the Queen is in."



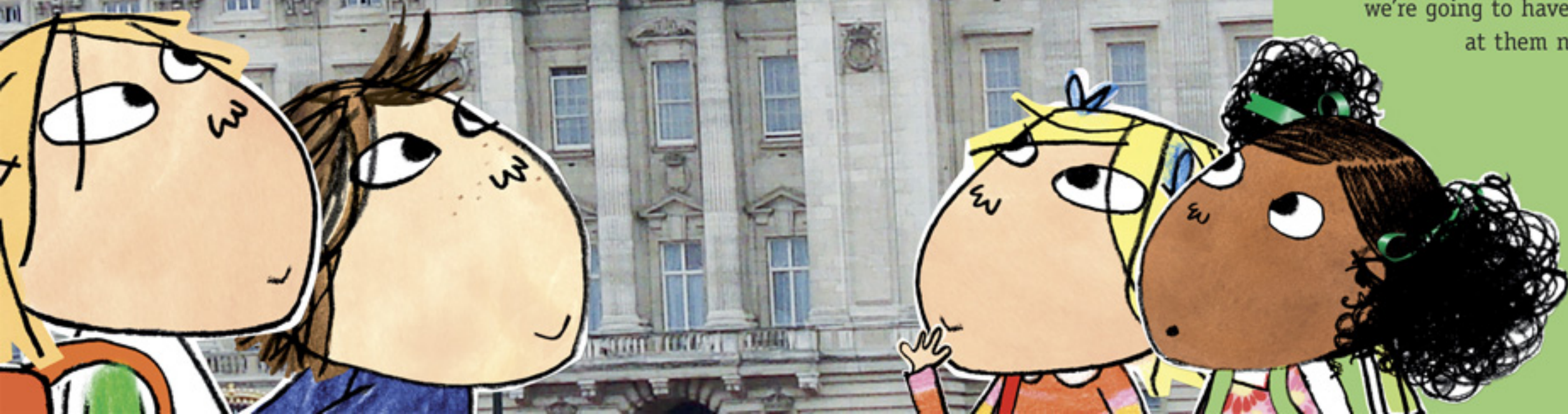
"I wonder which window
