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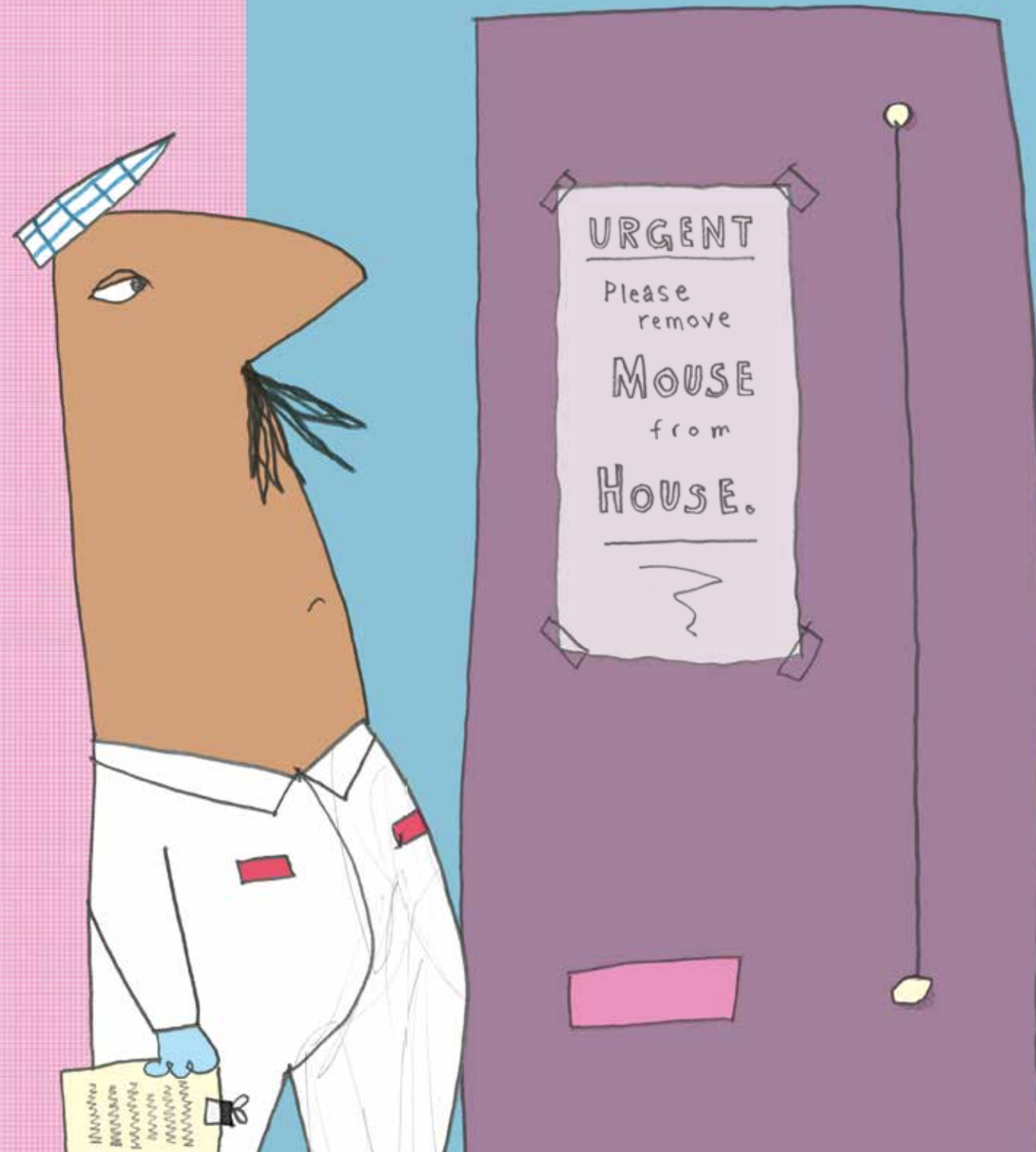
