Lollipop doesn't know how to swim.

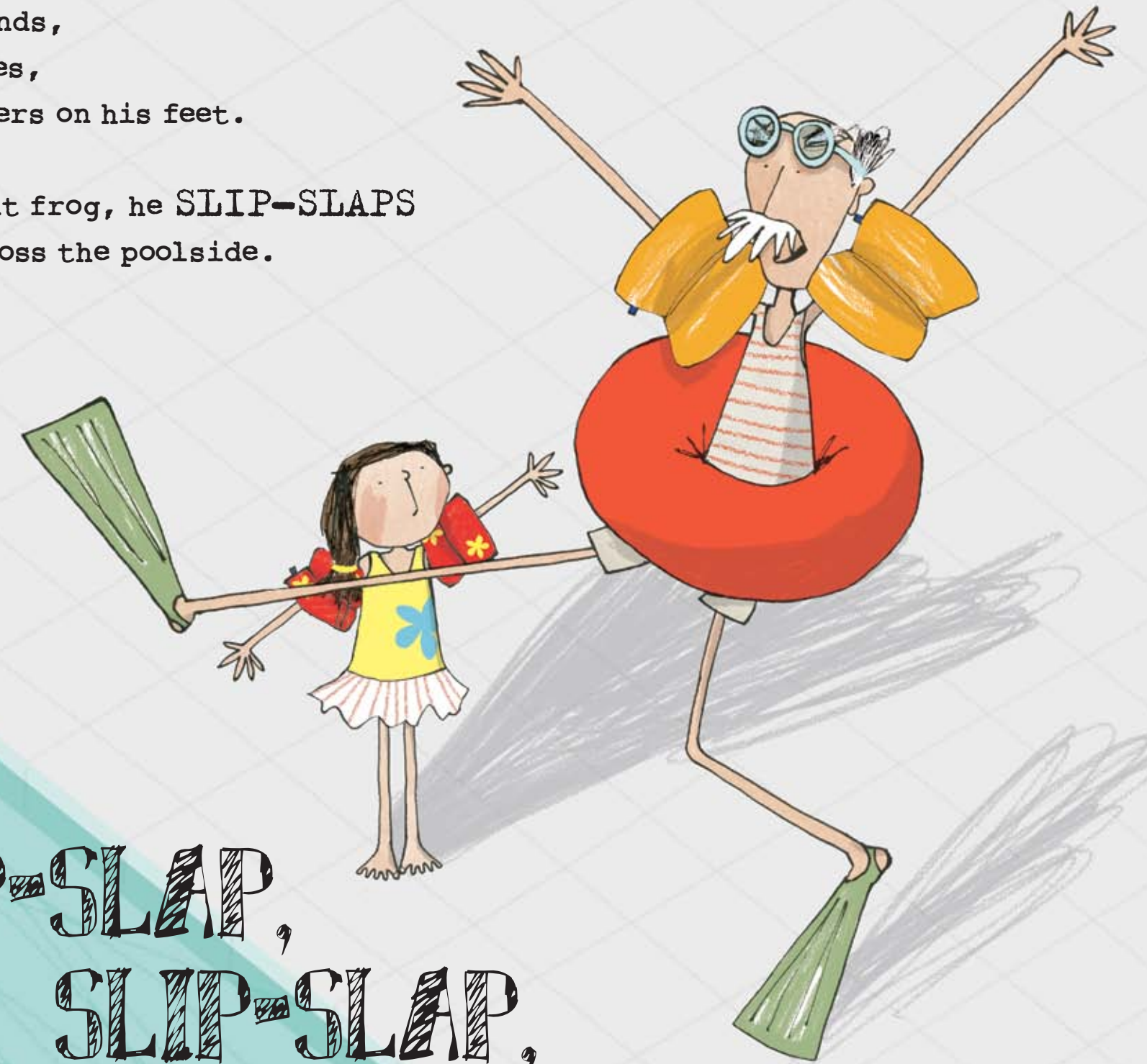
Just when she thinks she might change her mind
