What makes you ... You?

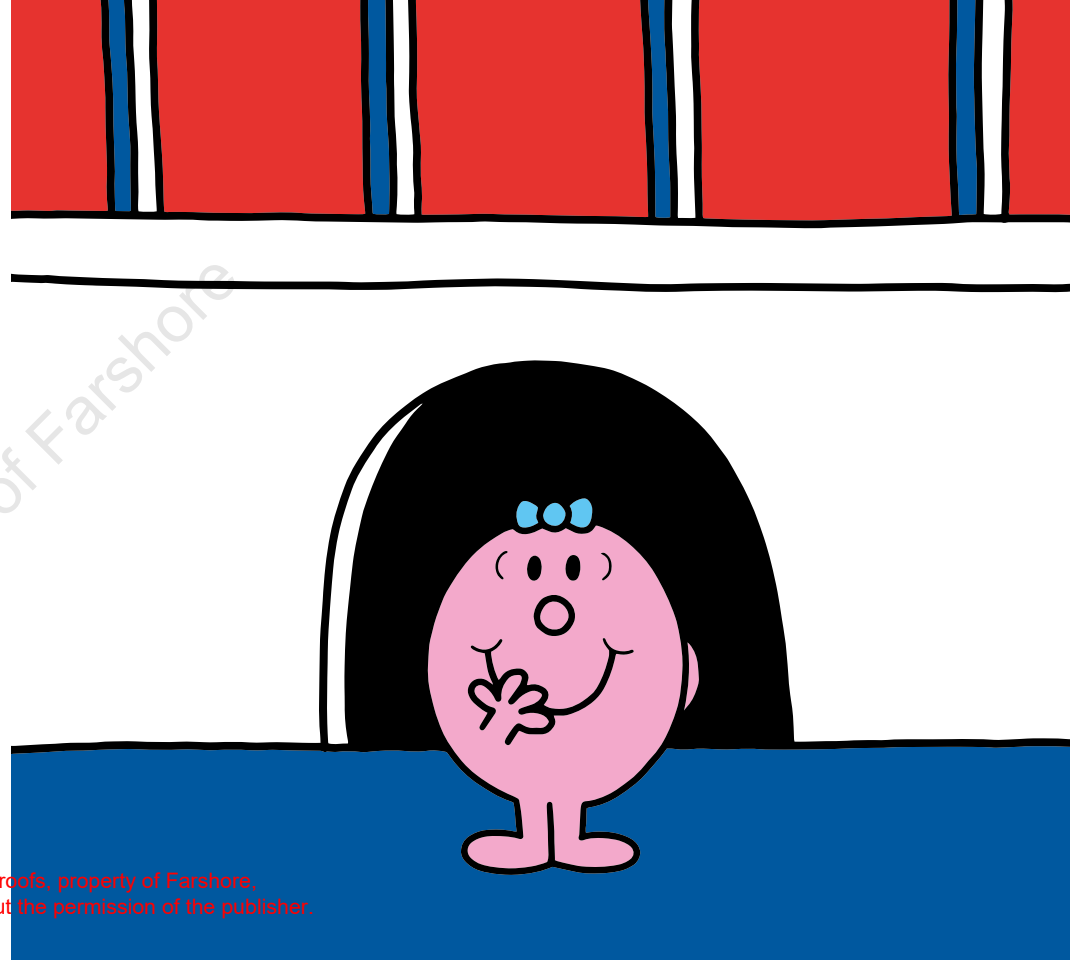
Meet Little Miss Tiny.

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Did you know that she has a friend called Mr Tall?