A van pulls up outside the *wrong* house
and out stumble the two catchers of mice:



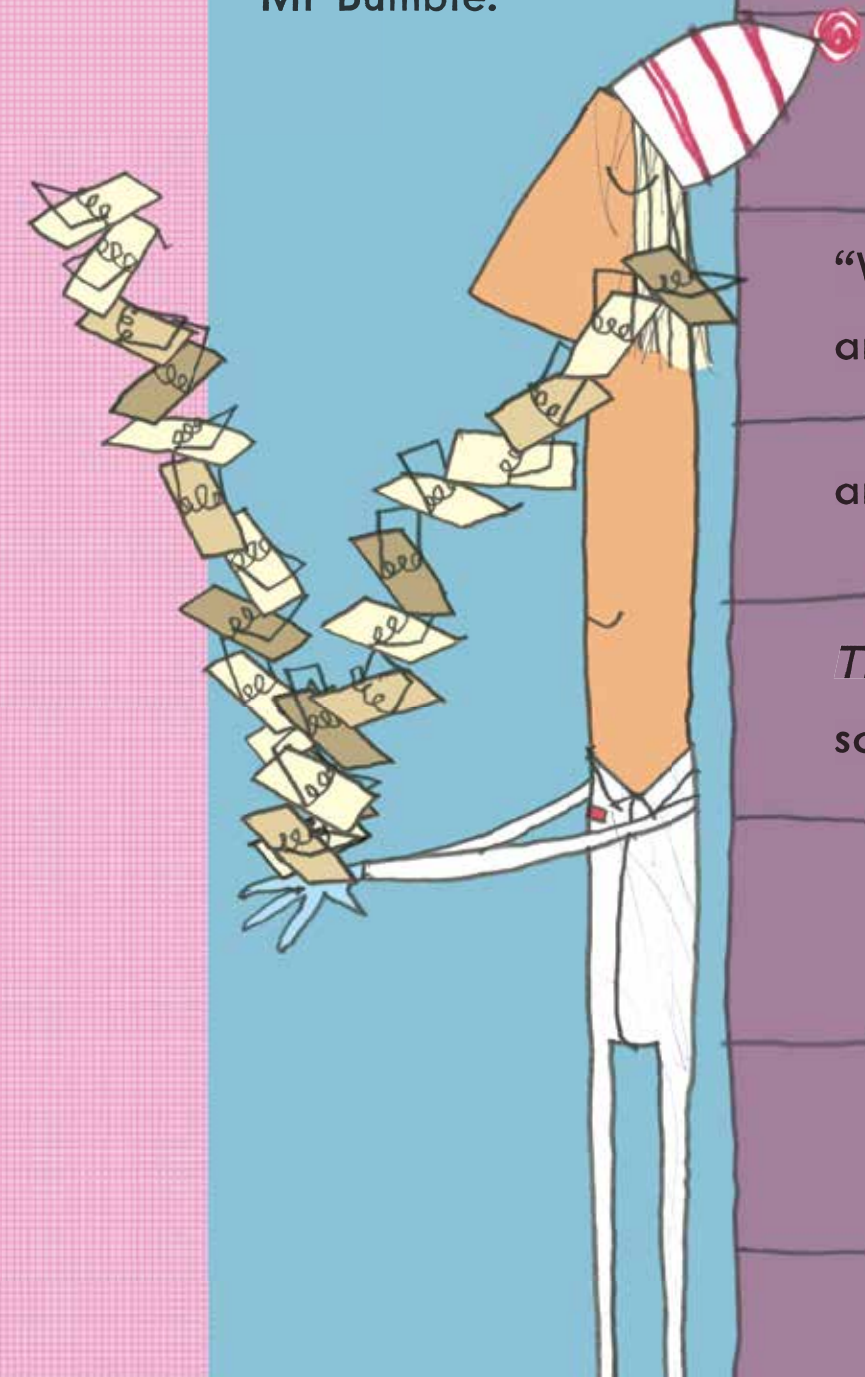
Mr Bosh

The traps

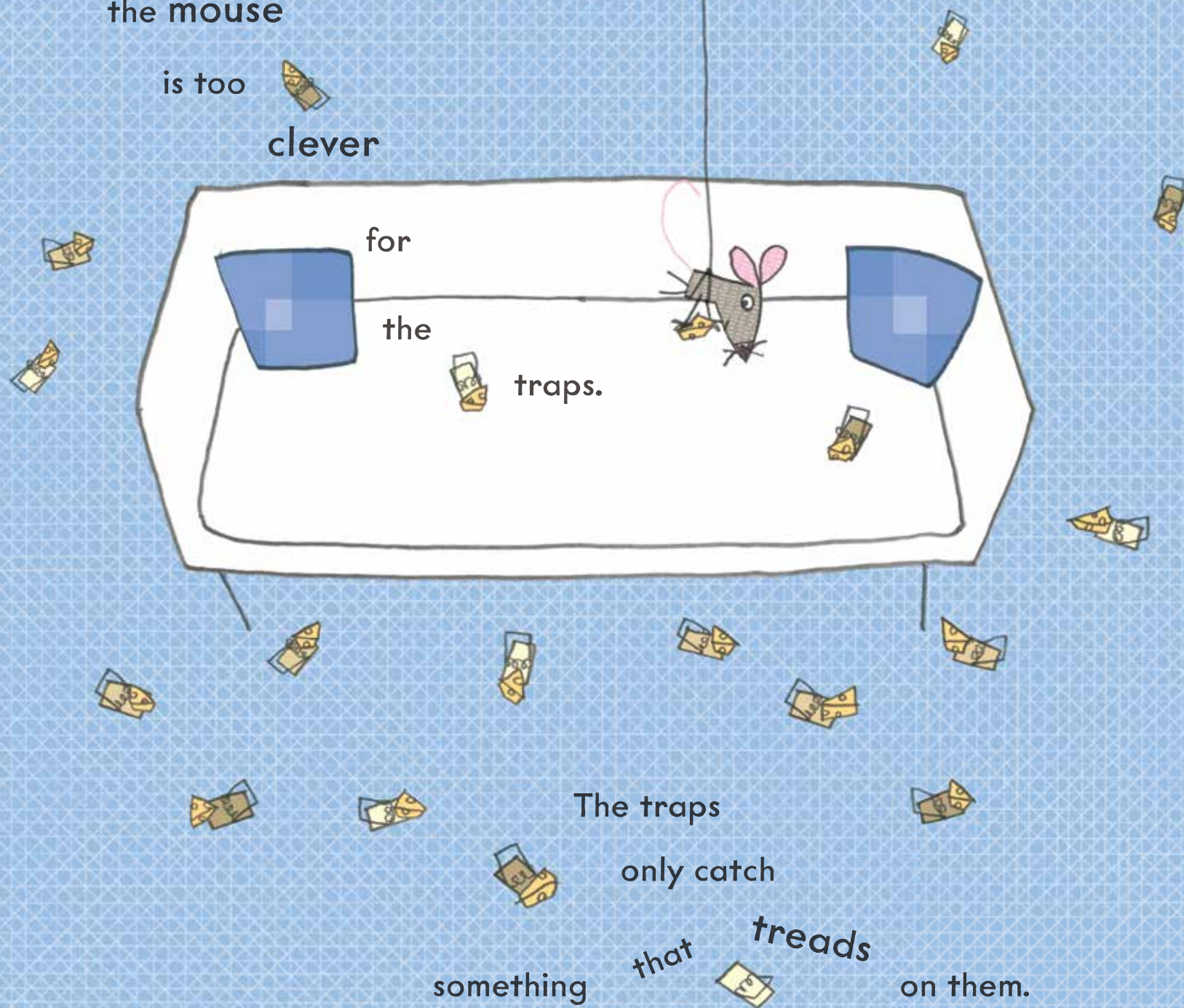
