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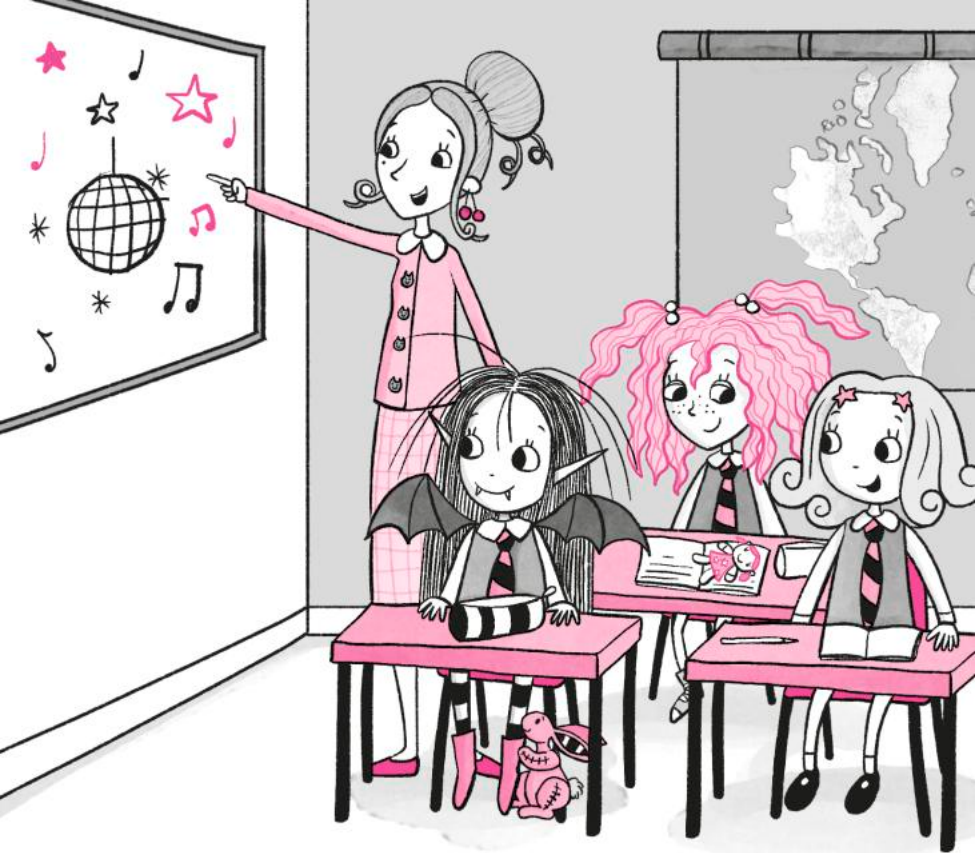
Chapter ONE

Miss Cherry, 'and see who can think of the best theme for our school disco. We'll make some decorations in art class next week based on that theme!'

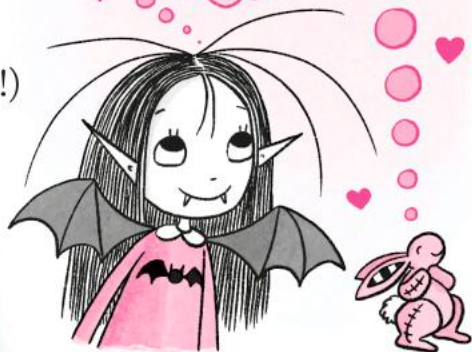
An excited chatter rippled round the room.
