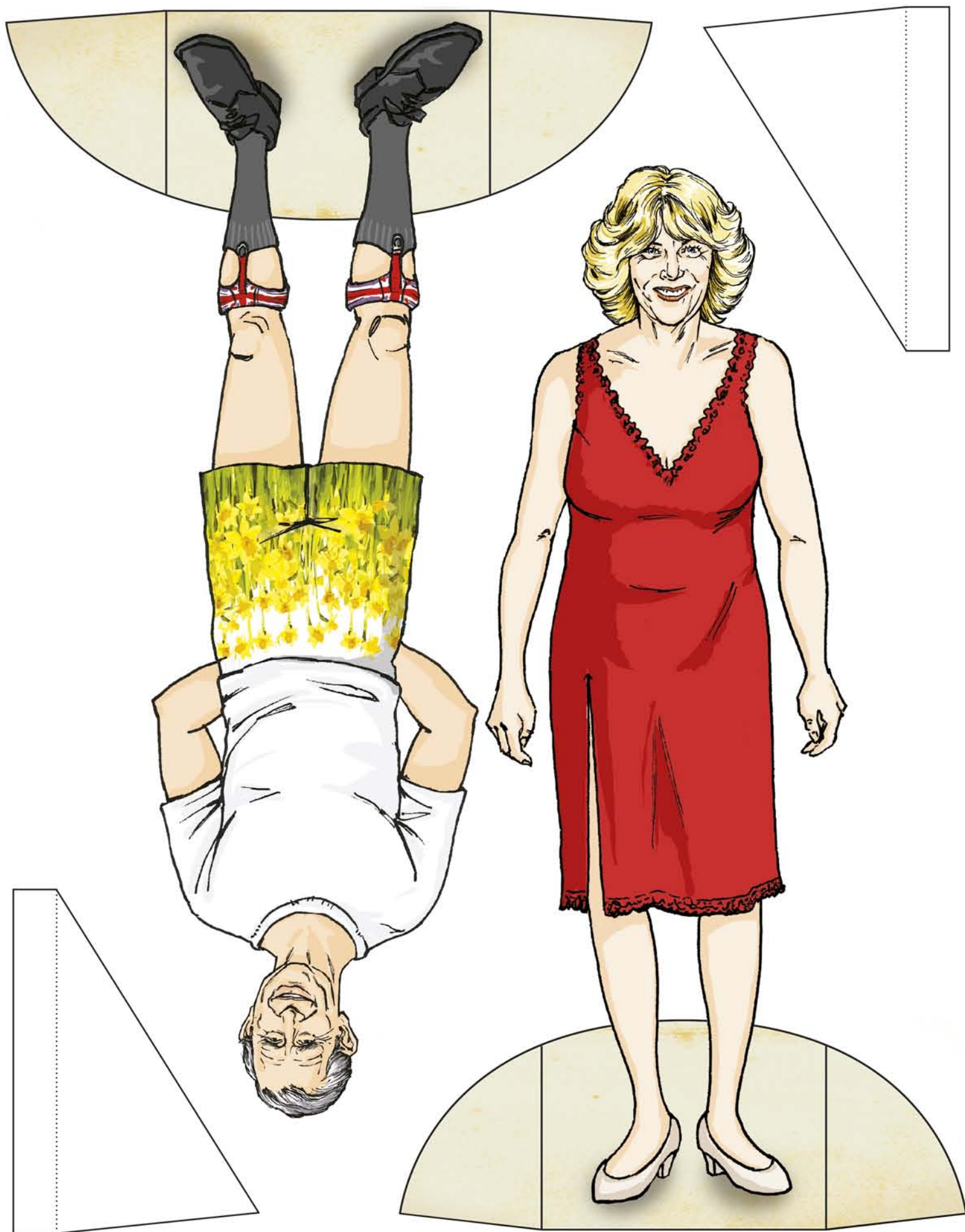
