MUSIC

A woman singing a French song called *Au Clair de la Lune* in 1860 is the oldest-known recording of a human voice.

My *Minute Waltz* takes more than a minute and a half to play.

FRYDERYK CHOPIN (1810-1849)

There are 52 white keys...

...and 36 black keys on a piano.

No instrument has more strings than a piano. There are over 200 hidden inside.

More people have a harmonica than any other type of instrument.

Snake charmers in India and Pakistan play a wind instrument called a 'pungi'.

After a performance by the Spanish opera singer Plácido Domingo in 1991, the audience clapped for 1 hour and 20 minutes.

A platinum record is awarded to musicians whose albums sell 1 MILLION copies in the US.

Someone who makes string instruments is called a luthier (say loo-thier).

The strings on violins and cellos used to be made from sheep or goats' intestines.

An electronic instrument called a theremin makes higher and quieter notes the closer your hands are to its antennae.

If you uncoiled all the tubes in a trumpet and stood them end on end, they'd be taller than most 10 year old children.

There were 7,224 musicians in the largest orchestra ever. They played in Australia in 2013.

Saxophones are named after their inventor Adolphe Sax. He was born in Belgium in 1814.

Dolentidos are traditionally made from eucalyptus trunks or branches that have been nibbled hollow by insects called termites.

Trombones used to be known as 'sackbuts'.

A violin can be made up of more than 70 wooden pieces.

TRANSPORT

The blades of Russian helicopters rotate clockwise – the opposite direction to American ones.

The first red London bus was introduced in 1907.

The oldest steam train still running today is *The Fairy Queen* in India. It was built in 1825.

Bikes called 'tandems' have more than one rider.

The longest bicycle ever made is over three times longer than a bus.

The biggest wheels on any vehicle are almost as tall as me. They're on a mining truck.

At least one in every five cars in the world is white.

The Beijing Subway system is the busiest in the world. Over **9 MILLION** people use it every day.

The Channel Tunnel between England and France is the longest undersea tunnel.

The first motorbikes and cars were invented more than 150 years ago.

The Italian city Venice has 177 canals instead of roads, so even its fire engines are boats.

On most of the world's roads, drivers have to drive on the right.

A gondola is a type of boat used in Venice.

It's rowed with a long oar.

It took **61 DAYS** for the first submarine to travel around the world underwater in 1960. Its name was *USS Triton*.

The part of a hot-air balloon that fills with air is called the envelope.

At any moment there can be more than **7,000** aircraft flying in the sky.

Boats with sails have been used for more than 5,000 years.

The back of a boat is called the stern.

...and the front is the bow.

...the bottom is the keel.

The tallest bridge in the world is the Millau Viaduct in France.
