Two blackbirds flew by looking for a place to make their nest. *Chirrup, chirrup, tweet!* they said, and they started to build a nest in Hettie's hair.

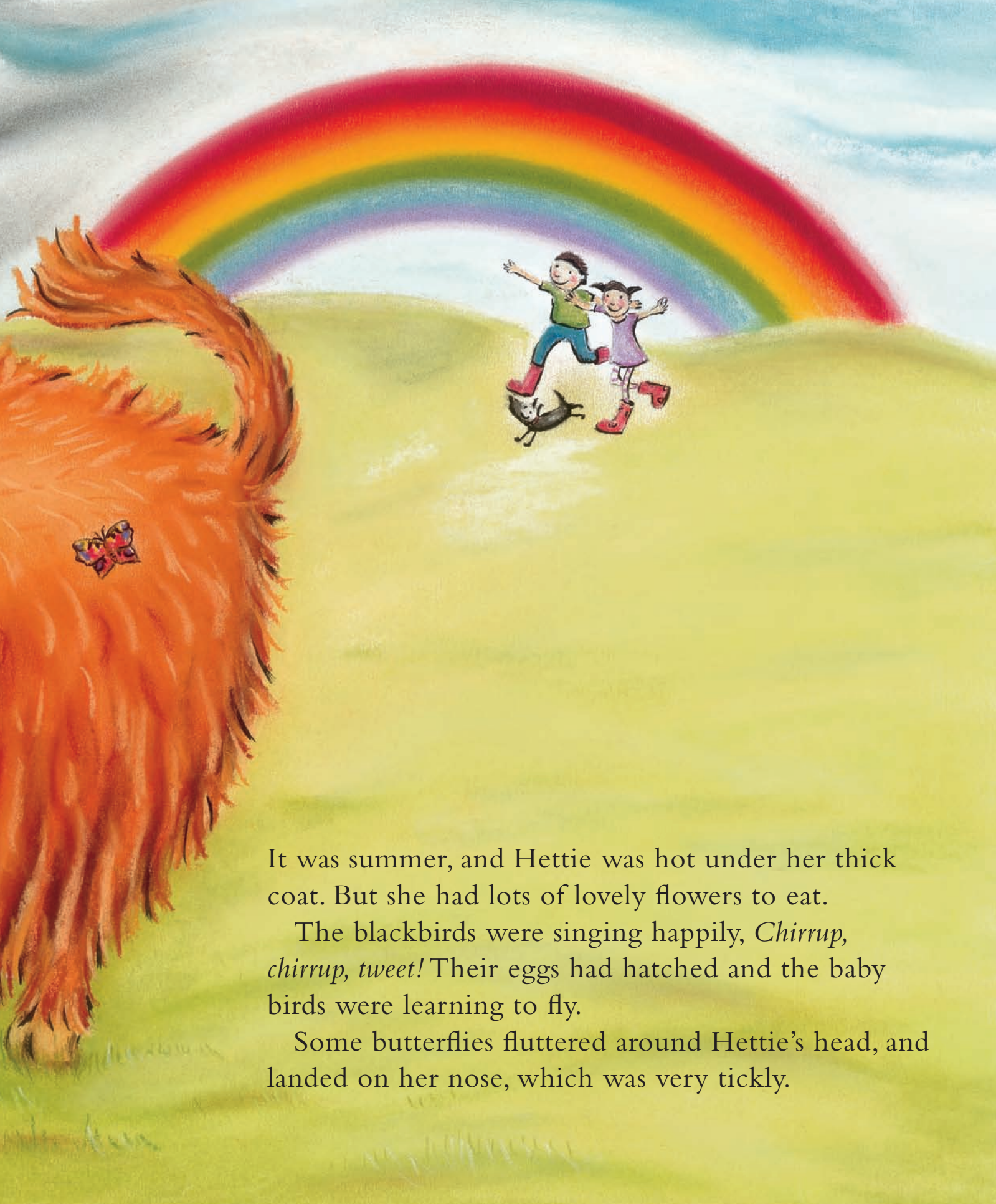
Mooooo said Hettie. She wasn't sure about this. She was a cow not a hedge.
