As Stan hurriedly packed his bowl and brush into a case, he heard a tap at the window.


It was Mabel on the other side... ten floors up.

but he managed to grab her tail just in time.






Hanging upside down, Mabel looked straight into the music lady's flat and had what artists call 'a flash of inspiration'.
