Fujiko sat upright and scrambled out of bed to get a closer look. A sharp pain shot through her arm.

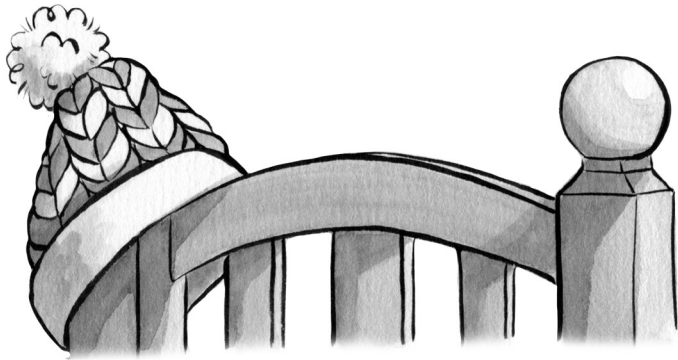

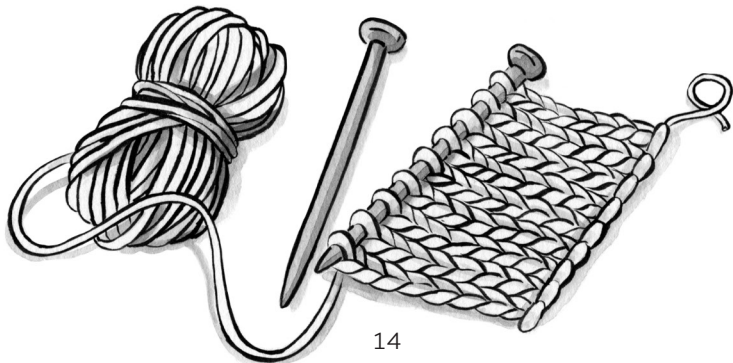

It's from Yuki! thought Fujiko.

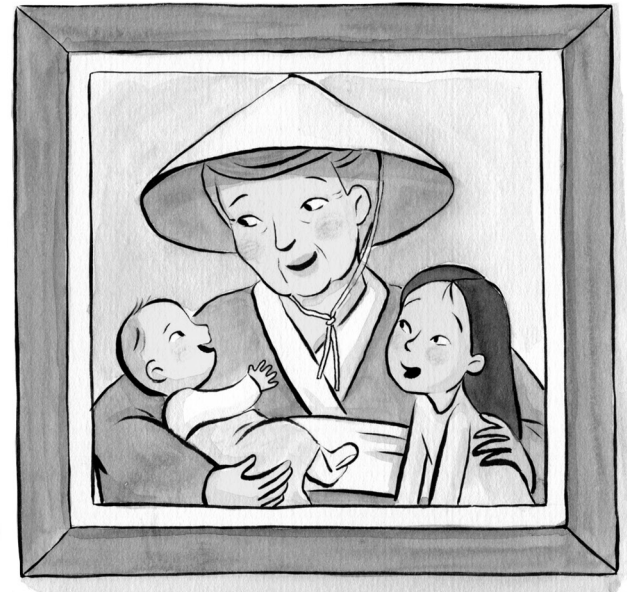

‘I hope I see the stoat again,’ said Yuki. ‘Imagine how incredible it would be to get a photo of it in the snow.’

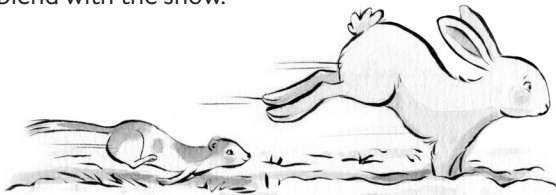


SUPER WOODLAND FACT:
