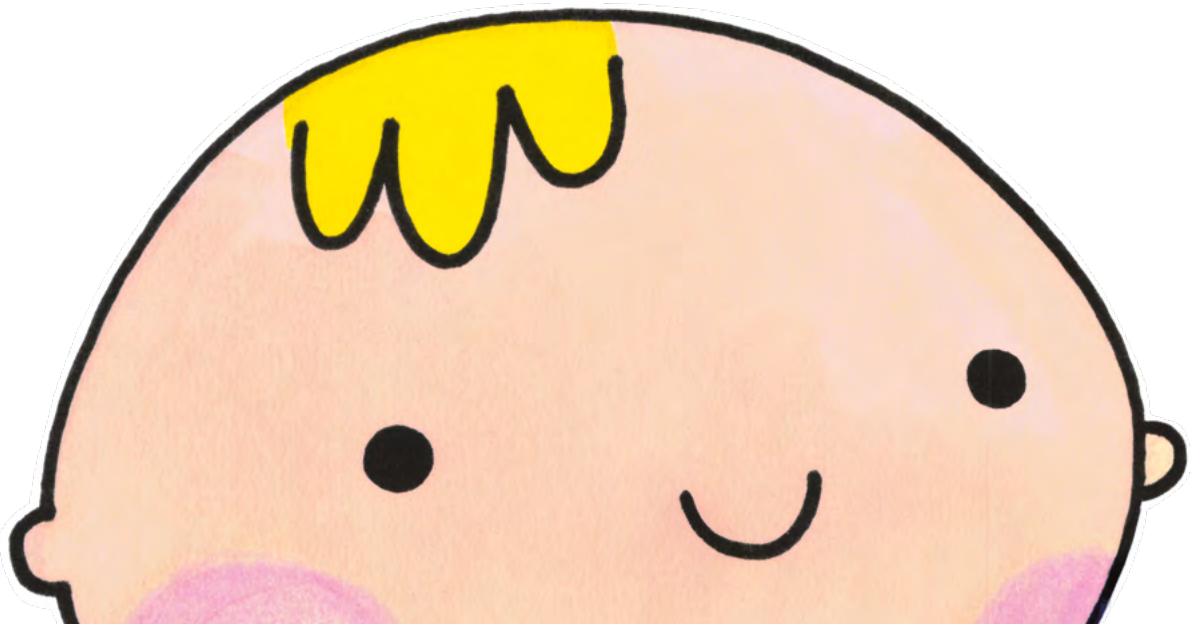

a picture.

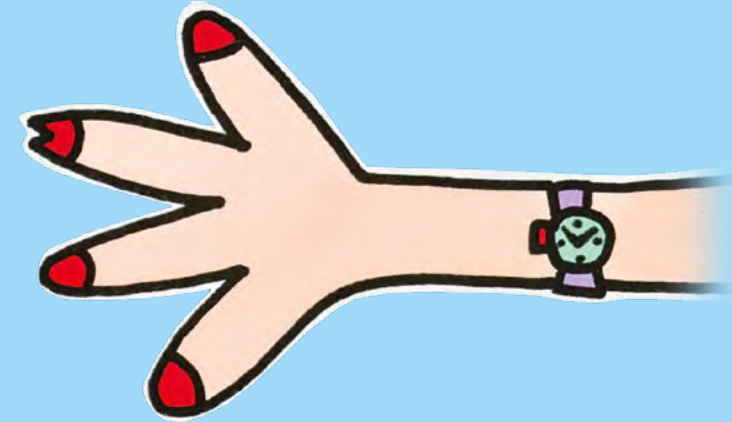


"Or do I?"

The next morning on their way to school, Alexander noticed that Mummy's nails were very green.



