

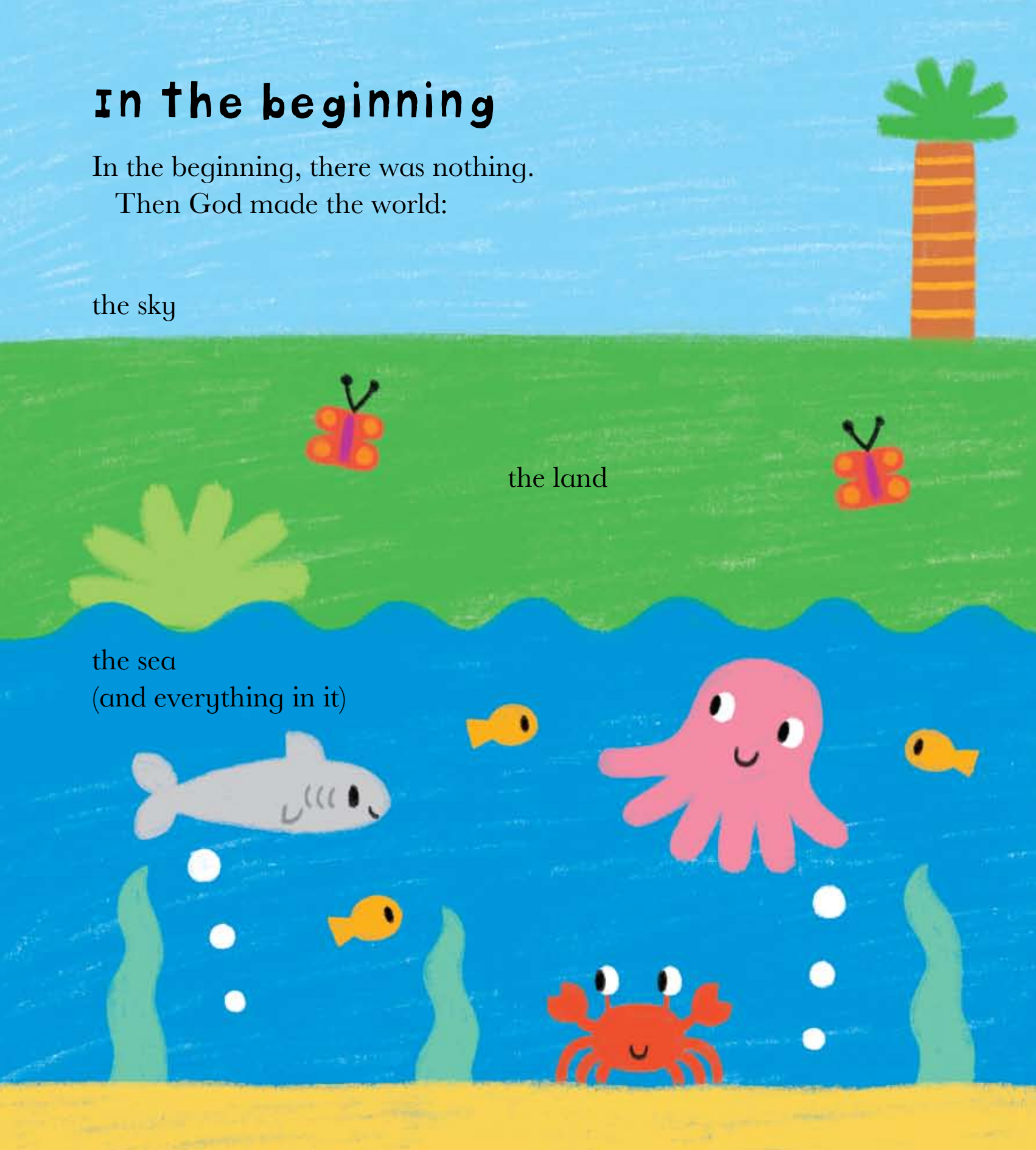
In the beginning

God sent a big fish to swallow Jonah up.



