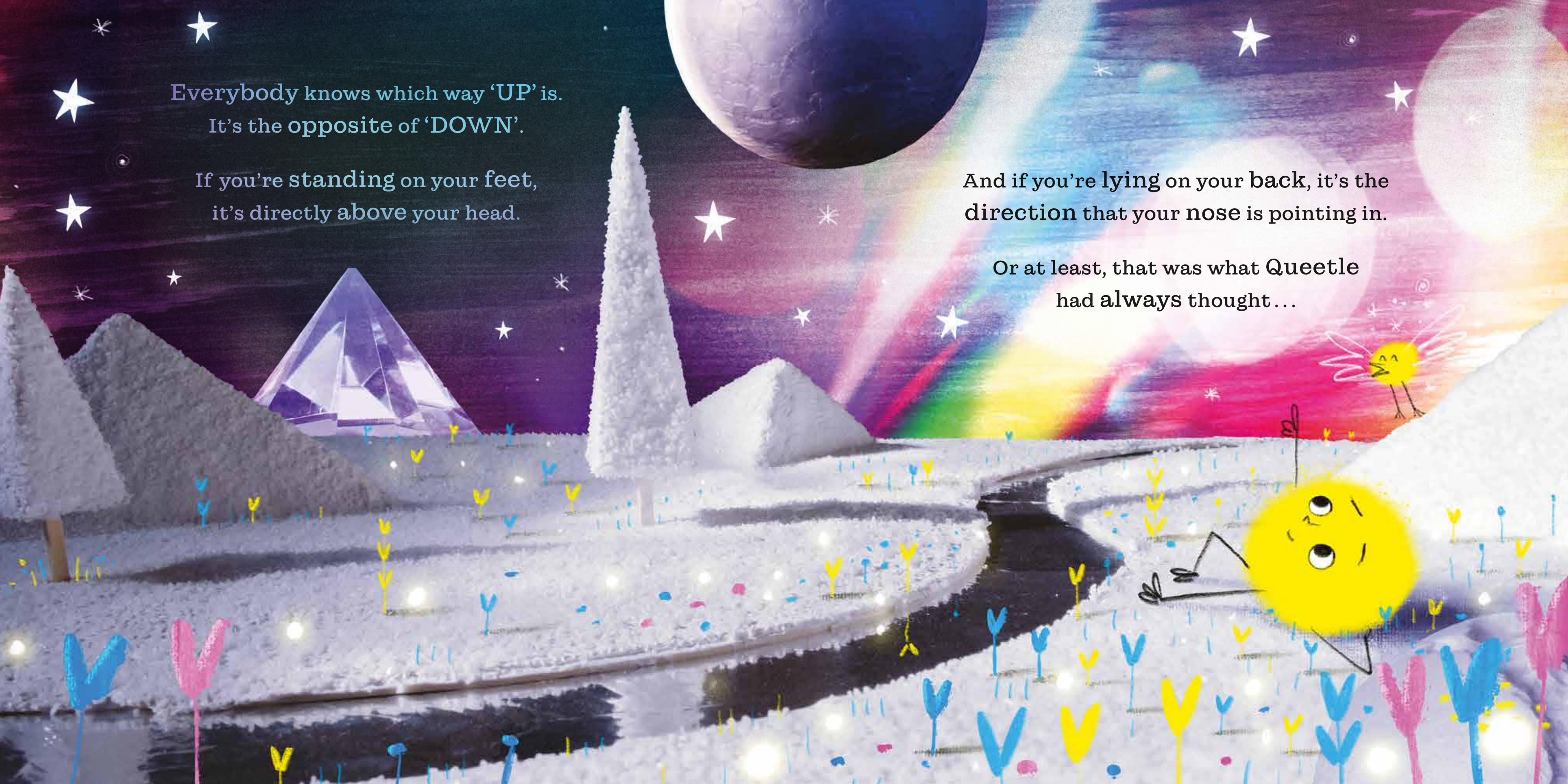
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Everybody knows which way 'UP' is.

direction that your nose is pointing in.

