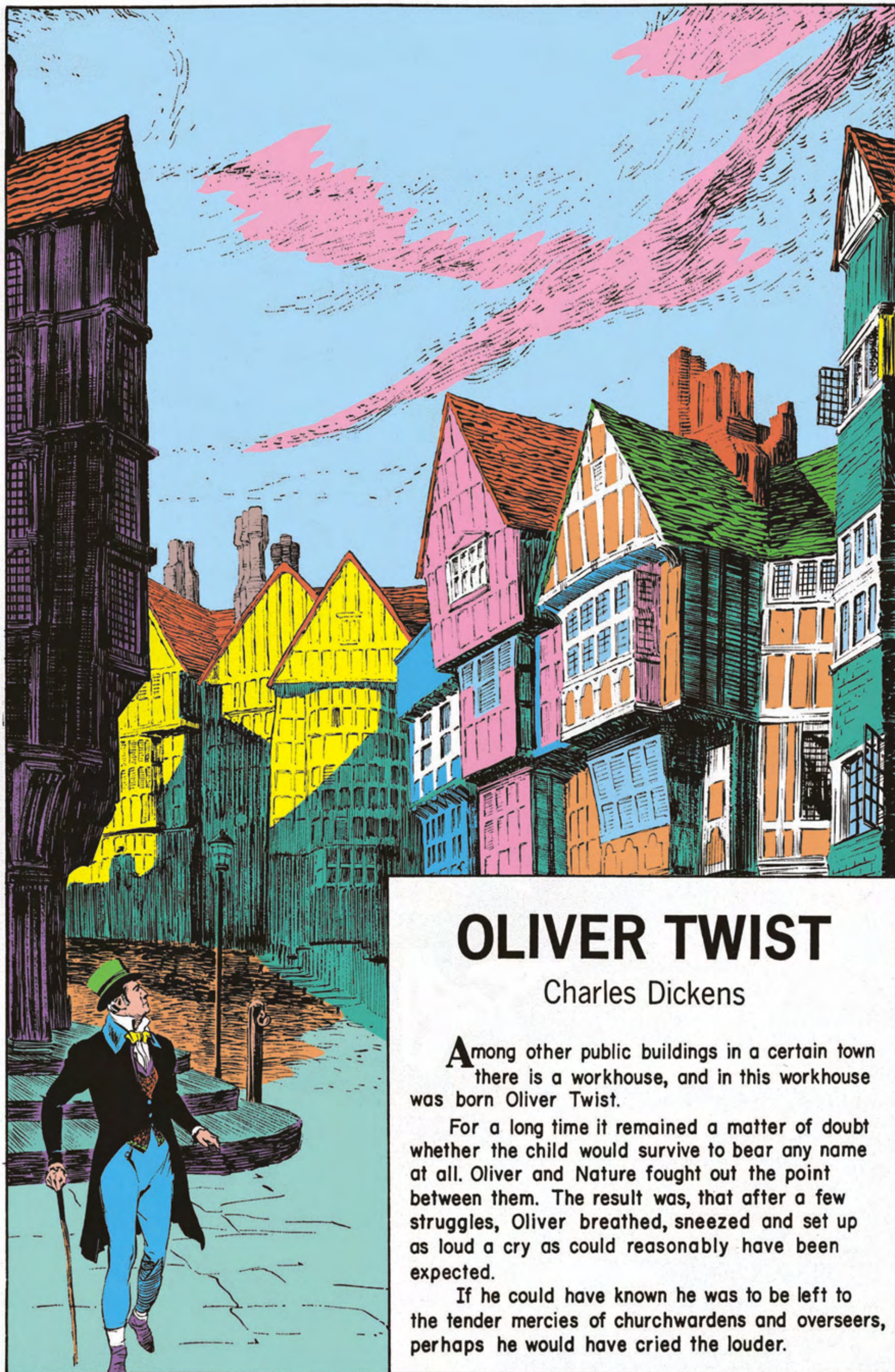
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OLIVER TWIST

Among other public buildings in a certain town there is a workhouse, and in this workhouse was born Oliver Twist.