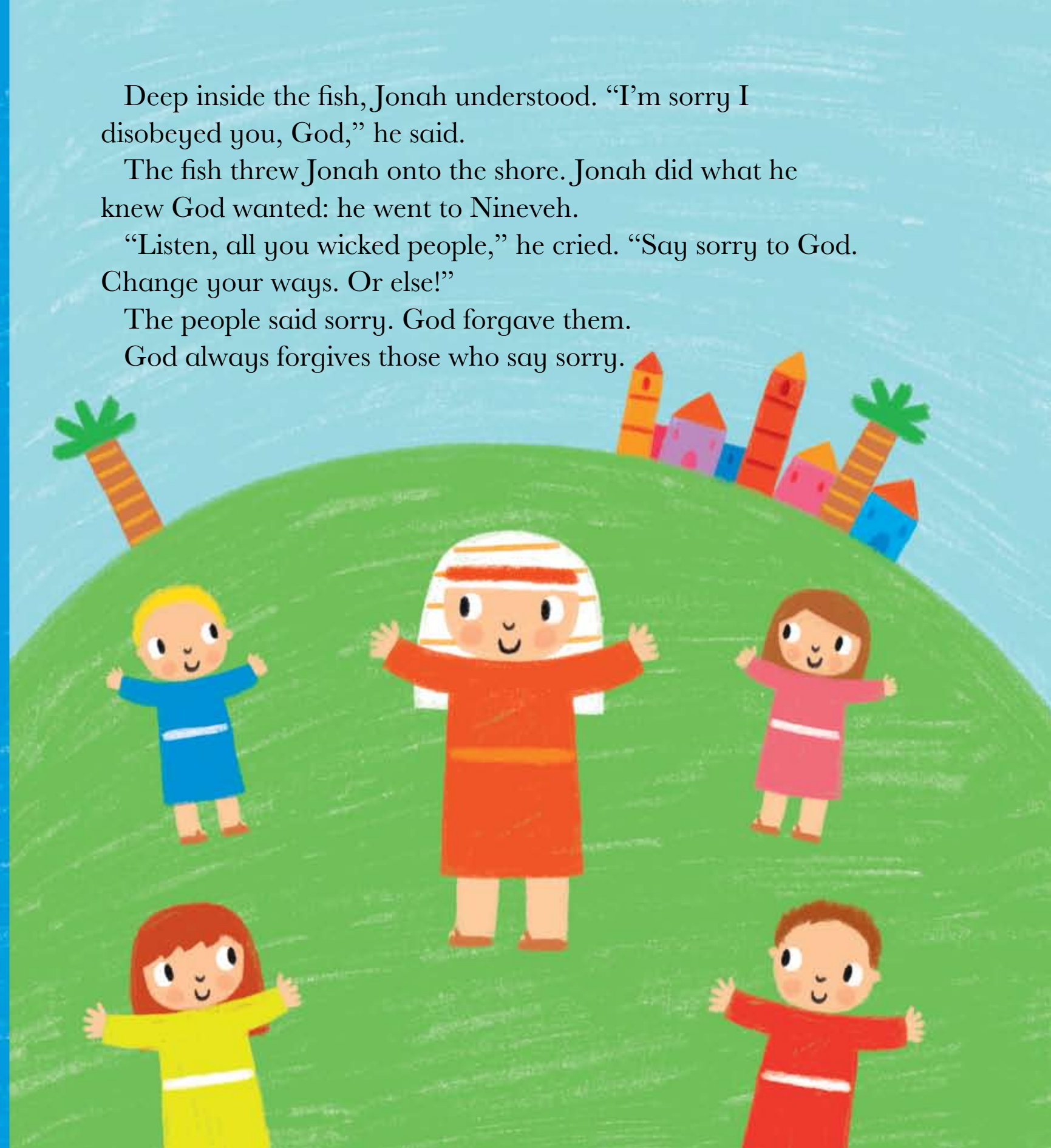
Deep inside the fish, Jonah understood. "I'm sorry I disobeyed you, God," he said.

