Meet a cast of birds, dolphins, camels, crocodiles and more in this delightfully funny friendship story from the multi-award-winning author of *The Gruffalo*.

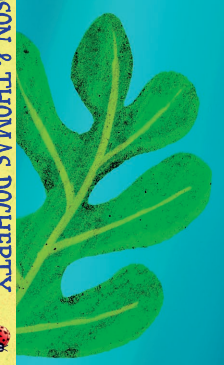

“I don’t believe you!” said Chack.

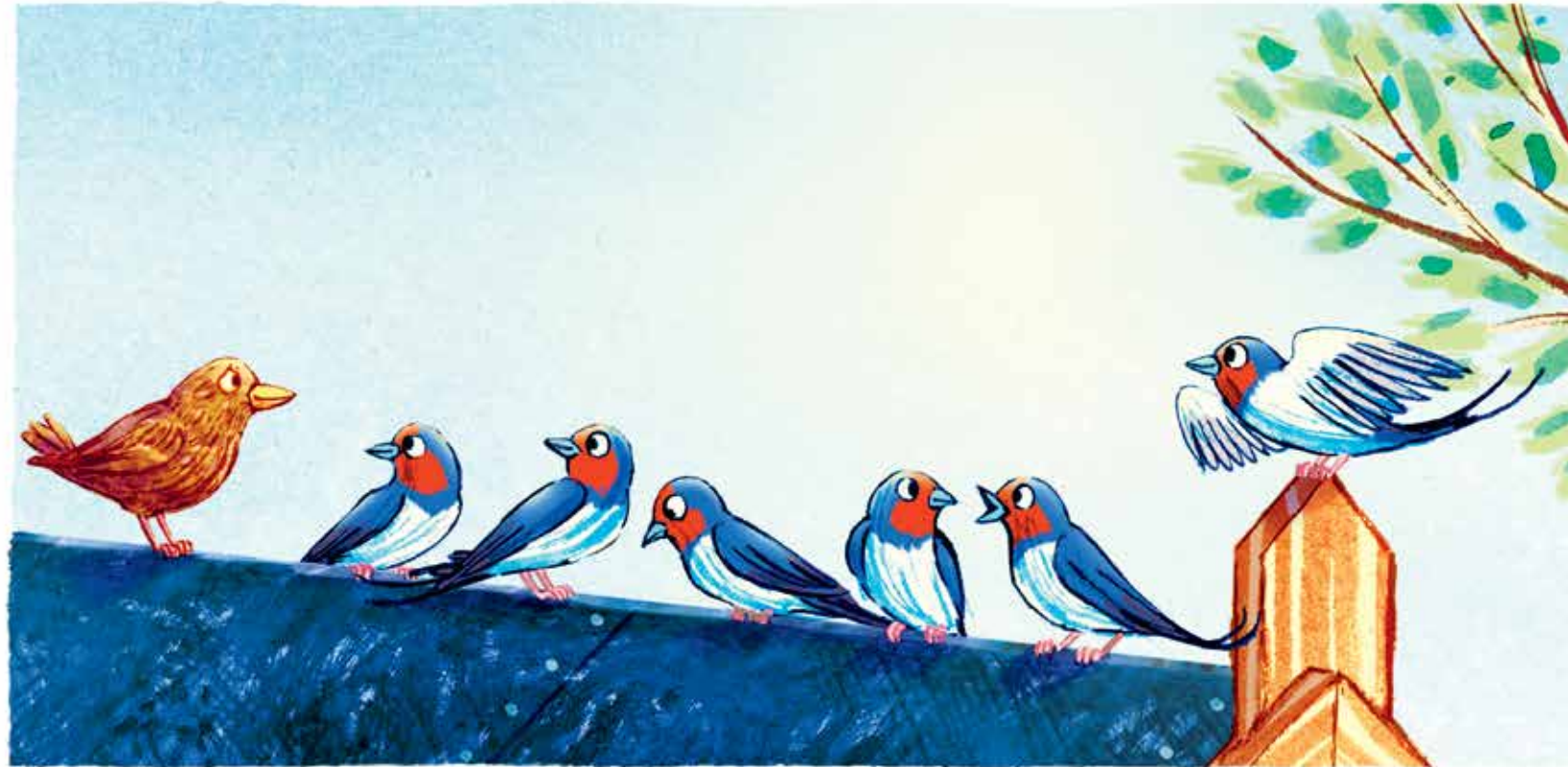
Chack showed Apollo his nest. It was in a tree covered in white blossom.
