to happen.

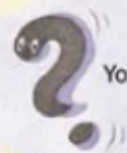


Get me out

Who are you?



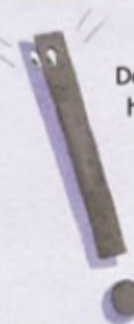
Ha ha! She doesn't know who we are!



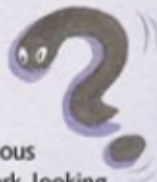
Let's introduce ourselves.
