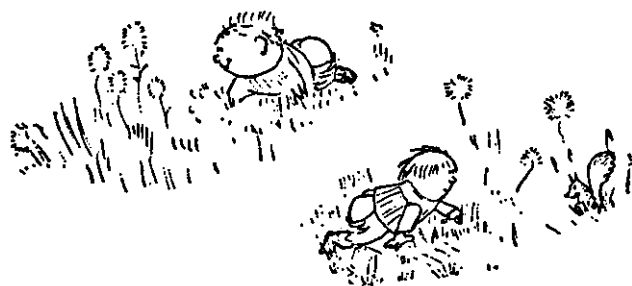
Most of these poems were written to amuse

String

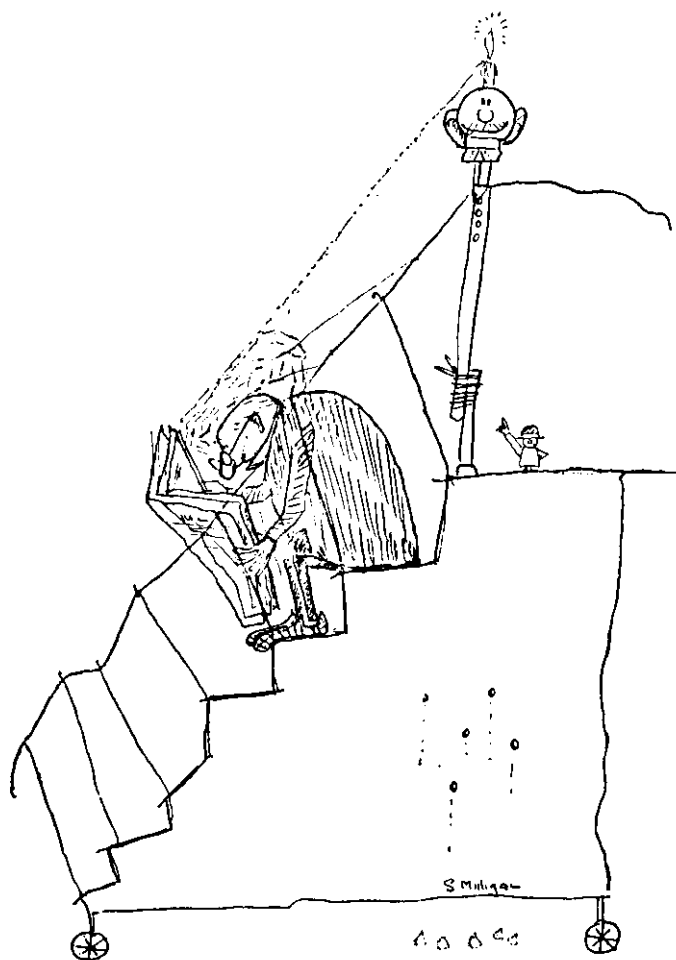
String
