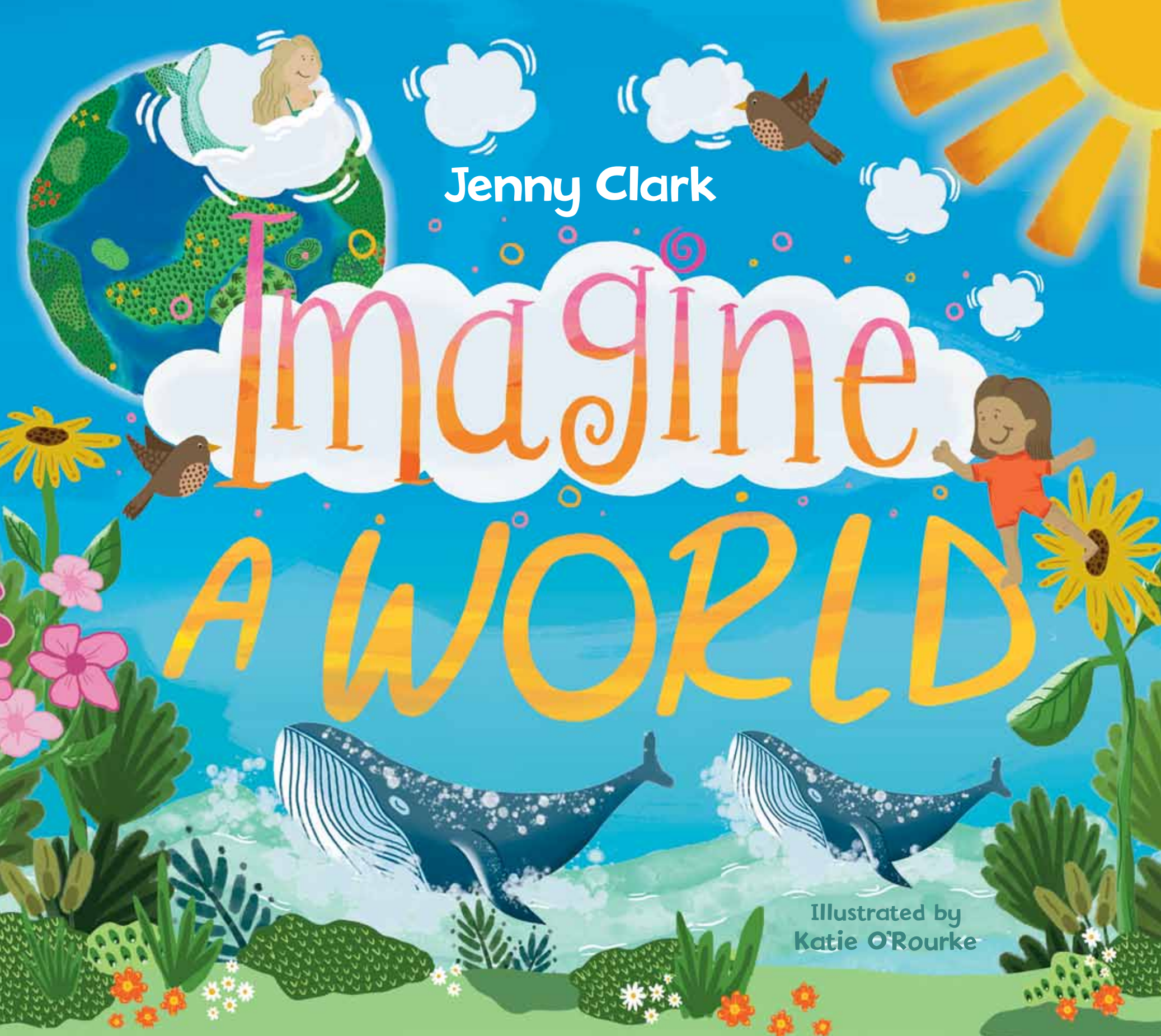
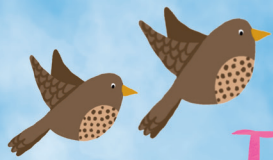

Become an expert cloud gazer

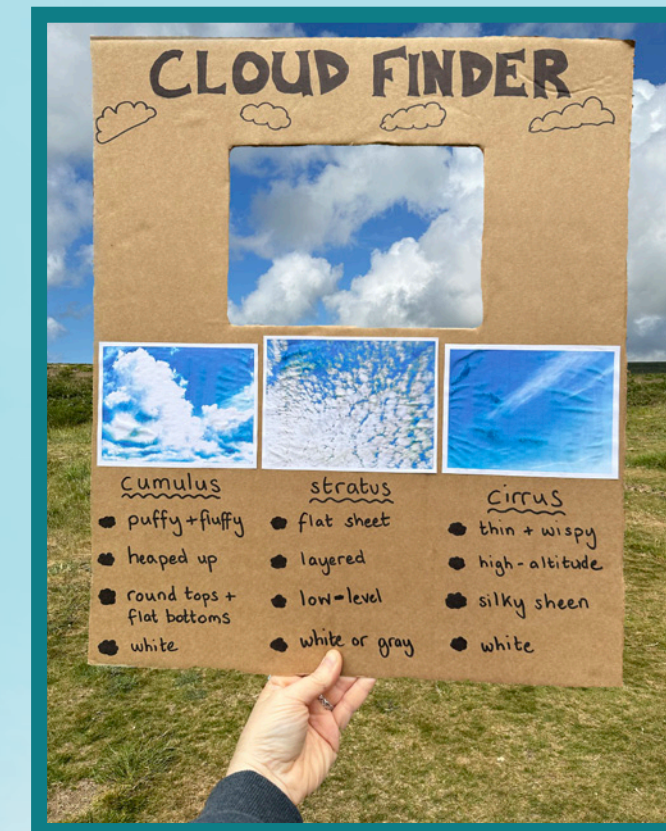
Did you know there are lots of different types of clouds?
