
**1st  
resolution**res-əl-yü-shən  
NOUN

A resolution is a promise you make to yourself to do something, often at the start of a new year.

**3rd  
ditto**di-to  
NOUN

You can use the word ditto to agree with something that has just been said, or to avoid repeating it.

Ditto comes from the Italian word 'detto', which means 'said before'.

**2nd  
tectonic**tek-tō-nik  
ADJECTIVE

Tectonic is a word that you use when you are talking about the structure of the Earth's crust.

**4th  
emboss**em-boss  
VERB

If you emboss a surface such as paper or wood with a design, you make the design stand up slightly from the surface.

**5th  
masquerade**mask-ə-rād  
NOUN

A masquerade is an event, such as a party or dance, where people dress up in disguise and wear masks.

**6th  
auditorium**ə-doo-tor-ē-əm  
NOUN

The auditorium is the part of a theatre or concert hall where the audience sits.

**7th  
nostalgia**no-stal-jē-ə  
NOUN

Nostalgia is an affectionate feeling you have for the past, especially for a particularly happy time.

**8th  
octave**ok-tāv  
NOUN

An octave is a series of eight notes in music.

Octave comes from the Latin word 'octo', which means 'eight'.

**9th  
unfathomable**  
un-fath-uh-muh-buh  
ADJECTIVE

If you say that something is unfathomable, you mean that it cannot be understood or explained, usually because it is very strange or complicated.



**10th  
aurora**  
awr-uh-roh-uh  
NOUN

An aurora is a dazzling display of coloured light, usually green, red, purple or yellow, that sometimes moves across the sky at night.

**11th  
prevaricate**  
preh-vuh-rik-ayt  
VERB

If you prevaricate, you avoid giving a direct answer or making a firm decision.


**12th  
ibis**  
eye-buh  
NOUN

An ibis is a long-legged wading bird with a long, thin bill, typically found in warm parts of the world.

► This comes from a word in the ancient Egyptian language. The Egyptians thought the ibis was a sacred bird.

**13th  
bashfully**  
bahsh-fuh-les-uh  
ADVERB

If you say something bashfully, you say it shyly.



**15th  
algorithm**  
al-gor-i-th-uhm  
NOUN

An algorithm is a set of mathematical instructions that help to solve a particular problem, especially on a computer.

**14th  
kaleidoscopic**  
kal-eye-dis-koh-pik  
ADJECTIVE

If you describe something as kaleidoscopic, you mean that it is made up of a lot of different colours, patterns or shapes.

**16th  
dazzling**  
dzah-ling  
ADJECTIVE

A dazzling light is so bright that you cannot see for a short time after looking at it.

17th  
**evergreen**

ev-uh-green  
NOUN

An evergreen is a plant that does not lose its leaves in the winter.

18th  
**segregation**

se-gre-gay-shun  
NOUN

Segregation is when people are officially separated, especially based on their race or religion, so they cannot live, work or study together.

19th  
**wheepie**

weep-uh  
VERB

If a bird wheepies, it makes a long, shrill cry.


20th  
**galumphing**

gal-umfing  
ADJECTIVE

Someone or something that is galumphing is clumsy.

- Galumph was invented by the nineteenth-century English writer Lewis Carroll.

**limelight**

lim-e-lit  
NOUN

If someone is in the limelight, a lot of attention is being paid to them, because they are famous or because they have done something very unusual or exciting.

22nd  
**hangry**

hang-ree  
ADJECTIVE

If someone is hangry, they are grumpy because they are hungry.

You use this word in a humorous way.

- Hangry is a combination of the words 'hungry' and 'angry'.

23rd  
**zither**

zith-ur  
NOUN

A zither is a musical instrument made by stretching strings over a flat box. You pluck the strings with your fingers to make musical notes.

24th  
**saffron**

sa-fron  
NOUN

Saffron is a yellowish-orange spice used to colour and flavour food.

- Saffron comes from a word in the Arabic language.
