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“I need a pet,” said Max.

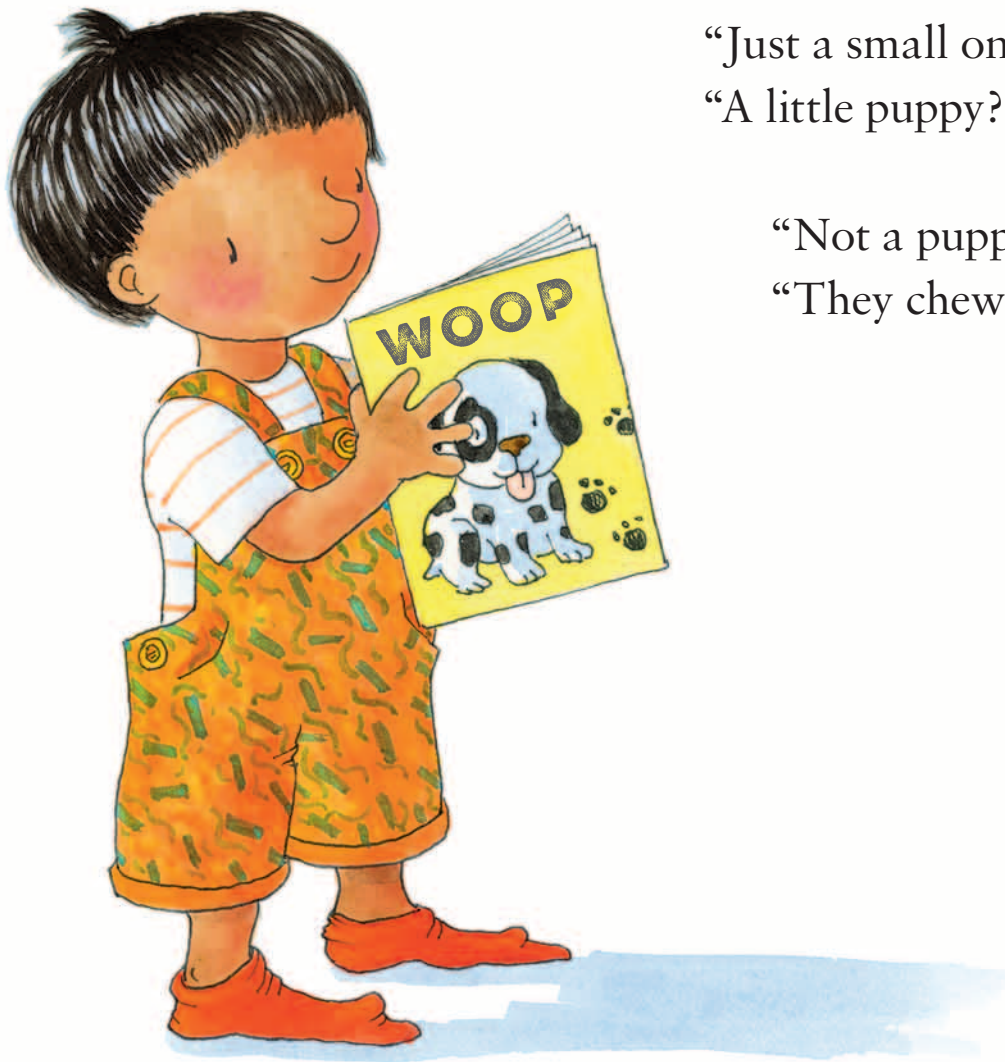
“Really?” said Mummy.