God always forgives those who say sorry.



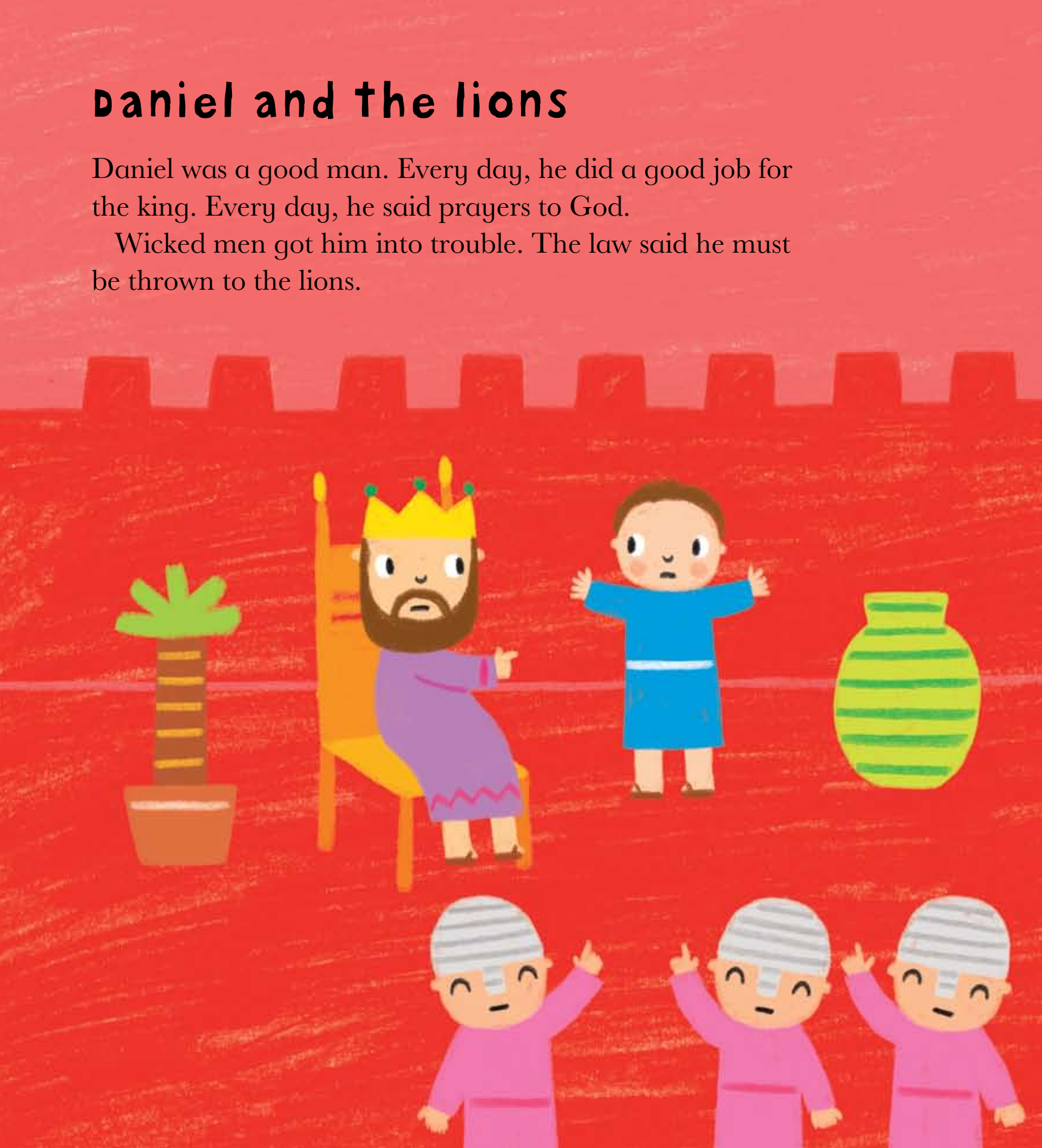
Daniel and the lions

An angel appeared.

