A Field Guide To Dragons...



Chinese Dragon

Snakelike with long whiskers, this wingless wonder puffs out wind instead of fire. If you spot one high up in the clouds, you're in for good luck!

European Lindworm



Japanese Dragon

This wild, wingless beast loves rainfall and water. Snake-like with clawed feet and three toes, you can often find it near temples or slumbering on a cloud.



Cockatrice



This beast has the head and wings of a rooster and the body of a snake. Don't get too close to its shiny golden eggs or its poisonous breath will knock you out.

Druk



The wise Druk is known as the Thunder Dragon. Often seen carrying a lightning-bolt, its long, thin body helps it fly to high, windy altitudes, where it lays its eggs in the snow.

Knucker Dragon

This water dweller skulks in murky bottomless ponds called Knucker Holes. Beware of its cold snake-like eyes and dangerous hissing mouth.



Western Dragon



This fearsome, flying, fire-breathing dragon is a well-known hoarder of treasure. Owing to its speed of flight and shiny scales, it's often mistaken for a comet.

The Feathered Quetzalcoatl



This sacred beauty is a brightly-coloured bird and a powerful snake. It has long been a protector of humans. Known as a divine bringer of knowledge it can see into the future.

Hong Rainbow Dragon

This two-headed dragon is rumoured to appear in the sky to signify hope after a storm.

Wyvern
