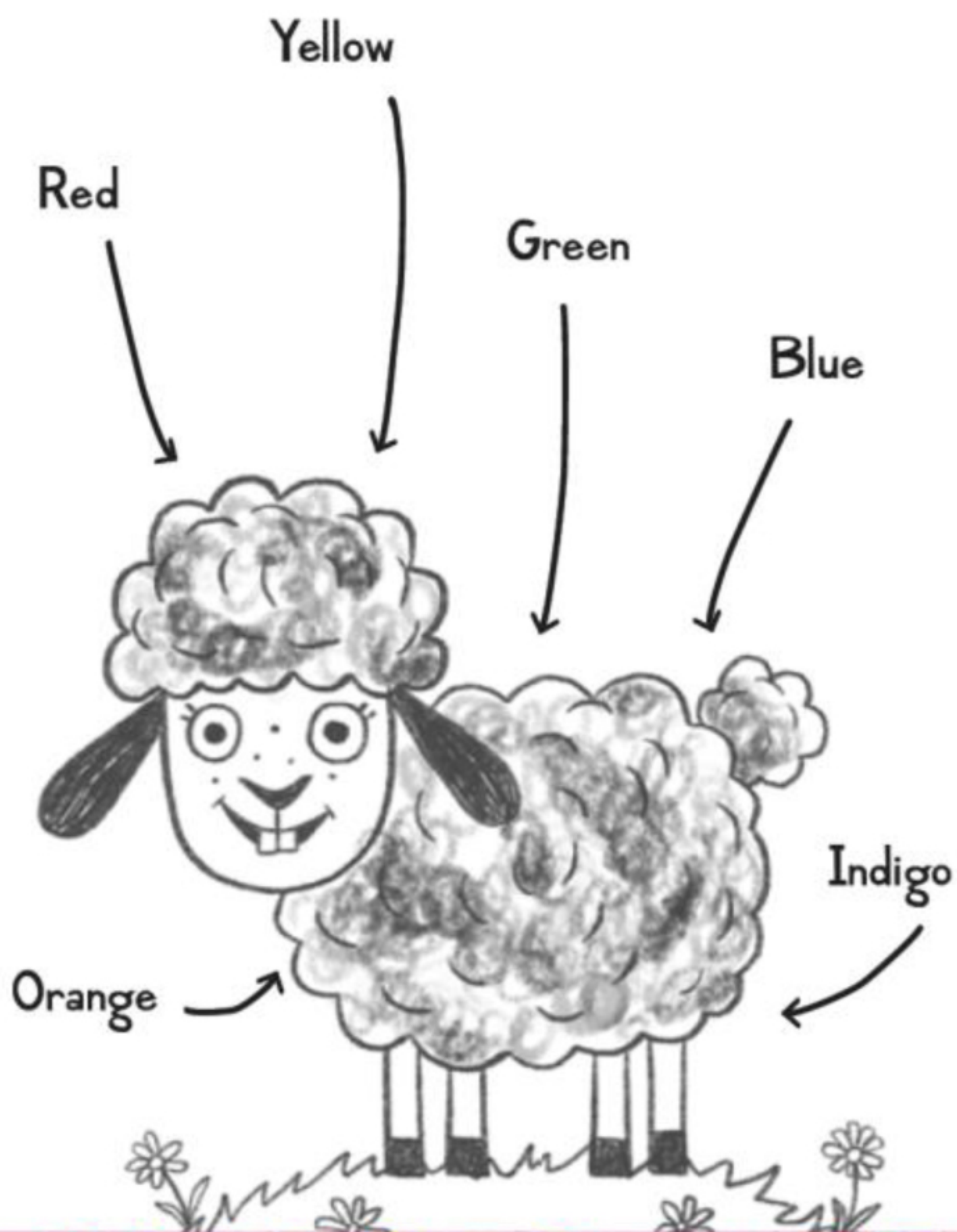
# THE MULTICOLOURED SHEEP OF THE FAMILY