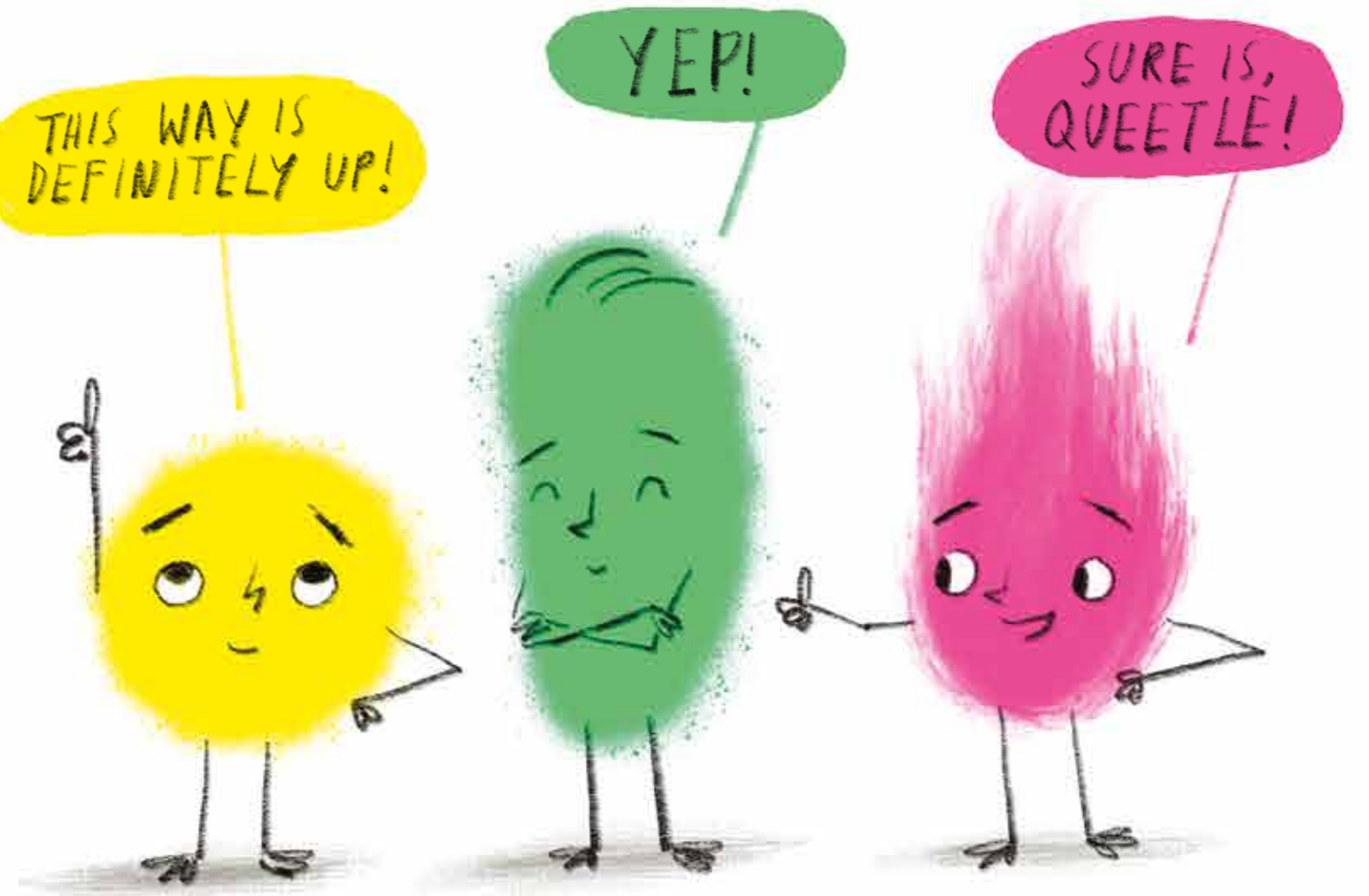
Or at least, that was what Queetle

ABSOLUTELY!