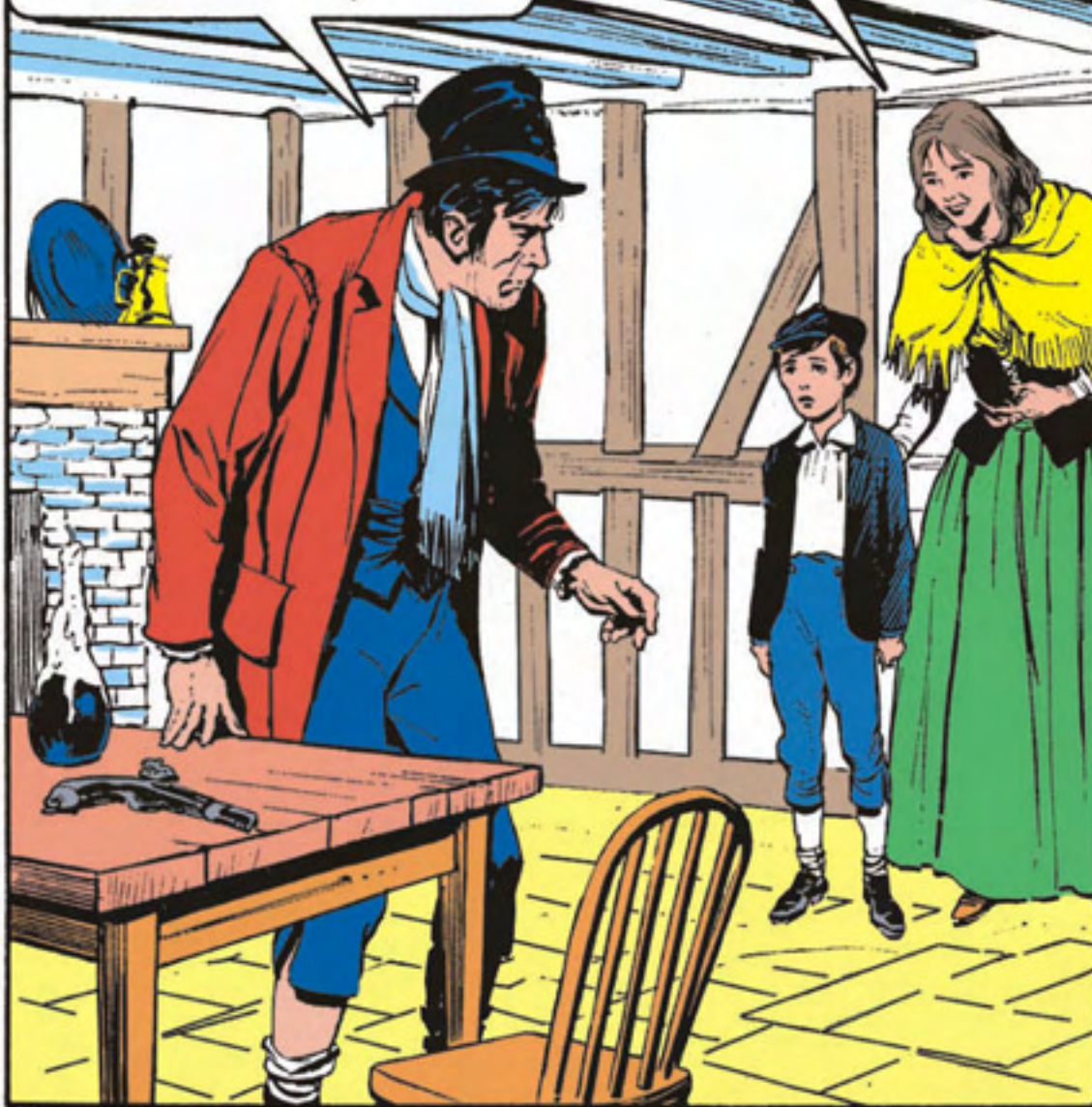
