



### A NOTE FROM SHIRLEY HUGHES

#### Cold


Cold fingers,

#### **Red Robin Decorations**

You can make these colourful decorations to hang on a Christmas tree, or even use them as gift labels for presents!





- Draw a small circle on the red paper. Carefully cut it out and stick it onto the brown shape to give the robin a bright red breast.
- Stick an eye onto the robin and punch a small hole at the top of the decoration.
- Cut three small triangles out of the remaining brown card and stick them onto the robin: one for the beak and two for the feet.
- Carefully thread the red ribbon or string through the hole at the top of the decoration and tie the ends of the ribbon.