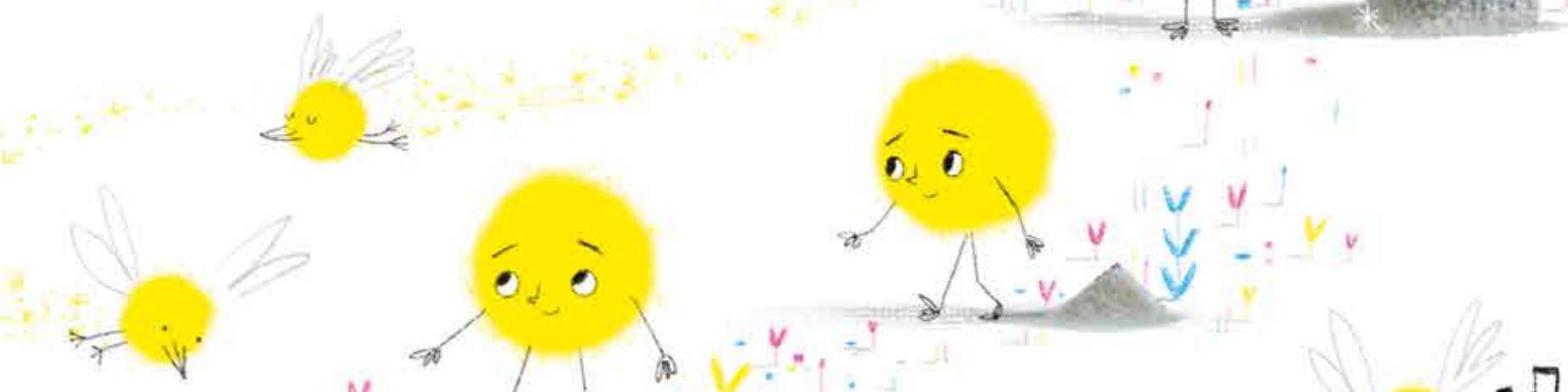
Luckily for Queetle, everyone he'd ever met agreed with him.



