Still looking for flember, they headed on to a bright, modern city called Prosperity.

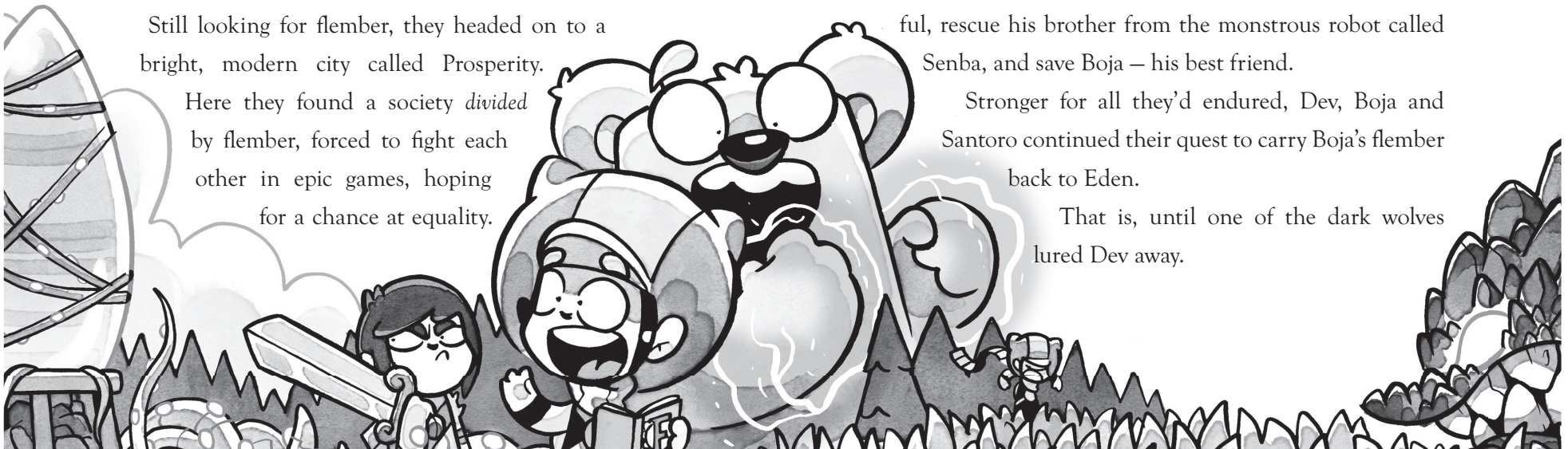
Here they found a society *divided* by flember, forced to fight each other in epic games, hoping for a chance at equality.

Bring the bear.

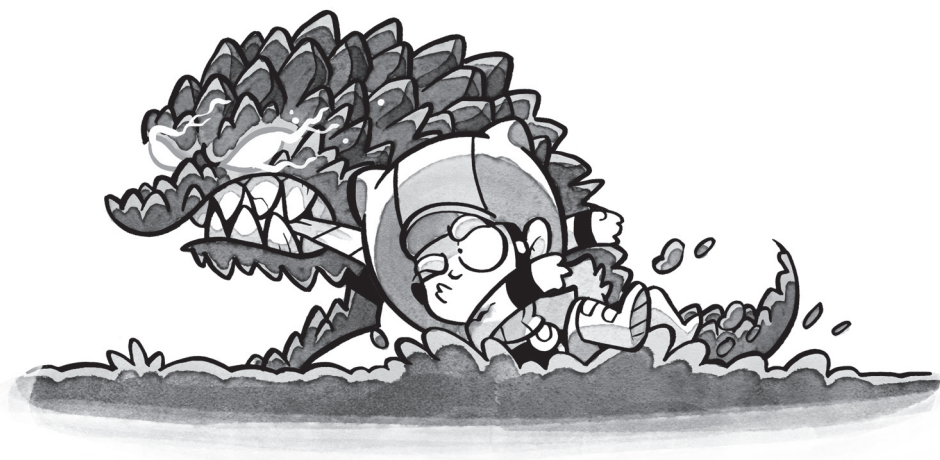
Bring the bear.
