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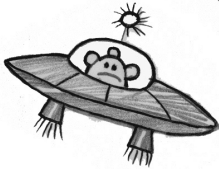
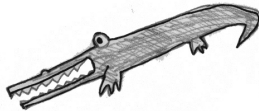
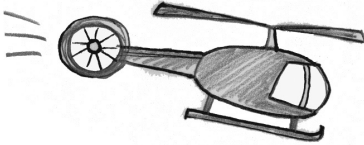
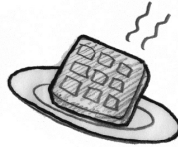
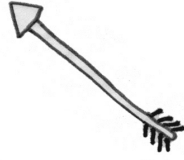
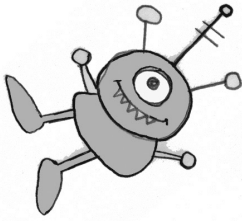
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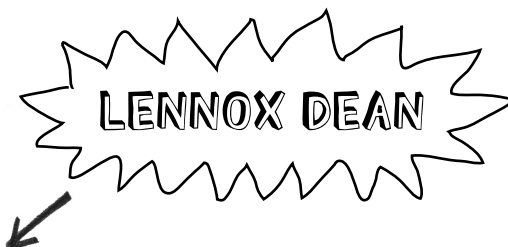
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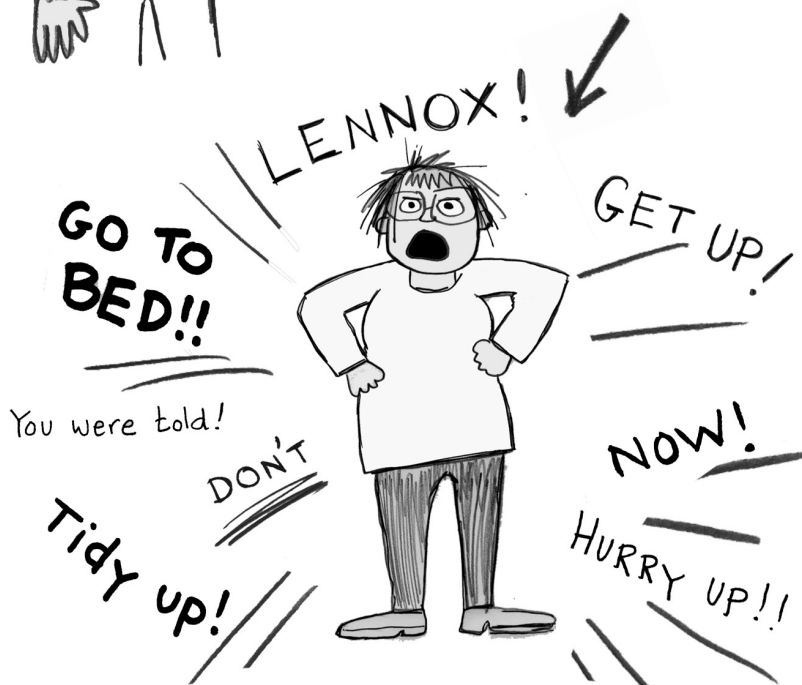




So this is me.



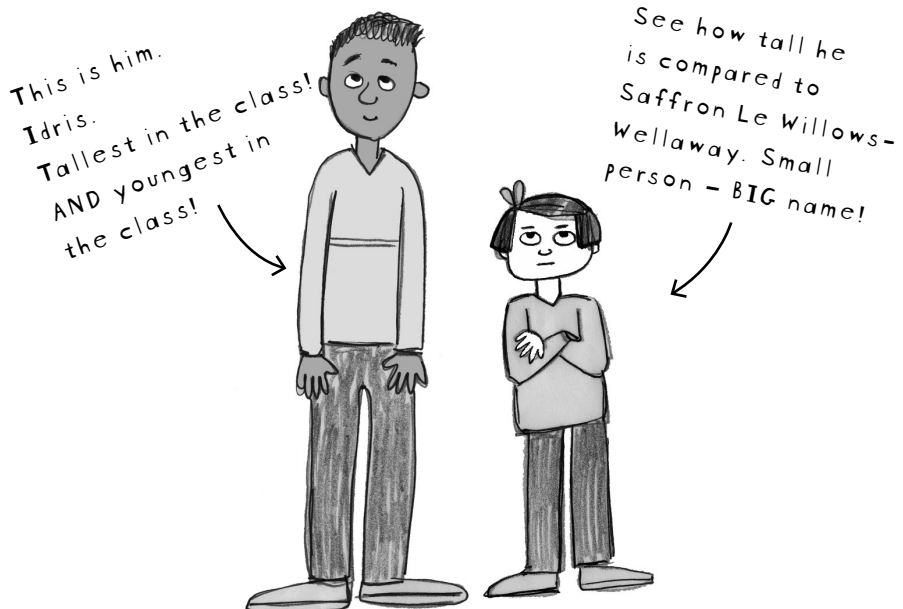
And I have this mum.

Idris is a bit more chill about it than me.

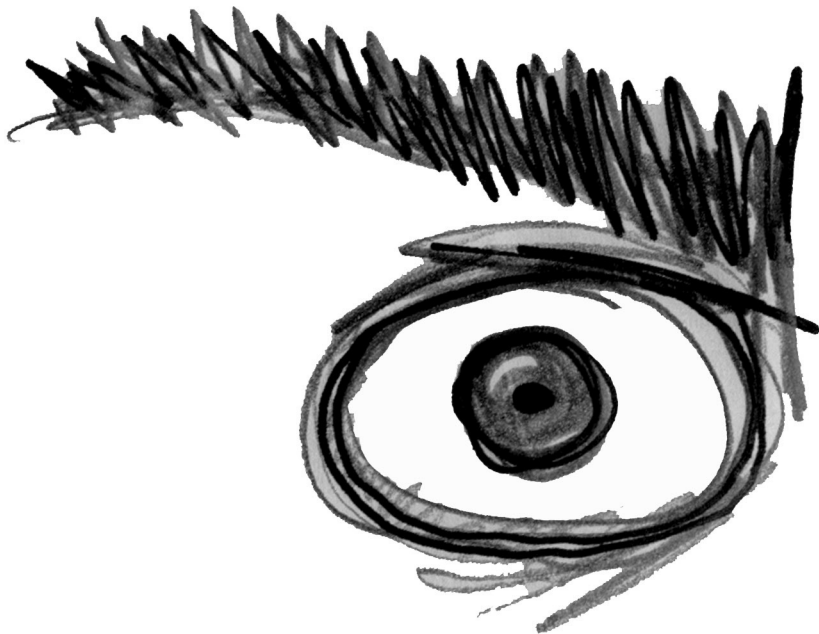
