We are crack teams, highly trained, orderly and ready for action. Our mission? To sort out the number world's measuring problems. How long is a football pitch? Call in our specialist metre Unit. How much lemonade is there in that bottle? The litre squad are the guys for you. How heavy's the cat? Hurrah! Here comes the gram brigade. Anything you can measure, we've got the measure of it.

We come in all sizes. Take the metre crew. If it's ladybirds or ants you're measuring, millimetres (mm for short) are what you need. For creepy-crawly spiders, centimetres (cm) may be best. Metres (m) are for larger pests, such as your big brother. Usually, these form neat blocks of tens and thousands – 10 mm = 1 cm, 1000 mm = 1 m. But time divides into Units of 60 and 24! Go figure!
