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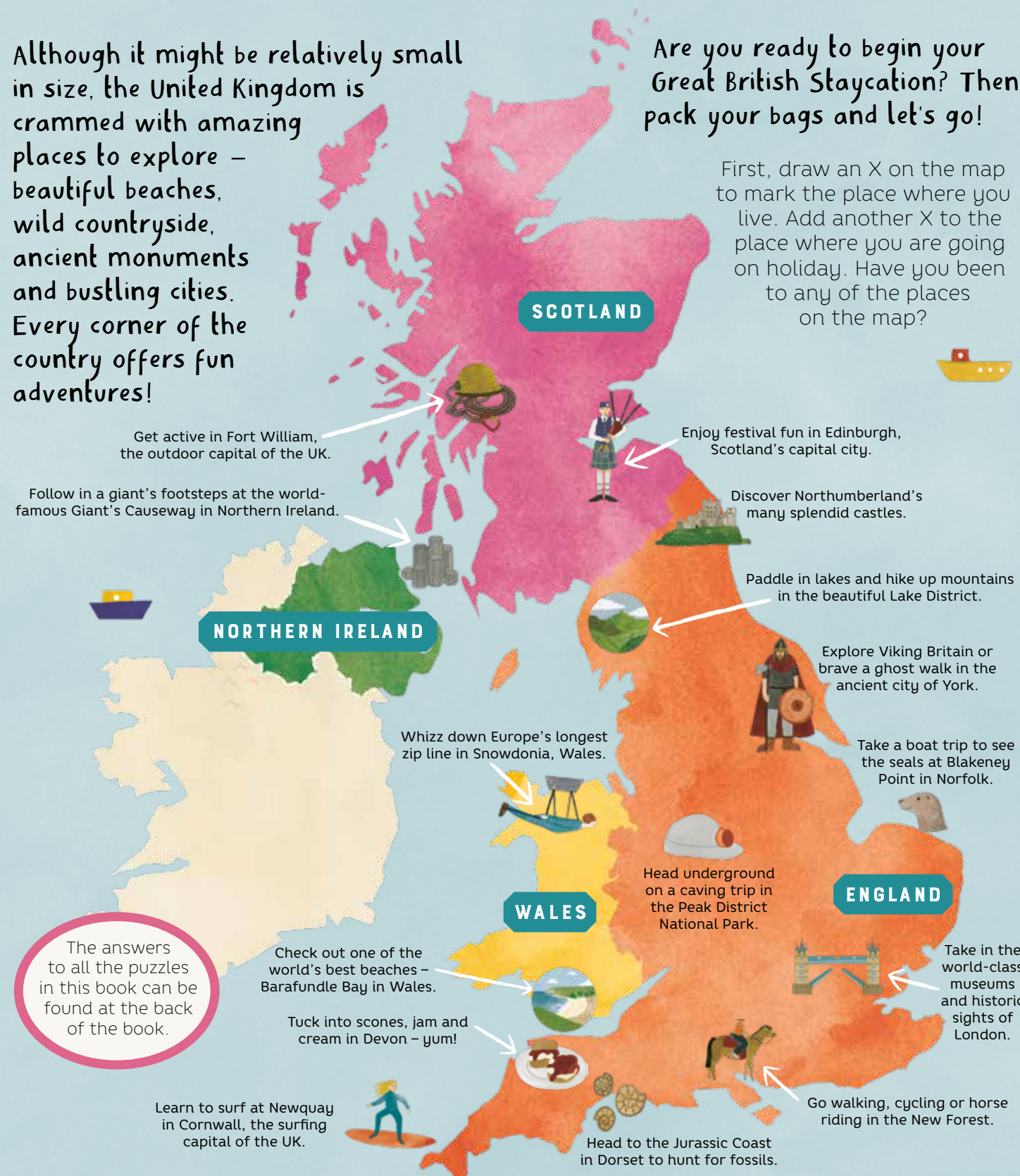


WELCOME TO THE UNITED KINGDOM!

