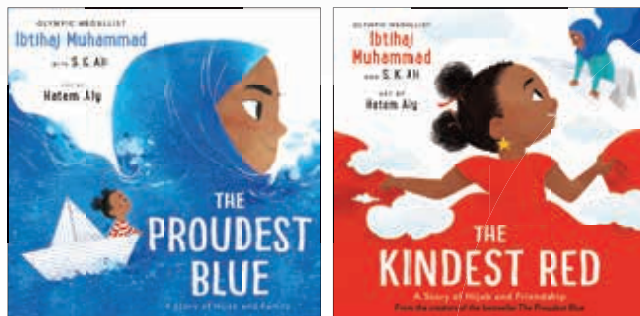

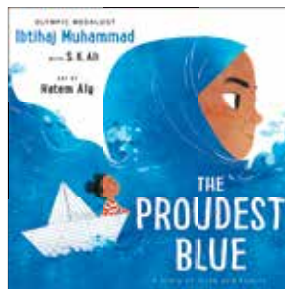

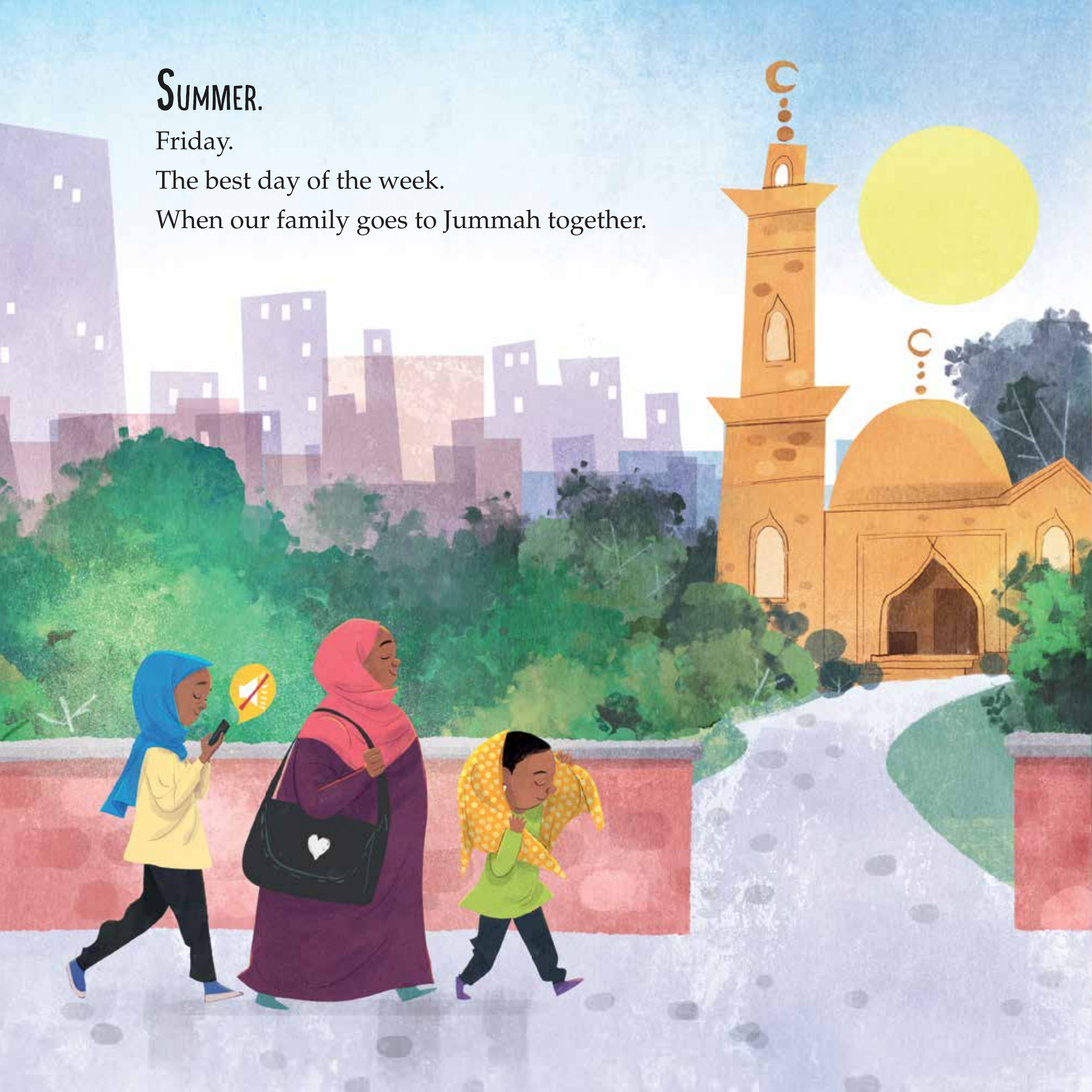
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SUMMER.

