Higher he rose, floating among the rafters, until he thought he might **BURST** through the roof, but then . . .

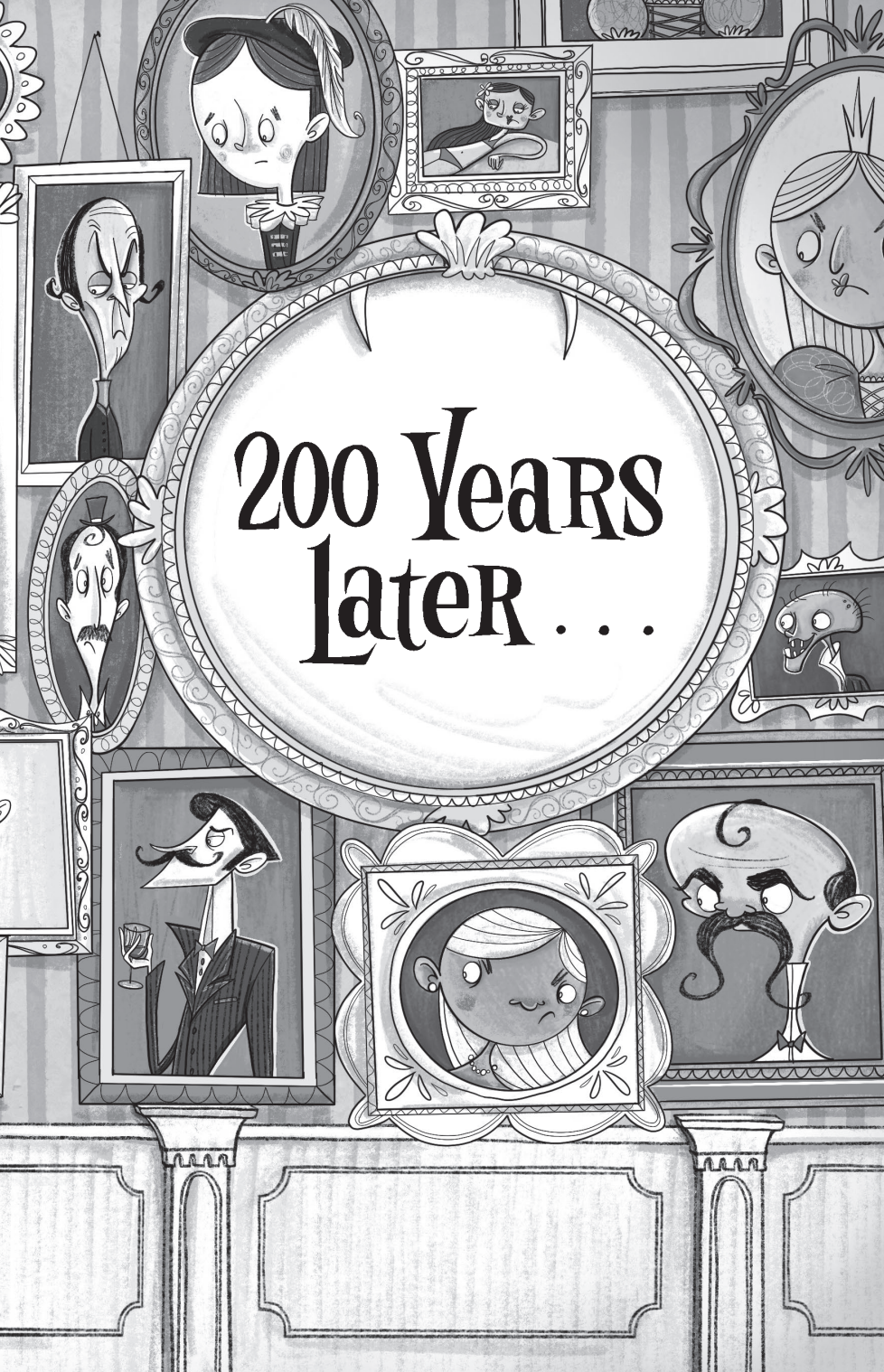
Paaaaaaaarp!