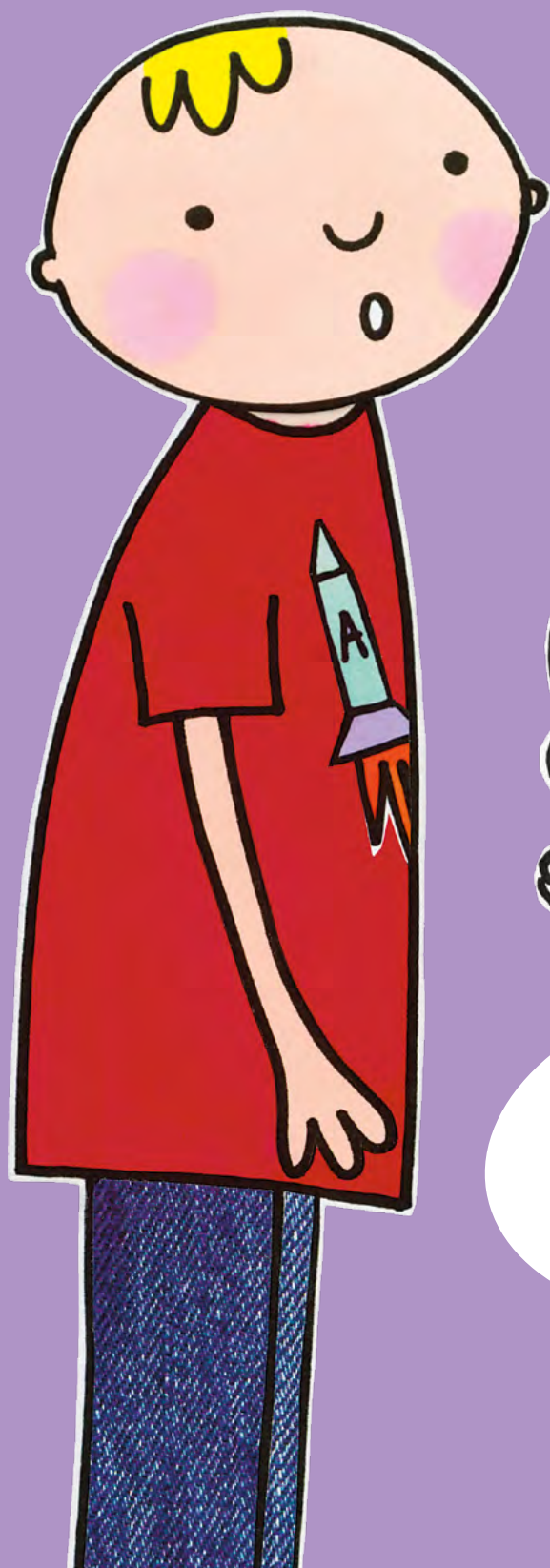
As Mummy really did not like chipped nailpolish,

"Mummy's nails might be green,

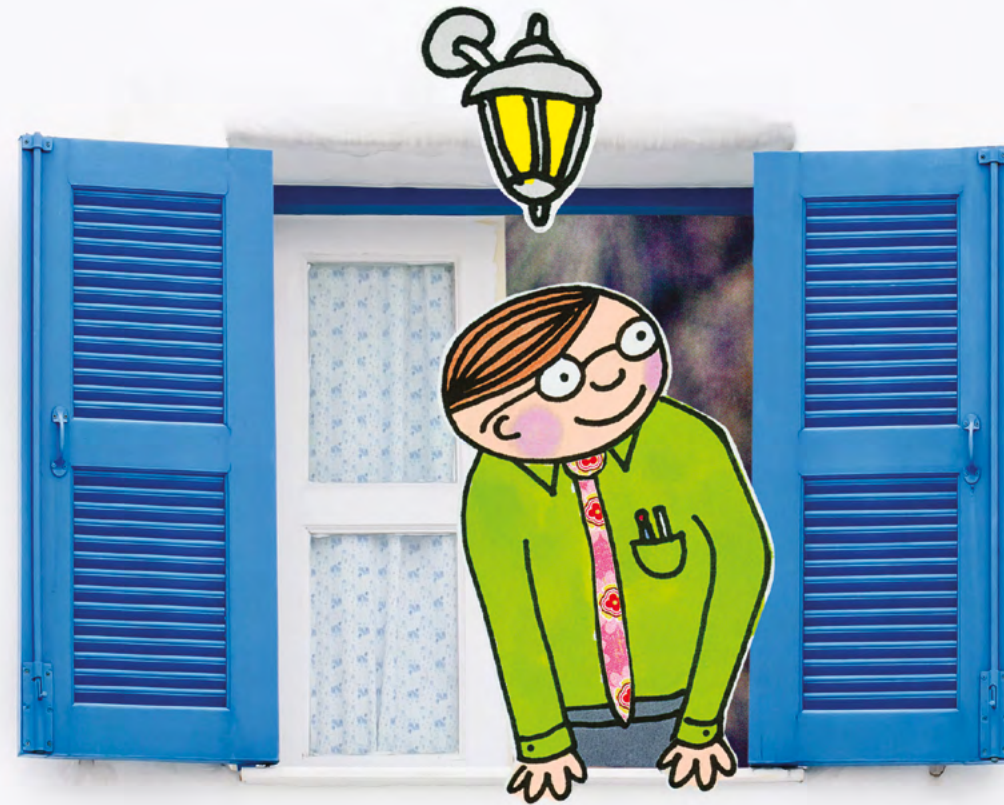


but Mummy
