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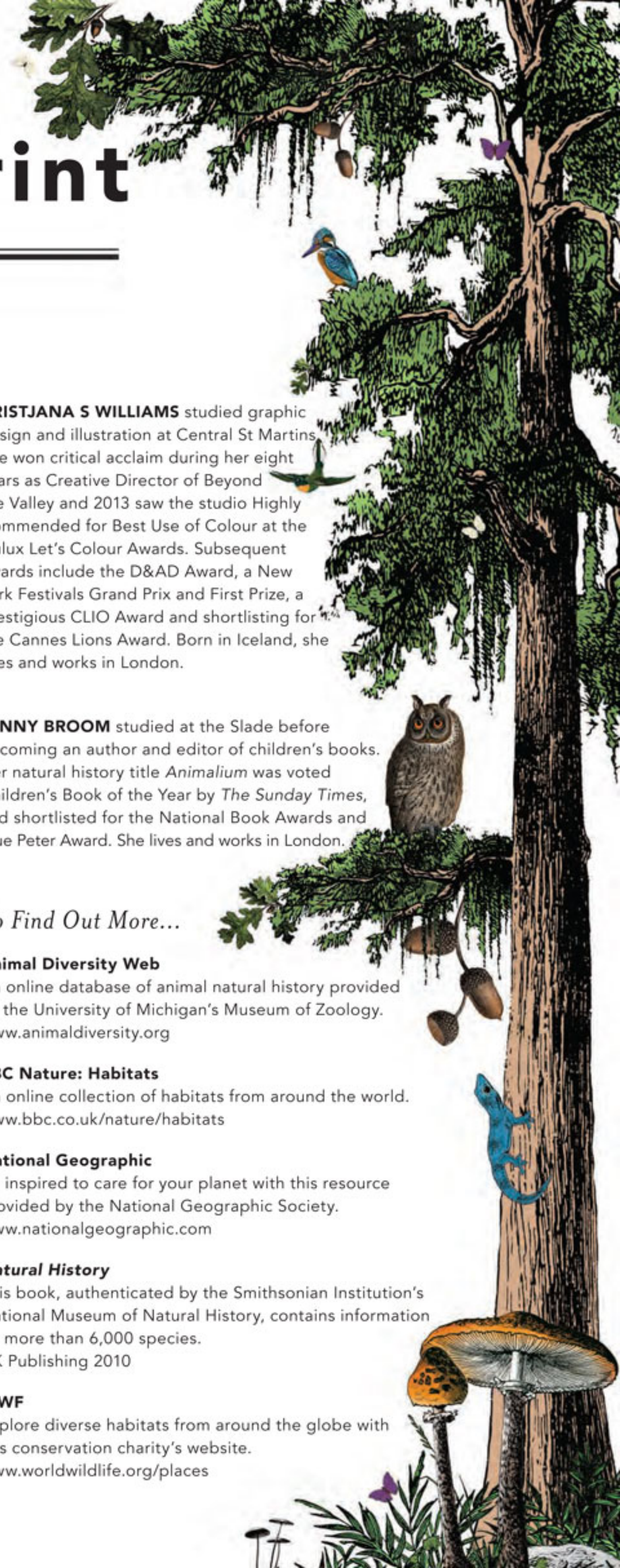

So, turn the page to creep through the **AMAZON'S** hot, humid rainforests, then dive down to discover the **GREAT BARRIER REEF'S** teeming shoals of fish. From there, travel to one of the driest environments on Earth, the **CHIHUAHUA DESERT**, where horizons stretch before you endlessly, and then, feel nature surround you as you wander into the woodland of the **BLACK FOREST**. And lastly, travel to the roof of the world, the **HIMALAYAS**, from where you can see Earth's Wonder Garden stretch out before you in all its majesty...

THE Amazon Rainforest

UNEQUALLED IN SIZE, COMPLEXITY
AND DIVERSITY, THIS RAINFOREST IS
THE WORLD'S ZOOLOGICAL JEWEL.

At than 55 million years old, its scale is mind-boggling:
IT IS MORE THAN 4 MILLION SQUARE KILOMETRES IN SIZE,
AND PRODUCES 20 PER CENT OF THE WORLD'S OXYGEN.

Ahead of you is a dense, vast forest, shrouded in mist. The air starts to thicken, the temperature rises and the humidity makes you feel clammy and sticky. With every footstep, the foliage multiplies until it begins to dwarf you. The horizon becomes obscured by plants, and the sunlight that reaches the forest floor is dappled; you look up and see

that you are shadowed by a giant canopy of trees that tower overhead.

Soon, you stand alone, swatting and swiping at insects, and listening to the howls and hoots of animals hidden in the undergrowth. You have arrived in the Amazon, the largest tropical rainforest and one of the richest concentrations of life on Earth.

Home to more than **5 MILLION SPECIES OF PLANT, INSECT AND ANIMAL**, and over **1,500 OF THE WORLD'S BIRD SPECIES**, the vast size of this habitat is hard to imagine.

Carving through the rainforest's heart flows its spectacular

life-source, **THE AMAZON RIVER: MORE THAN 6,400 KILOMETRES LONG**, it contains more than 2,000 species of freshwater fish in its waterways and tributaries. Animals in this environment can cover vast territories, or rely on just one tree for their survival, but each like its habitat, is extraordinary. Often, the animals are also extreme:

the largest snake in the world, the anaconda, one of the fiercest fish in the world, the piranha and the lethally toxic golden poison frog, all live here – and they may be just the tip of the iceberg as **THERE ARE MANY MILLIONS THOUGHT TO BE LEFT UNDISCOVERED...**

BECAUSE OF ITS WARM, HUMID CLIMATE, AMPHIBIANS AND REPTILES ARE ABUNDANT IN THE RAINFOREST. THE KIND THAT YOU COULD ENCOUNTER WILL DEPEND ON THE TIME OF DAY THAT YOU CHOOSE TO EXPLORE THE FOREST'S POOLS AND PLANT LIFE...

POISON-DART FROG

Family: *Dendrobatidae*

The poison-dart frog may seem small and vulnerable, but it is able to freely wander through the forest by day because of the brilliant colours of its skin, which advertises to potential hunters that their bodies contain a **TOXIN SO LETHAL THAT AN ADULT HUMAN COULD BE KILLED** by eating one.

GLASS FROG

Family: *Centrolenidae*

Wander out at night and you'll find that the forest has become a **CLAMOUR OF MUSICAL CLICKS, WHOOPS AND CROAKS**. Look up into the high leaves where you will find the glass frog, calling out his high-pitched **PEEP!**, which attracts female mates and warns other males away from his territory. Its skin is glass-like in its transparency – and so translucent in some species that you can see its heart beating!

BUTTERFLIES

Millions of migratory butterflies create a **WHIRLING CLOUD OF COLOUR...** scarlet peacocks, blue morphos and golden Homerus swallowtails create a rainbow overhead.

ANACONDA

Eunectes murinus

SLOWLY WINDING THROUGH THE BRANCHES is the long, strong anaconda.

This snake never stops growing, and becomes the largest in the world, killing its prey by wrapping it and crushing it to death.

BLACK CAIMAN

Melanosuchus niger

BEWARE THE BLACK CAIMAN stealthily sliding through the water. This creature is so fierce that fully grown – protected by its scaly armour and strong jaws – it becomes an apex predator, un-hunted by any other species.