2. At a roundabout, always head north.

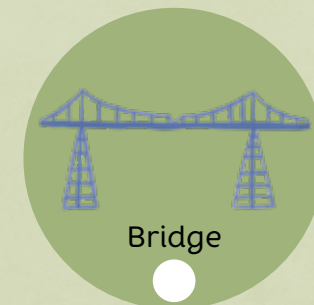
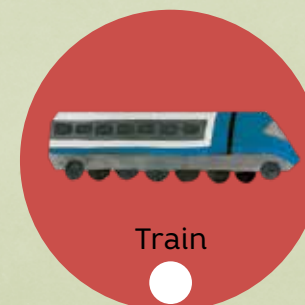
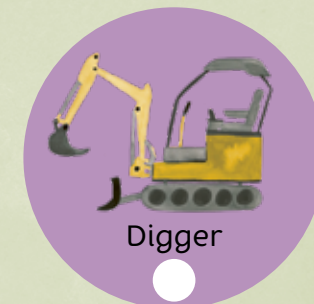
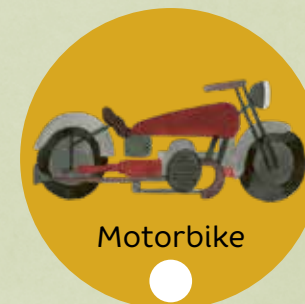

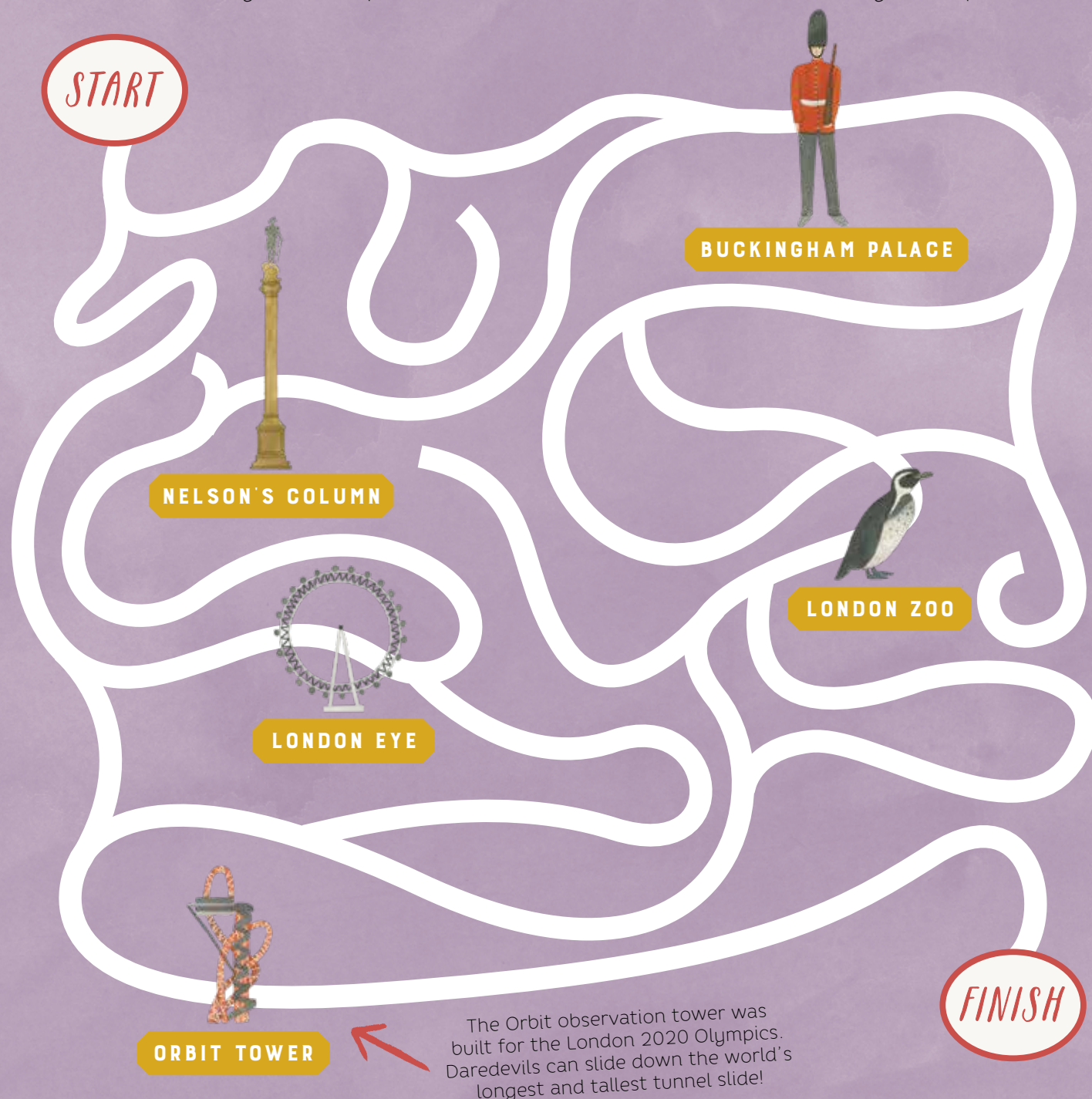


You can try this beach sport in Brighton, on the south coast of the UK.