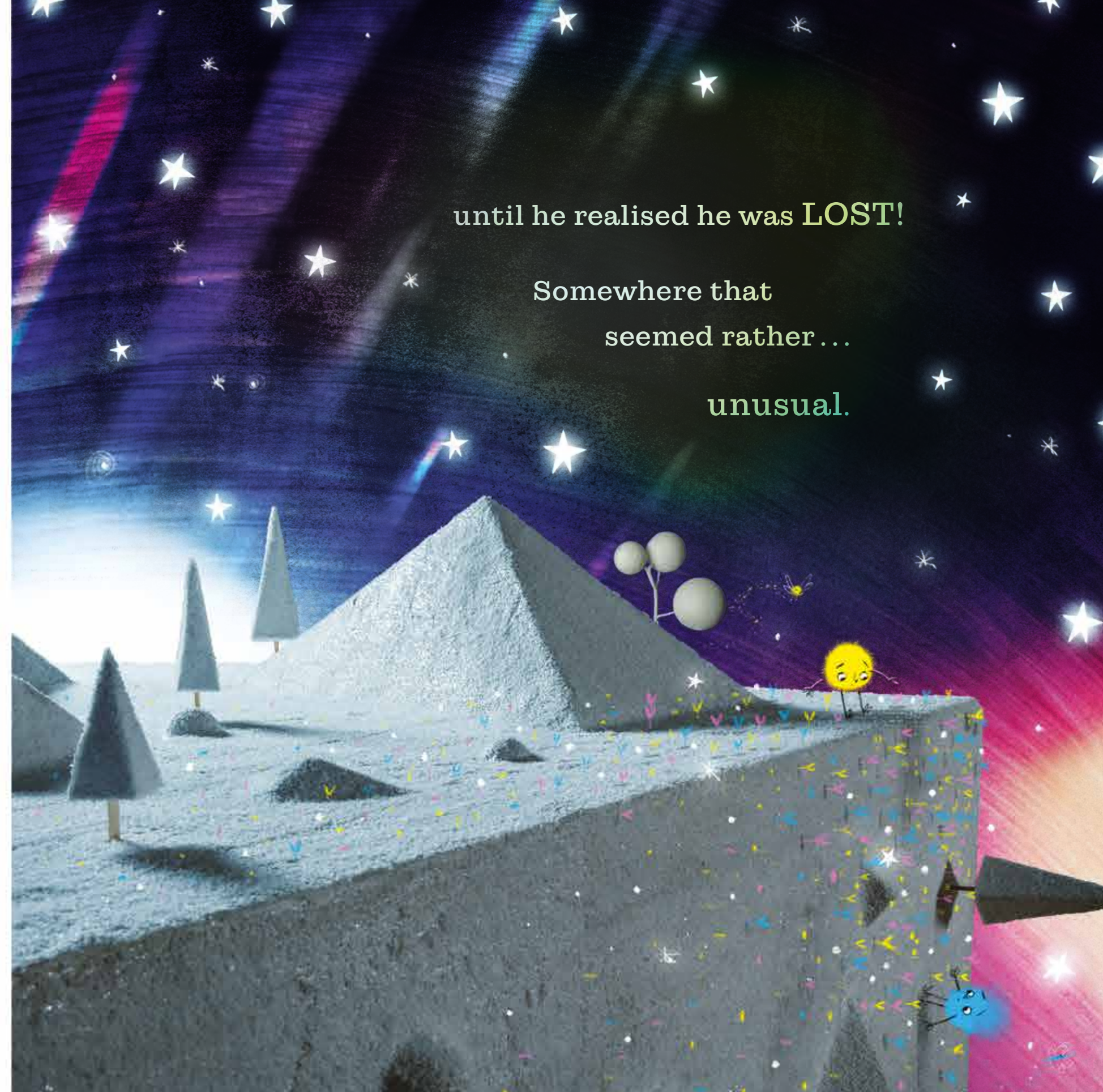
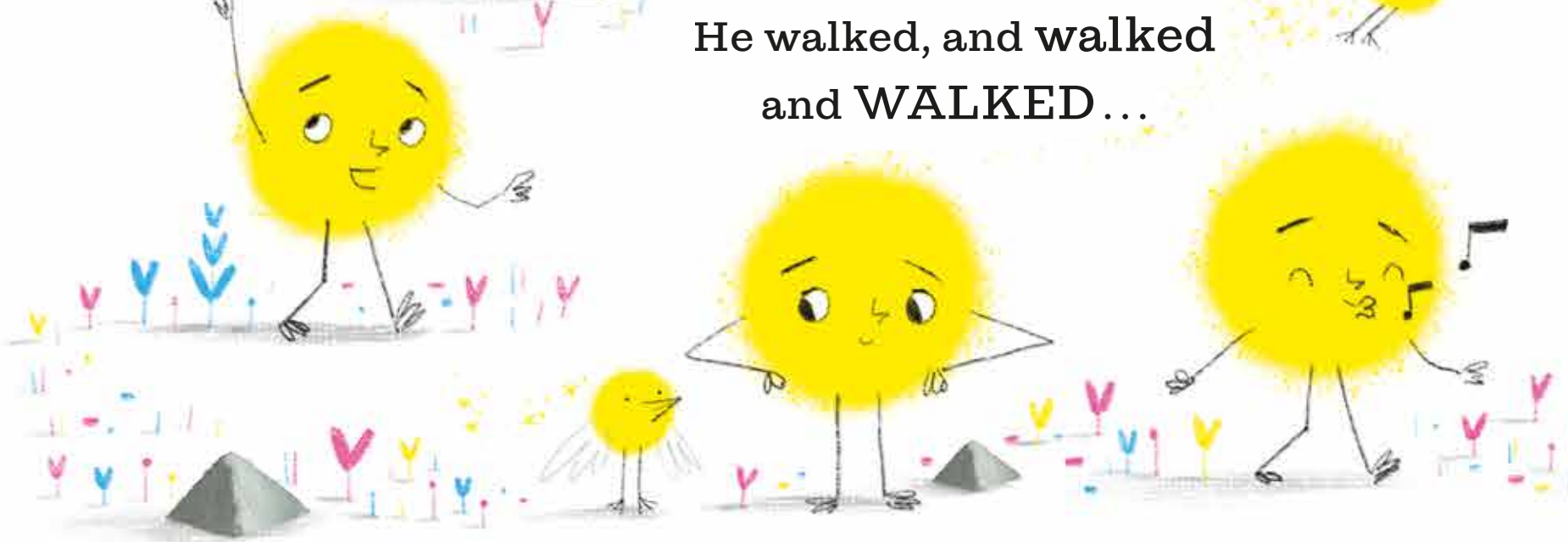
So basically, life was good.

