Bats do seem to have minds. They seem to experience the world around them. But what is a bat's mind *like*, do you think?

The smaller bats 'see' using sound.
They send out squeaking noises
and, with their big ears, listen to
the echoes bouncing back off things

cave walls. That's how they hunt
insects in total darkness.