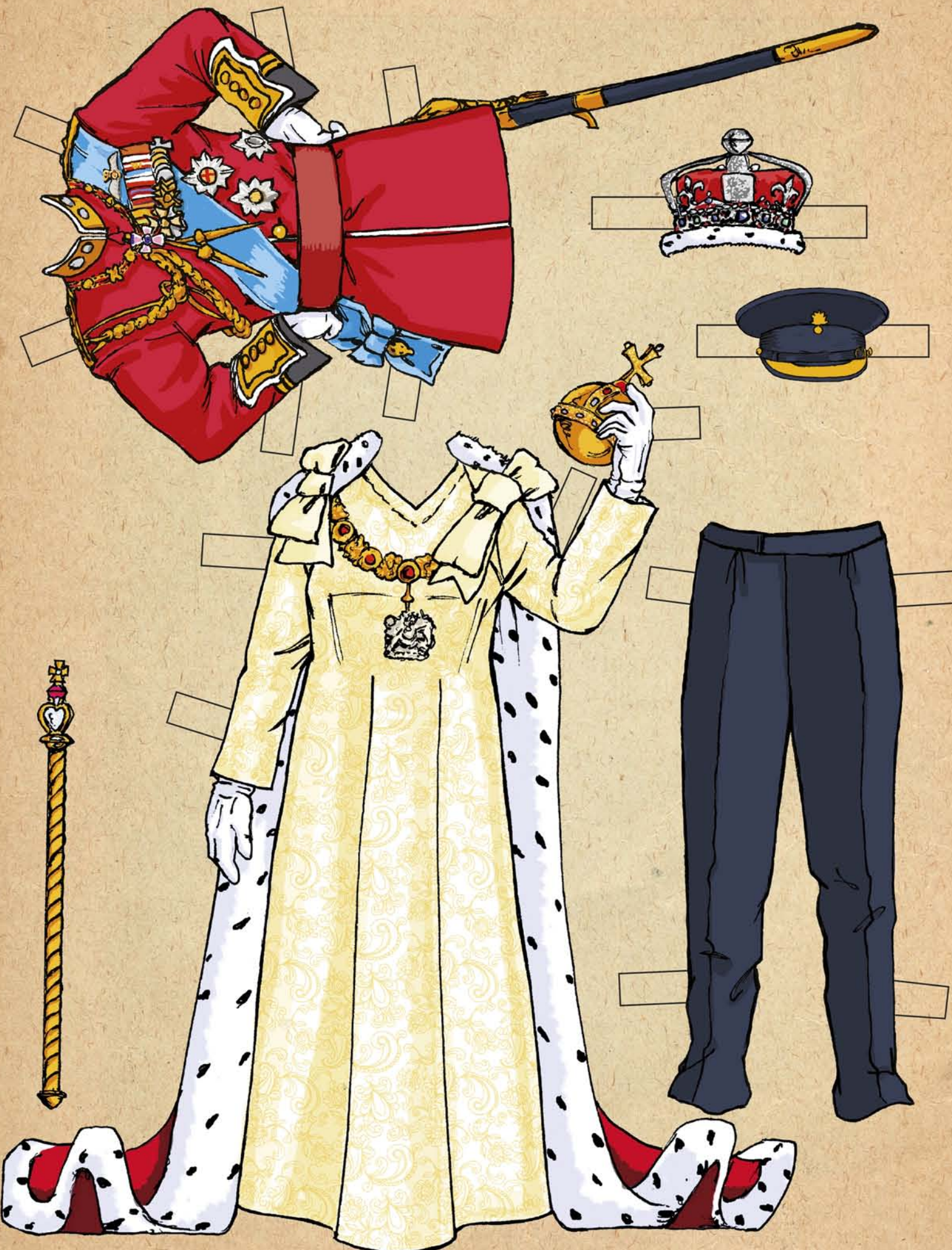






