Casts Her First Spell



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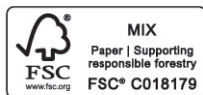
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Scaring is NOT Caring!

Boo loved weekends.

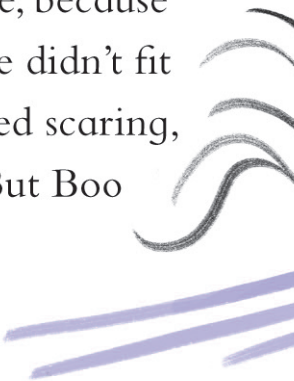

Shriek, had won the

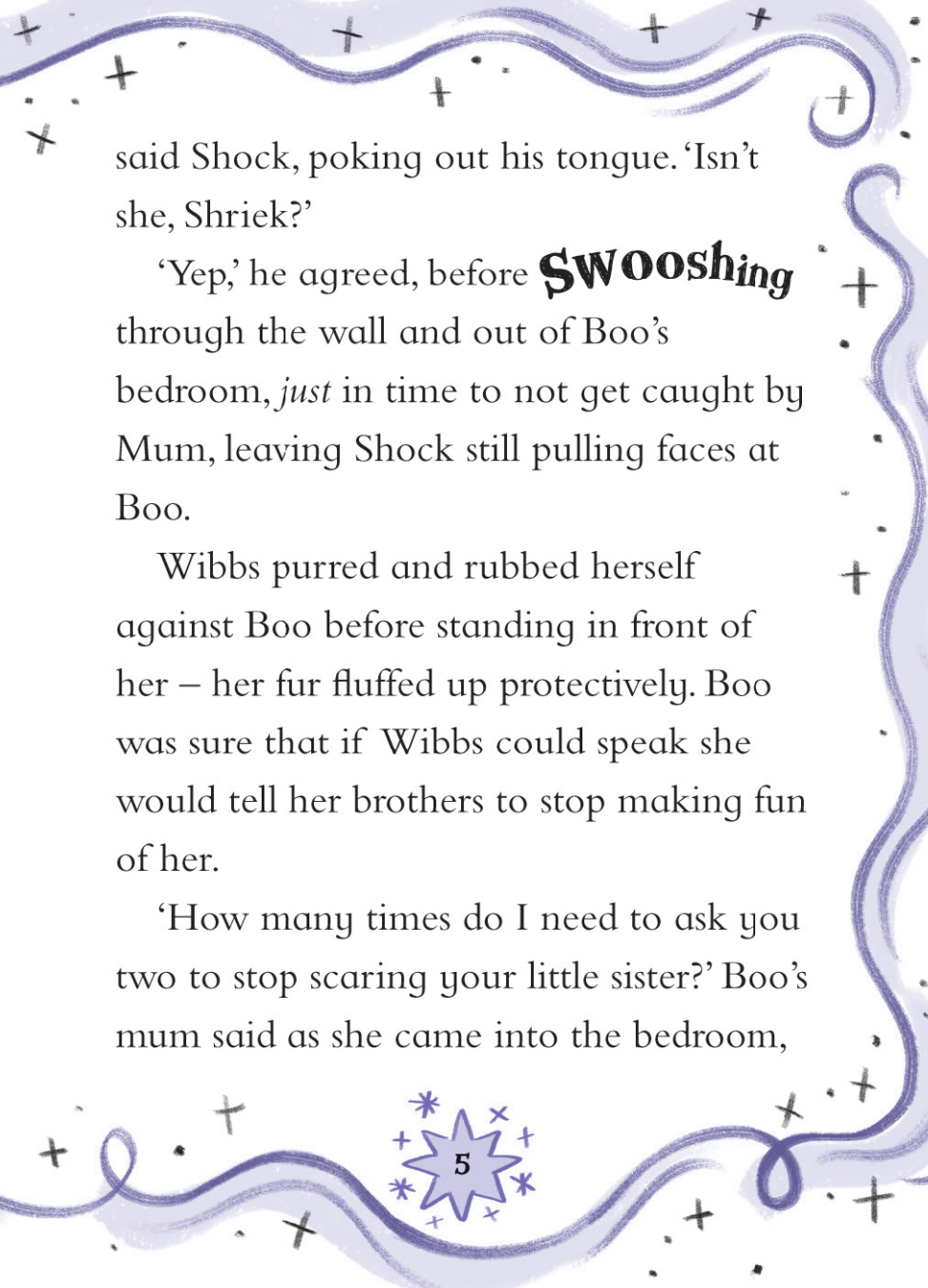