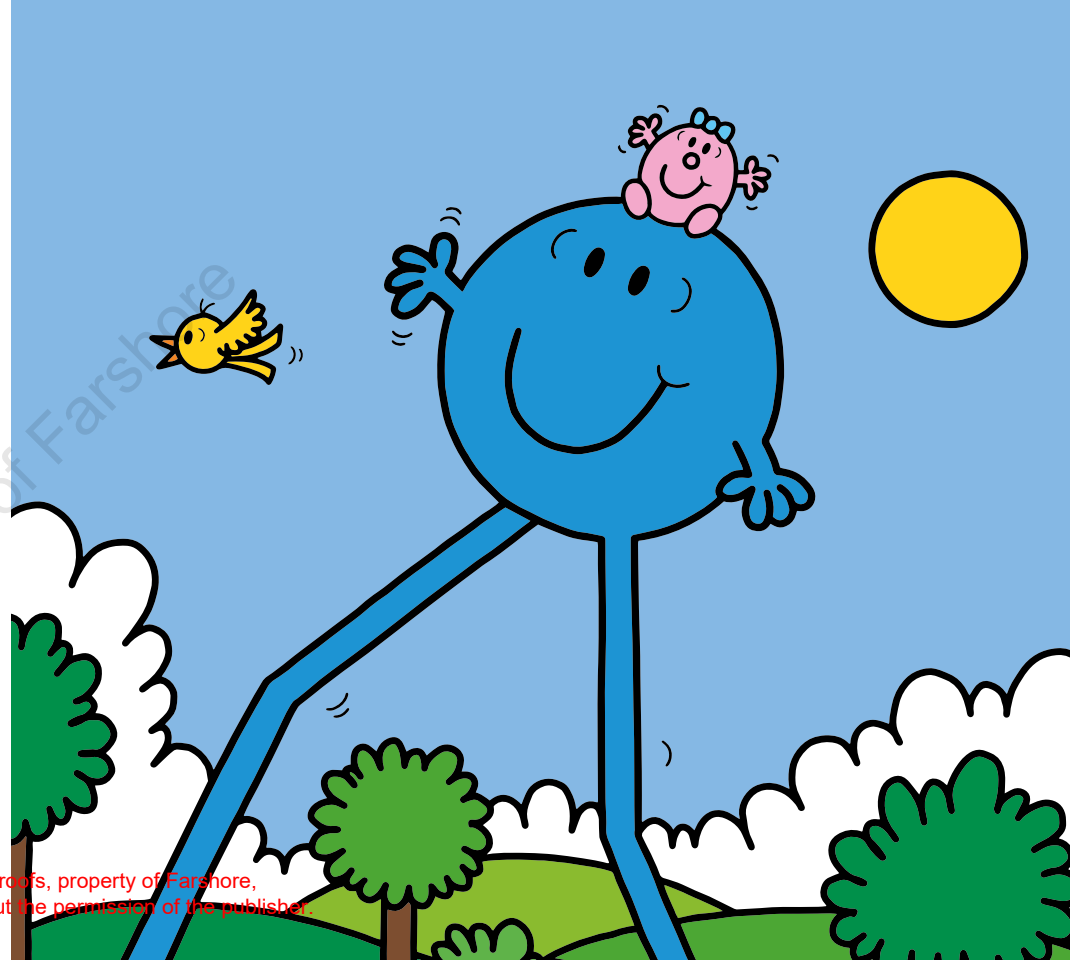
Mr Tall is quite possibly the tallest person in the world.

Though that's another story!

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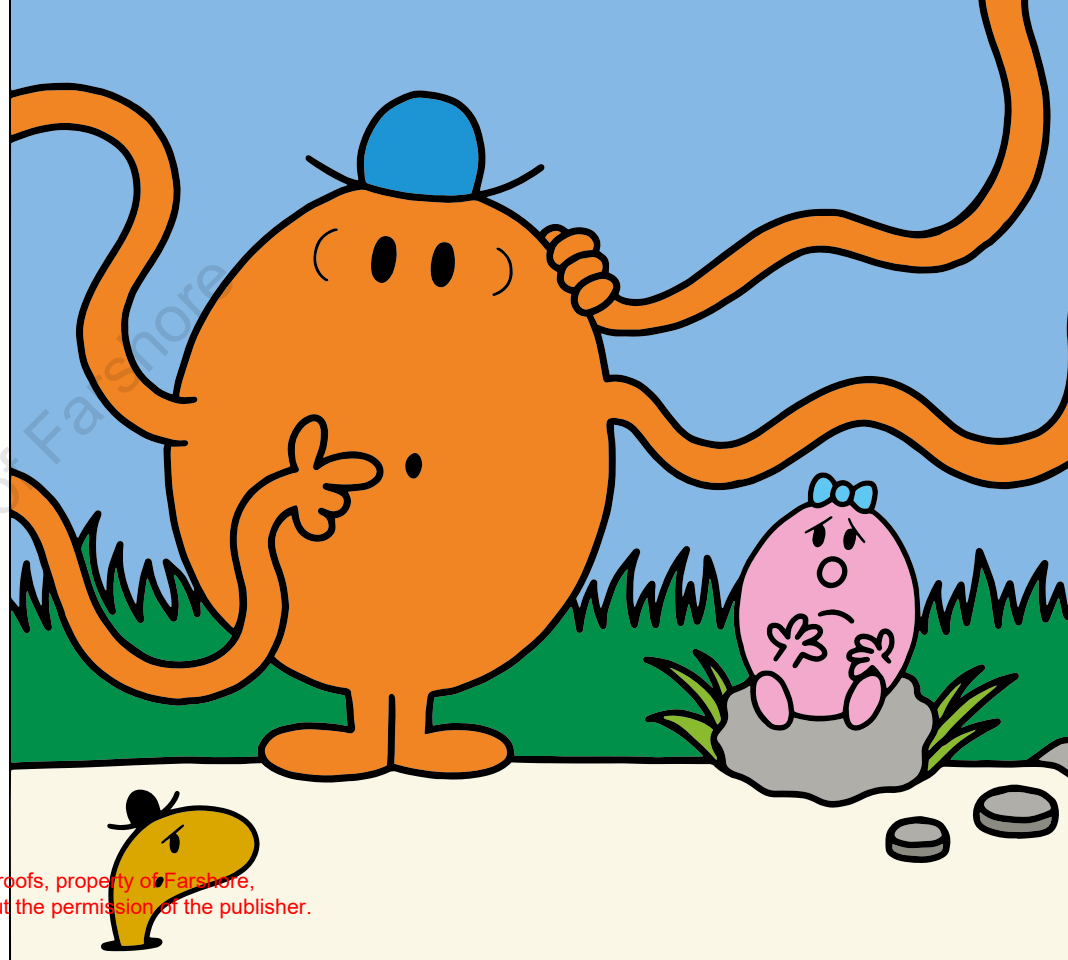
One of the friends who helped him was Mr Tickle, who has extraordinarily long arms.