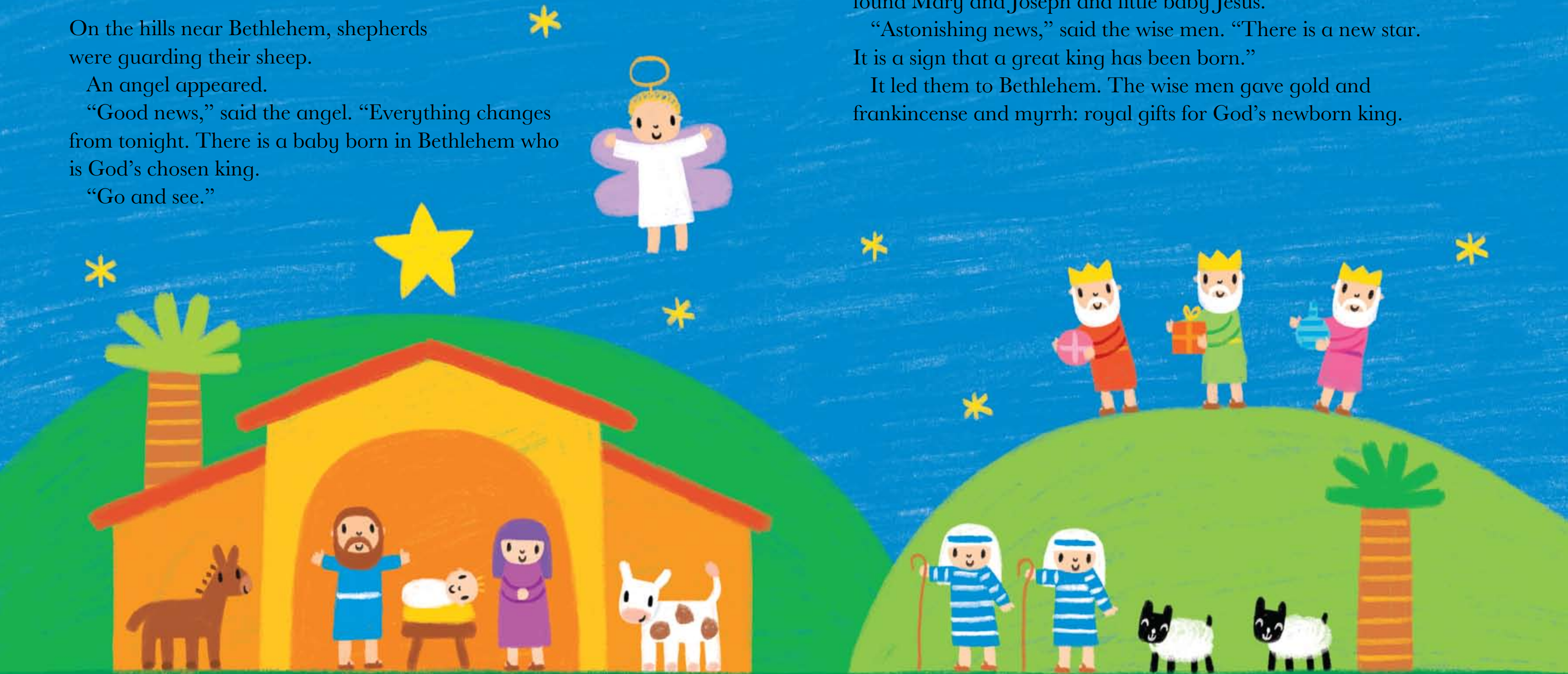
“Good news,” said the angel. “Everything changes from tonight. There is a baby born in Bethlehem who is God’s chosen king.

So when some mothers came with their children, Jesus' friends said, "Stop! Jesus is busy with important people."



