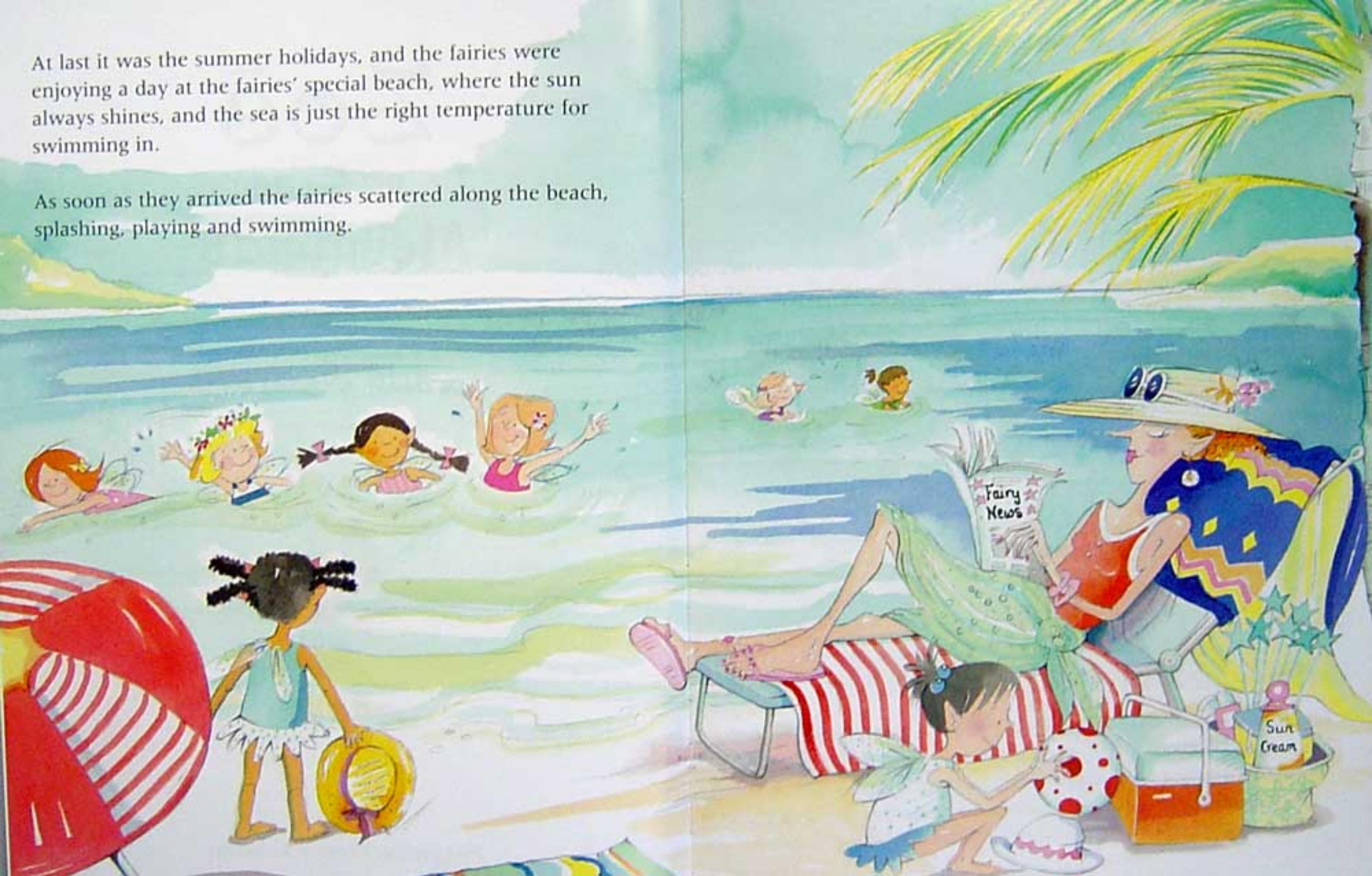
