
Warning: there are a few activities that need to be done with friends or family, so you might be asked to join in!

Characters become more realistic when you know all about them. To do this, you need to answer four questions.

- 1. WHAT DO THEY LOOK LIKE?
- 2. WHAT'S THEIR NAME?
- 3. WHAT DO THEY DO?
- Y. HOW DO THEY BEHAVE?

AUTHOR TIP

Are you wondering why you need to know things like whether your character likes dogs? Maybe you think this sounds a bit silly, but I promise it really works. The more you know about the character, the more realistic they will be when you write about them.








CHARACTER PROFILES
