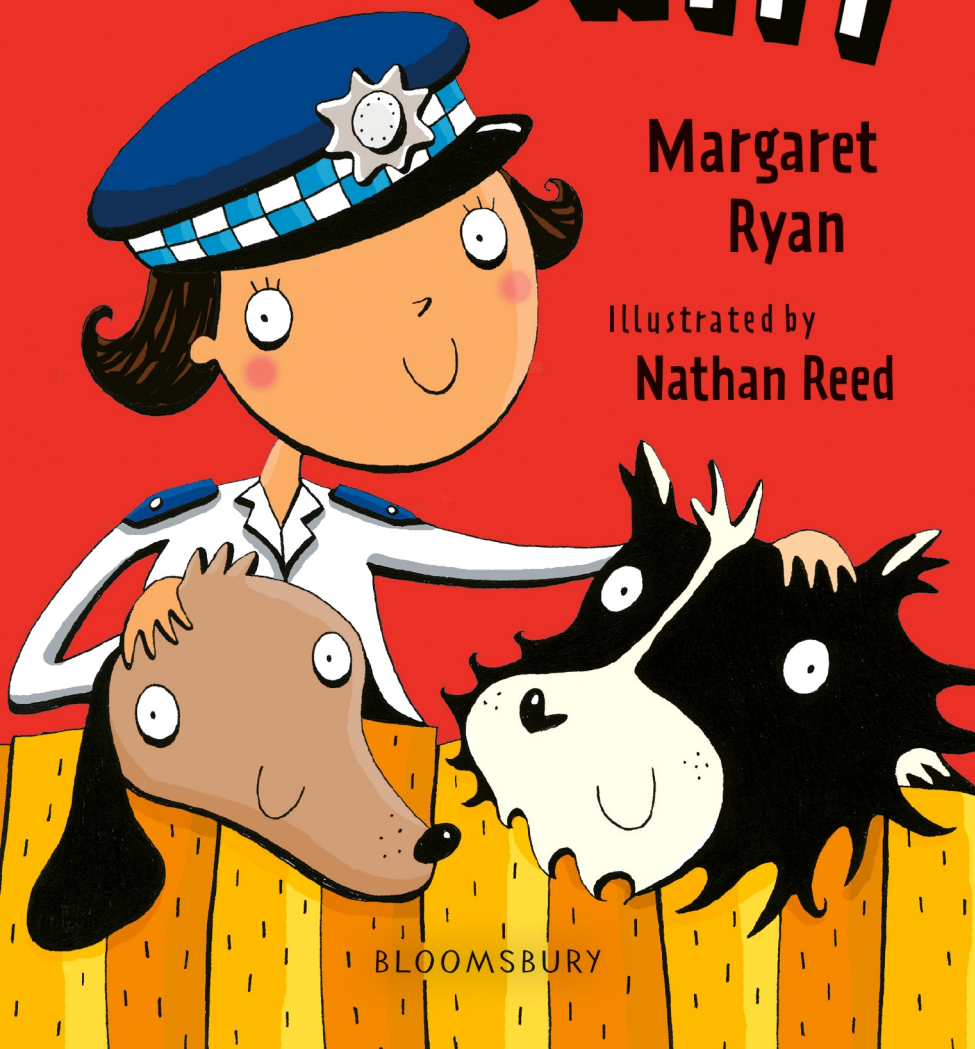

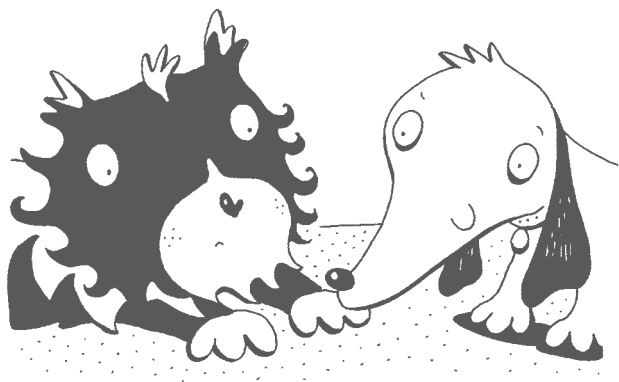

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Chapter One

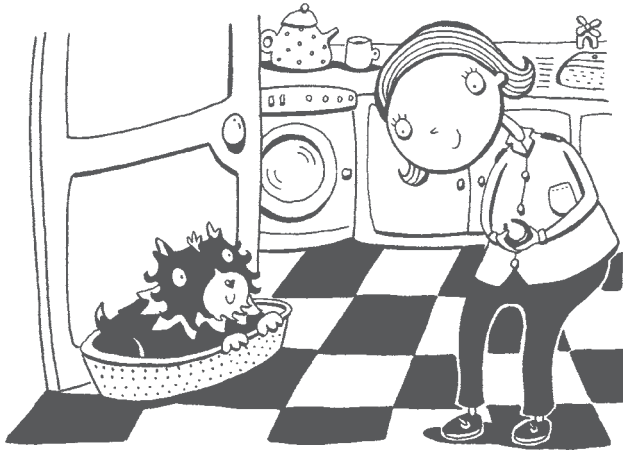
For Tabitha with love

Scratch scratched, then wandered over to the kitchen door and barked.

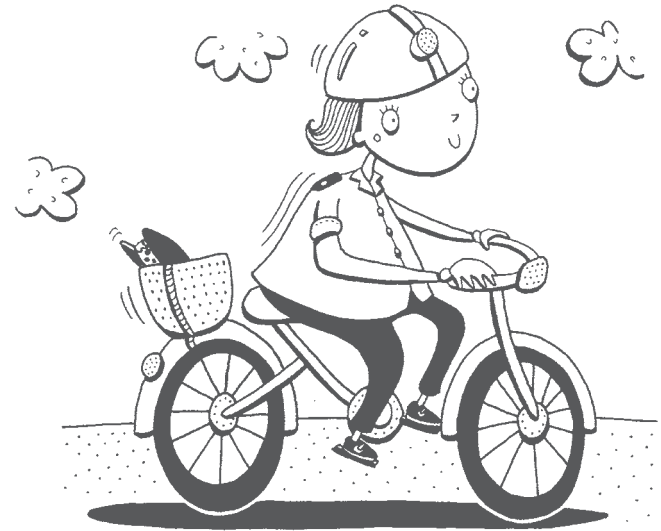
“Well done, Scratch,” said Penny.

the police station.

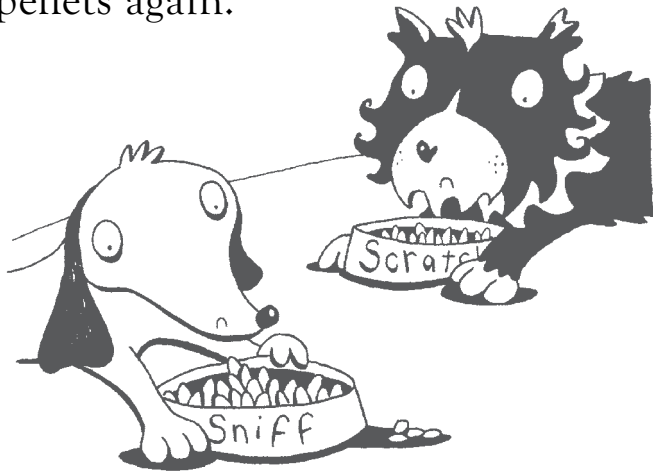


Scratch yawned and scratched.
