Now, each year, people in the UK buy 7.7 billion plastic water bottles. Sadly, only 1 in 3 of those bottles are recycled. But that can be improved!

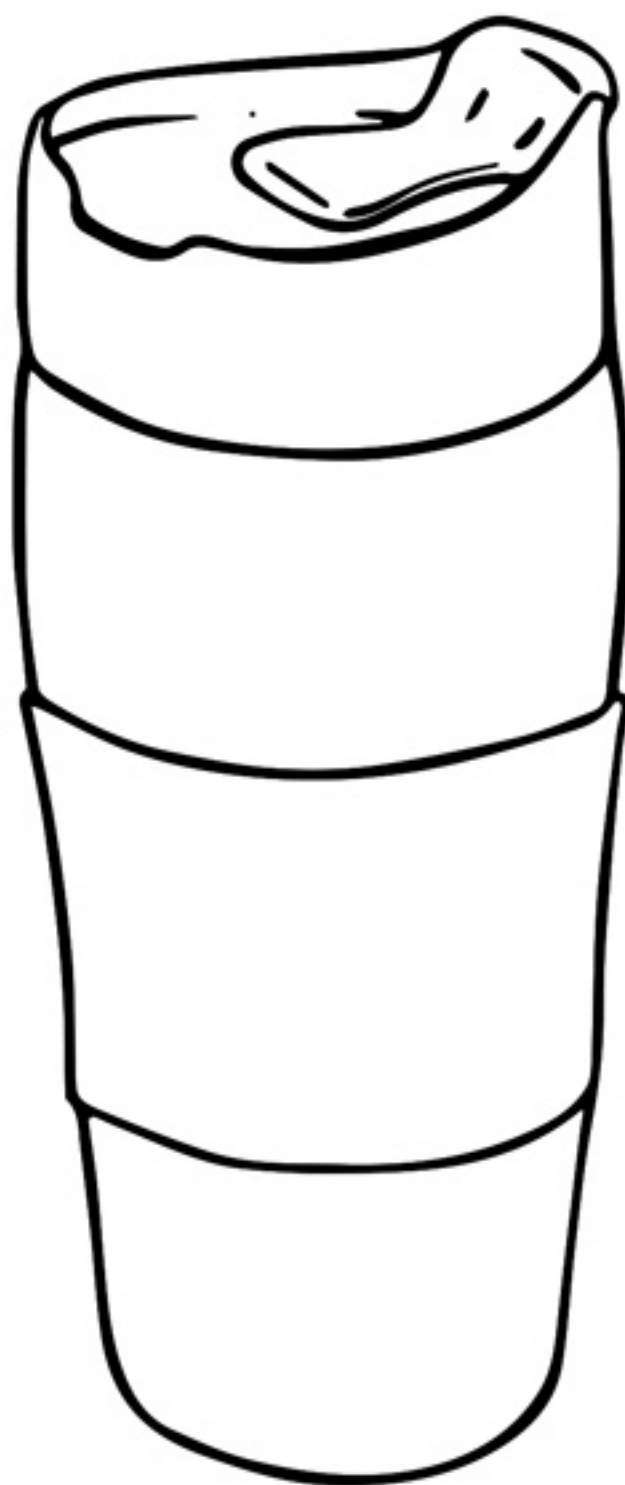
Instead of buying your water in a plastic bottle, get a reusable water bottle, such as a stainless-steel bottle. These are available in a range of colours, sizes and patterns, and will last you a long time. Alternatively, you can start by reusing bottles you already own. Think before you drink!

TIP!

You can also buy reusable milkshake and juice cups, which you can take to cafés or fill with your own homemade drinks.
