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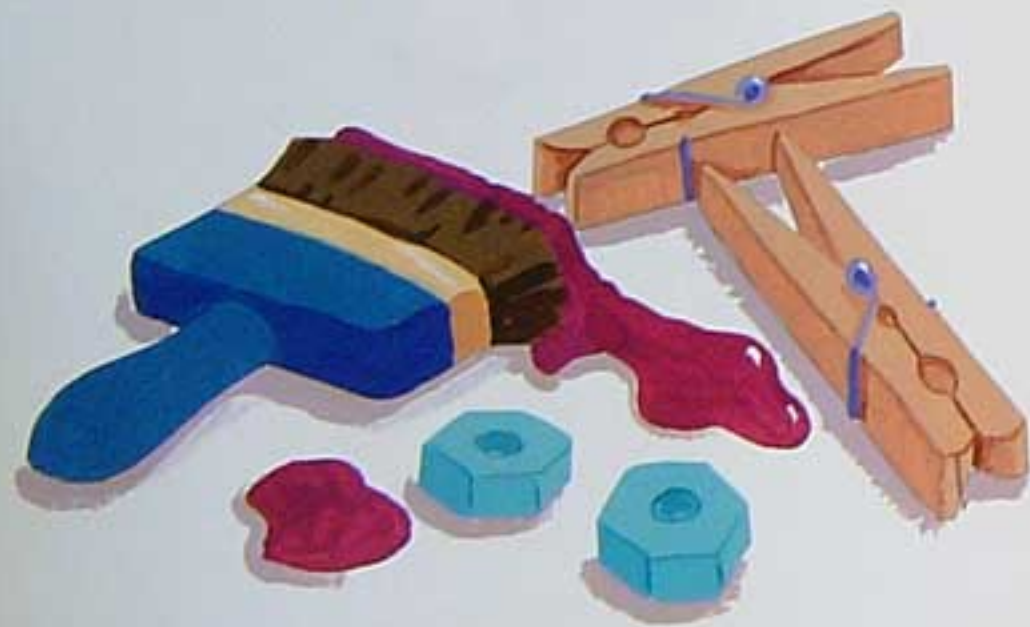
Cowboy Ted and the Scary Night

on her box.



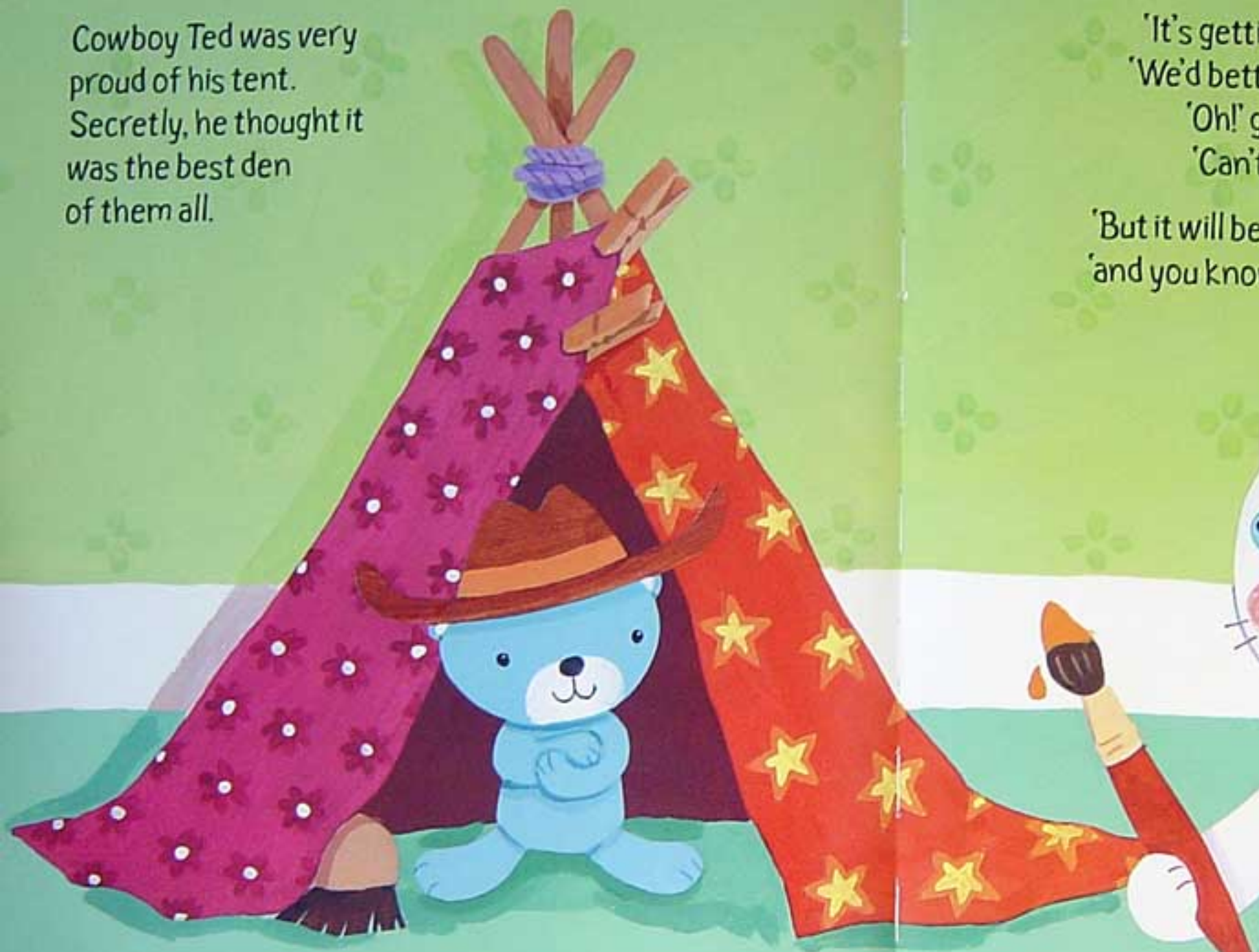
'Amazing!'