for a BIG, long walk.



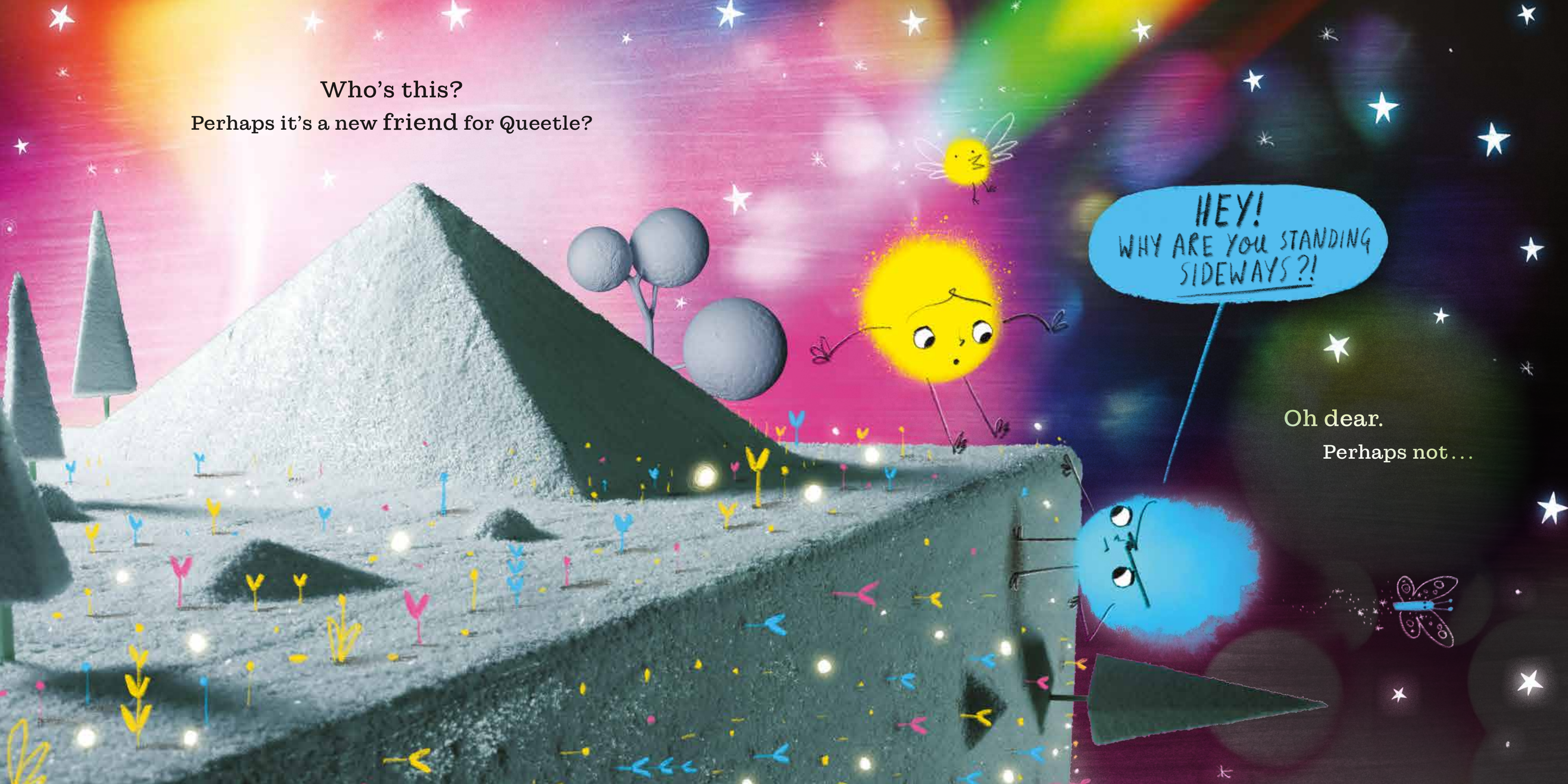
He walked, and walked
