

caterpillar spins around itself when it becomes a pupa.




#### cold

The ice cream is colder.


The ice is even colder.



#### cold-blooded


A cold-blooded animal has about the same temperature as the air or water around it.

Reptiles sunbathe to warm up their bodies.




#### colour
