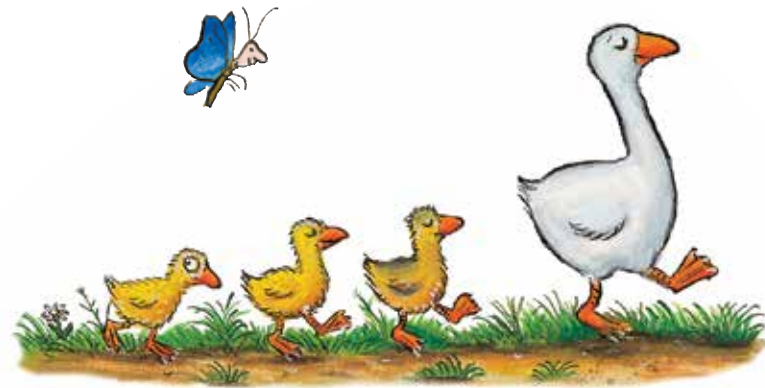
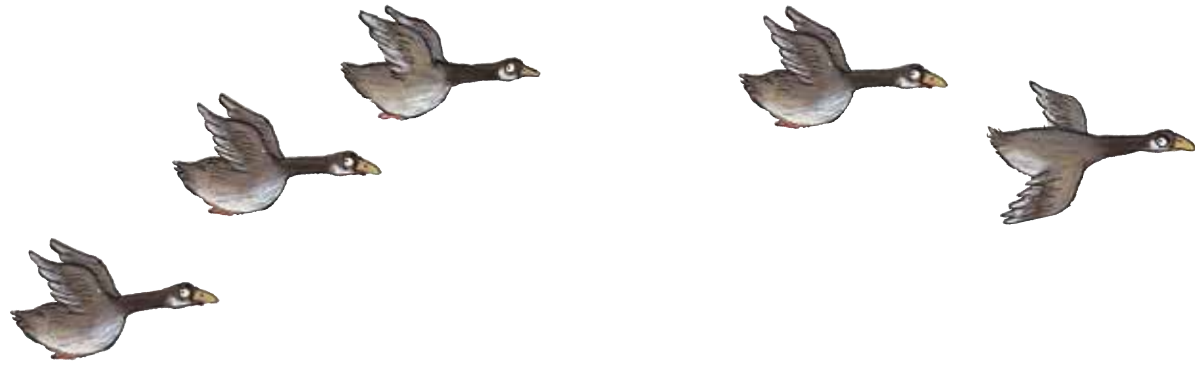
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One fine spring day a mother goose laid three eggs. When her goslings hatched she called them Boo, Lucy and Small.