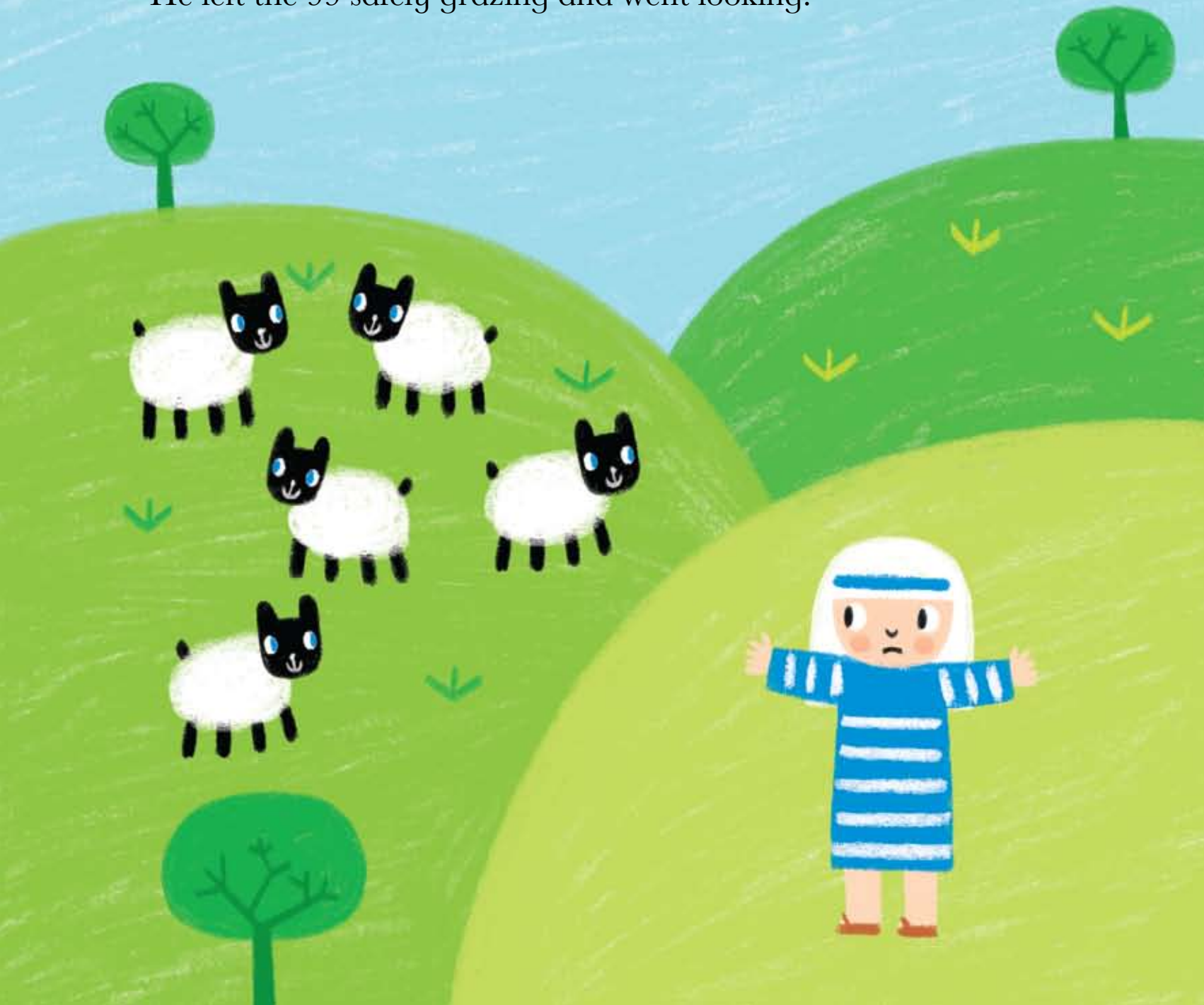
Jesus heard them.