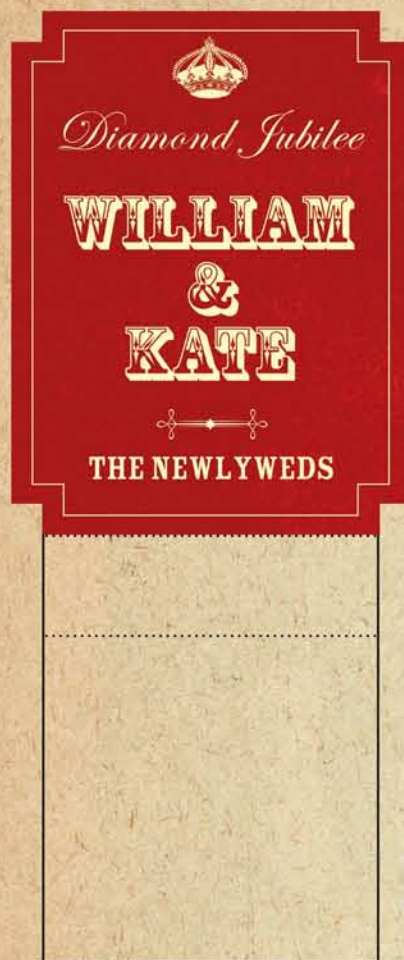
GOD SAVE THE QUEEN

HM (Her Majesty) Queen Elizabeth II celebrates 60 years on the throne over the weekend of 2–5 June 2012. The only other British monarch to celebrate a Diamond Jubilee was Queen Victoria in 1897. Queen Elizabeth II came to the throne on 6 February 1952, and her coronation, which took place on 2 June 1953, was watched on TV by millions of people. The Queen's coronation was the first ever to be televised and was also the world's first major international event to be broadcast on TV.

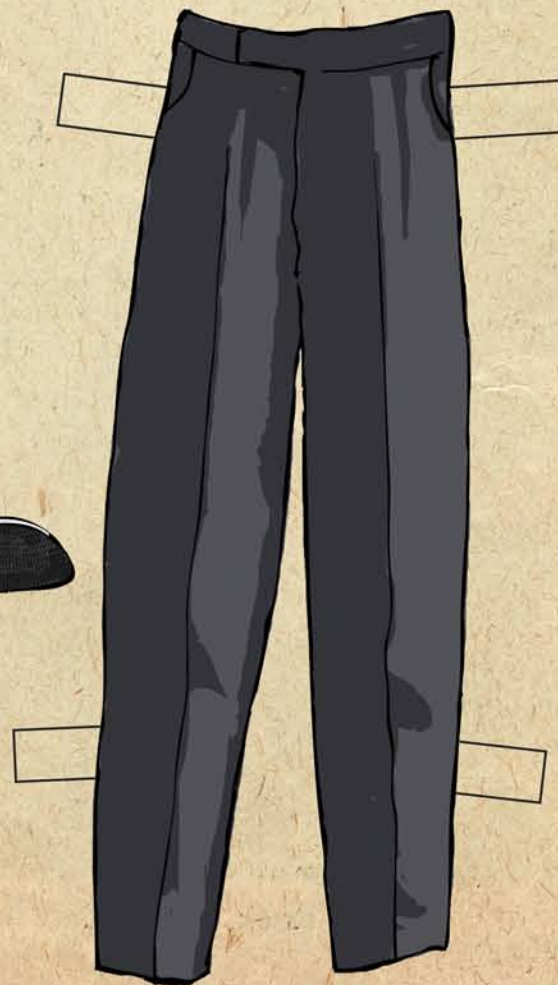
Elizabeth married Philip – a prince of Greek and Danish heritage – in 1952, and they have four children: Charles, Anne, Andrew and Edward.

Philip was given the title Duke of Edinburgh shortly before his marriage to Elizabeth, and he also holds honorary appointments and ranks in the Armed Services.

Queen Elizabeth II is known for her handbags and hats, and has donned 5,000 of the latter during her reign. And as for what the Queen carries in her handbag, *Majesty* magazine reports that it holds a comb, a handkerchief, a small gold compact and a tube of lipstick. On Sundays, the Queen carries paper money to place in the collection plate at church.

