Her heart **pounded** and her hands **trembled** with excitement, though questions filled her head.

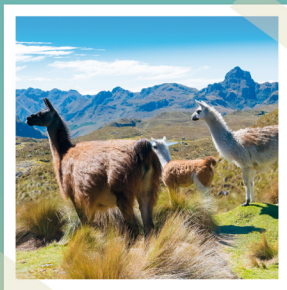

Llamas are shy, gentle animals that can be very curious. They live in mountainous places and are very intelligent, and can be trained to pull a cart and carry packs.

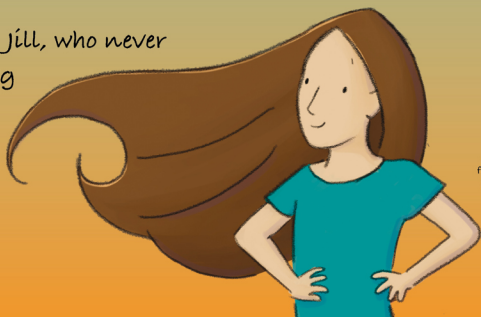


Northern pudú