We sit in rows to listen and then stand to pray.

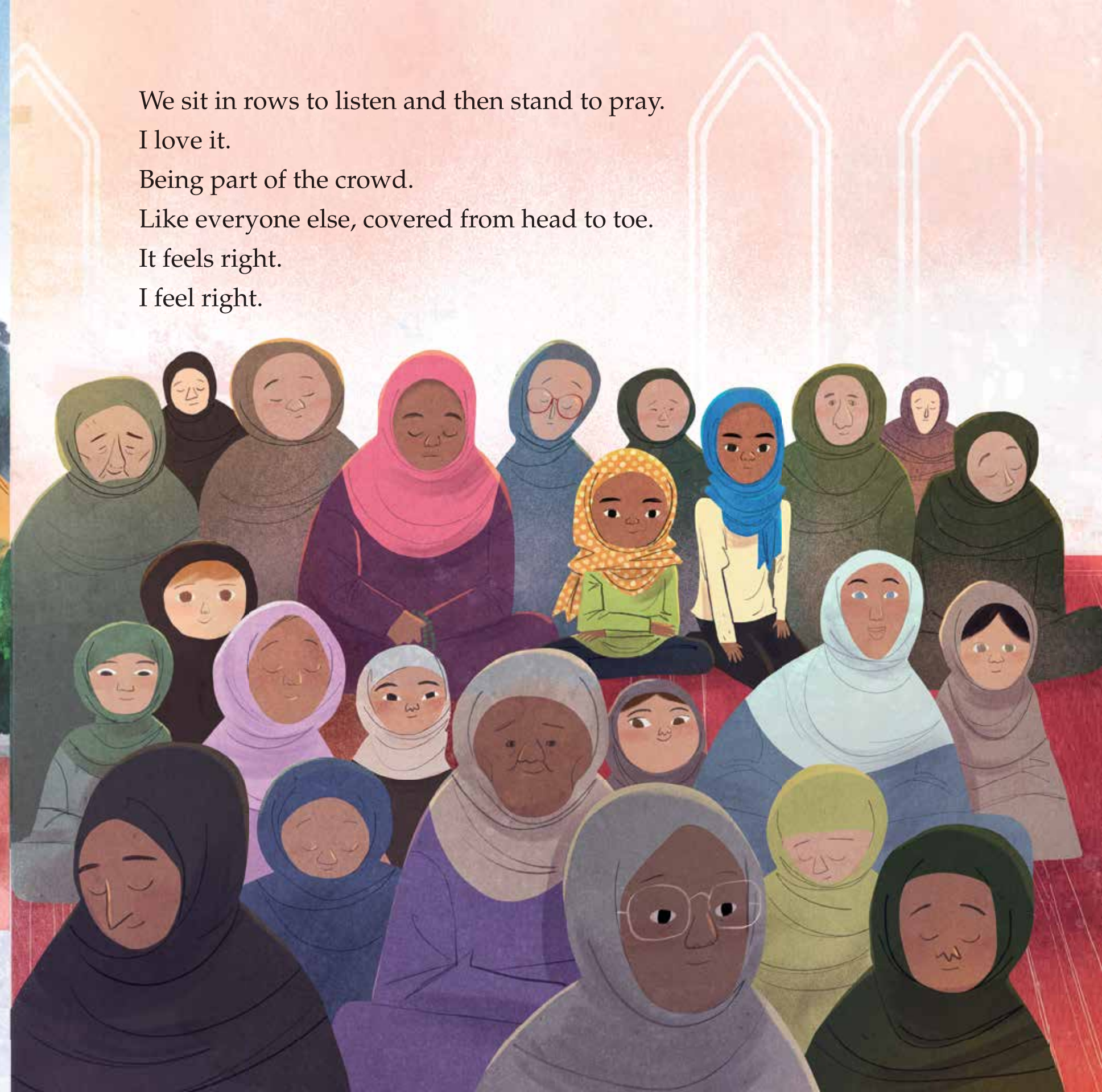
I love it.