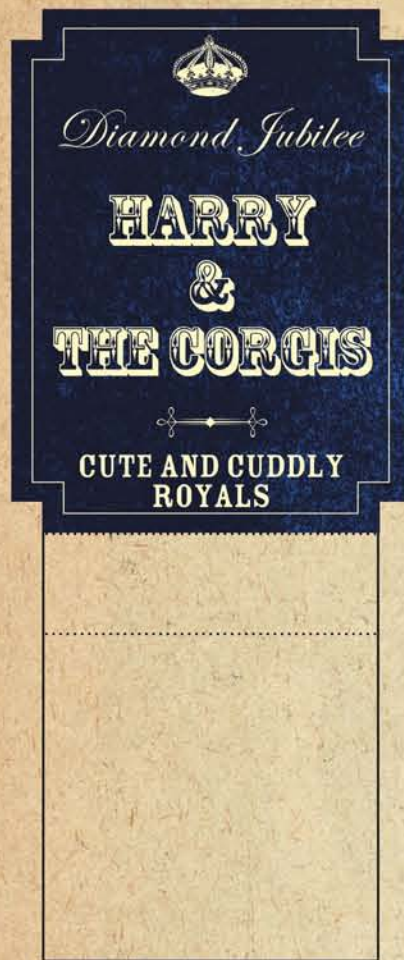

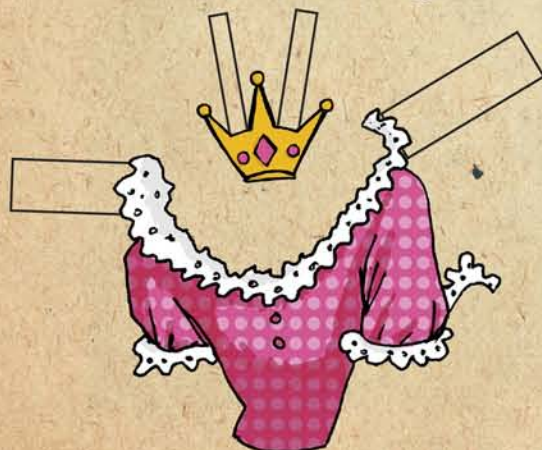
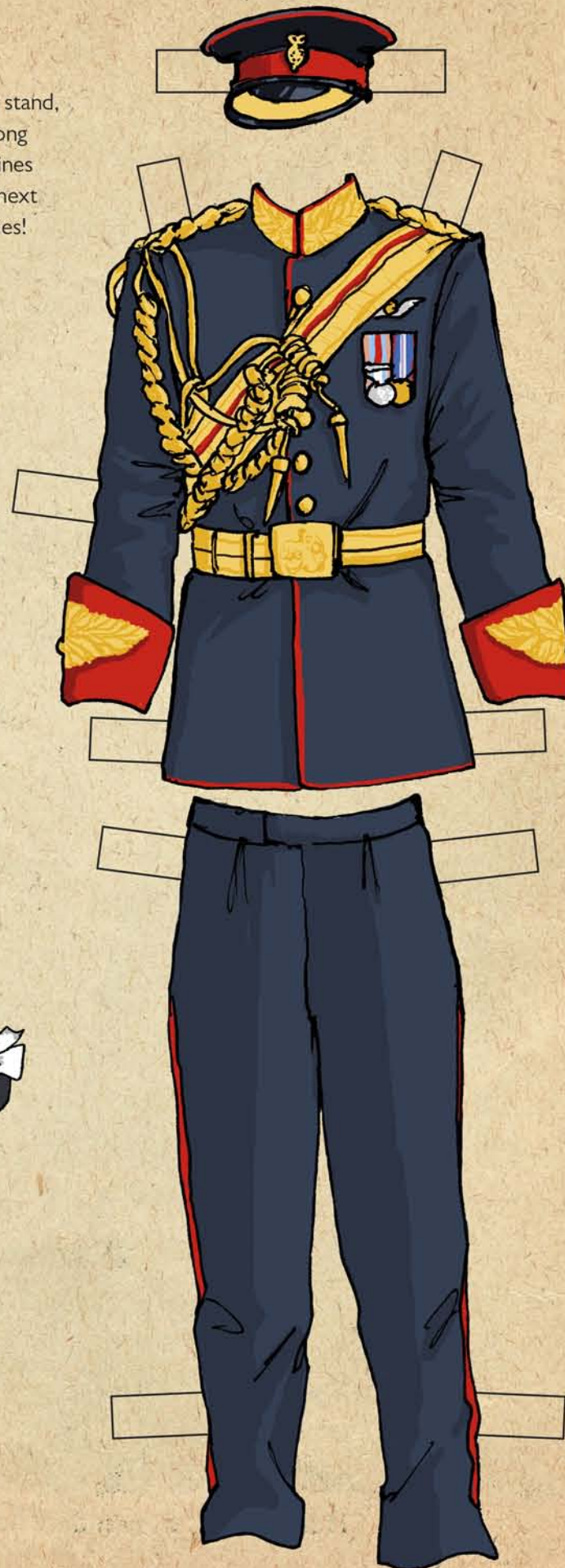
Kate is a big fan of Issa, and she has worn dresses by the designer on many occasions, including the famous blue dress she wore to the couple's engagement announcement.

Over the years, The Royal Family have had scores of dogs as their family pets – from pugs to greyhounds, King Charles Spaniels to corgis. The Queen favours corgis, and at present she owns four: Linnet, Monty, Willo and Holly.

The corgis travel with the Queen to the various royal residences, and despite her busy schedule she looks after them herself as much as possible. It's said that the Queen always keeps a stash of chocolate drops in her handbag exclusively for them.
