Luckily Kitty's Cat Crew have faith in her and show Kitty the hero that lies within!

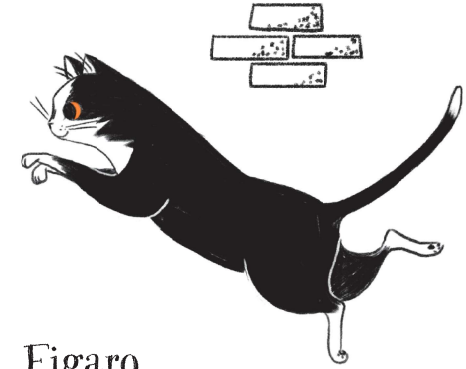
Pumpkin

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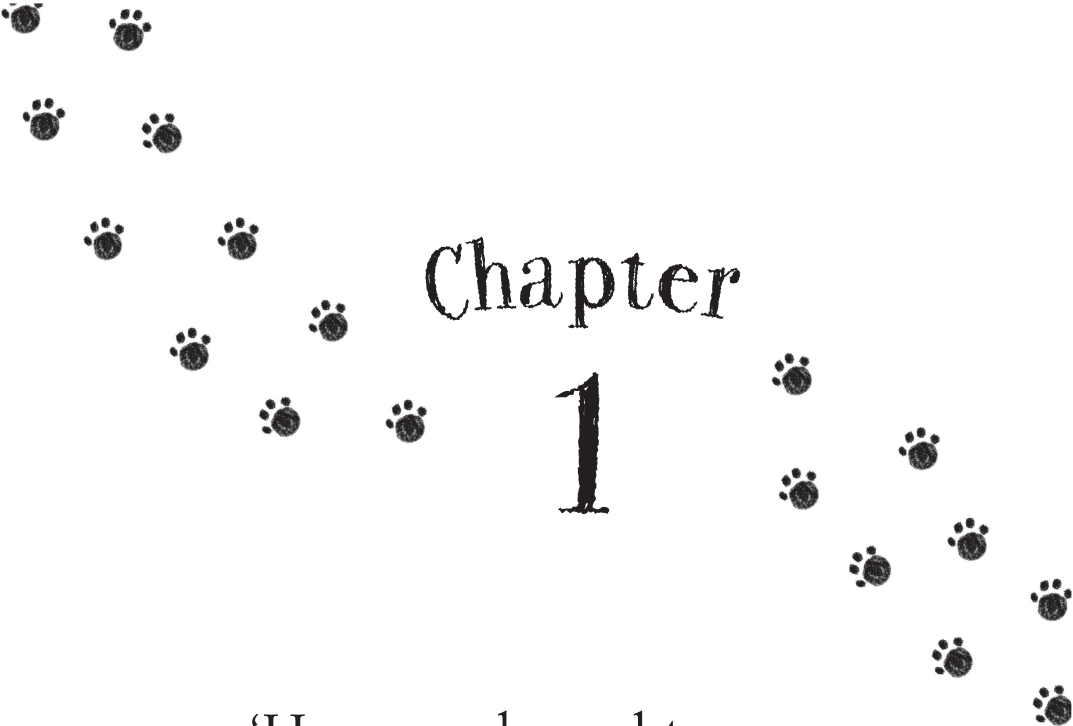
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Kitty
