Sharpen your skills

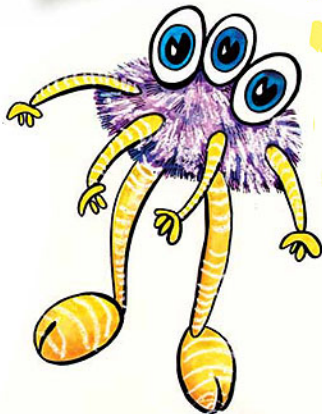

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PICASSO SELF PORTRAIT

Picasso created weird and wonderful portraits. Here's how to make your own!

1 On tracing paper, draw a face-on portrait of yourself in pencil. Trace over a photograph of yourself or use a mirror.



2 On another piece of tracing paper, draw another portrait of yourself at the same size - this time from a profile view.



3 Draw a third portrait of yourself on another sheet of tracing paper at the same size - this time from a three-quarter turned view.



YOU WILL NEED:

- Tracing paper
- HB pencil
- Photographs of yourself
- Cartridge paper
- Acrylic paints
- Palette
- Paintbrush

4 Take all three of your portraits and layer them one on top of the other. Through the tracing paper, you should be able to see all three drawings. Line them up so your head is in the same place in each one.



5 On a piece of cartridge paper, redraw your lines, picking out the different features to make a 'muddled' portrait. Thicken the lines you want to stand out.

Use acrylic paints to colour your portrait. The colours can be as strange as the portrait itself!



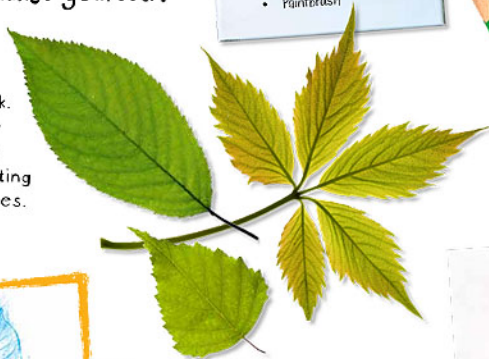
COLOUR WHEEL RUBBING

Decorate a picture frame with stamps you can make and change yourself!

YOU WILL NEED:

- A variety of leaves
- Sheet of thin paper
- Coloured pencils
- Watercolour paints
- Paintbrush

1 Collect some leaves from your garden or local park. Make sure they are different sizes and have some interesting patterns and textures.



2 Place your leaves under a sheet of thin paper, and practice making rubbing of them in different colours, using colouring pencils.



4 Using the watercolour paints and a paintbrush, practice blending out the six colours, so they go from bold to faint. Use more paint to make the colours bold and more water to make them fainter.



3 To make your final colour wheel, arrange six similar-sized leaves in a fanned circle. Run over these, in the colours of the colour wheel. These colours are: red, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple.

4 Using the watercolour paints and a paintbrush, practice blending out the six colours, so they go from bold to faint. Use more paint to make the colours bold and more water to make them fainter.

5 Finish your colour wheel by applying this painting technique around your leaf circle. Blend the different colours together when they meet to make new shades and tones.



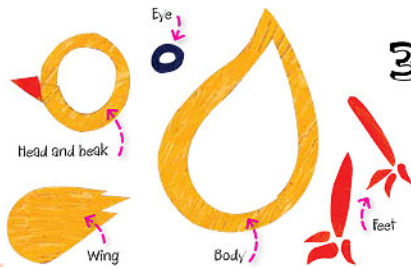


EASTER CHICK GIFTCARD

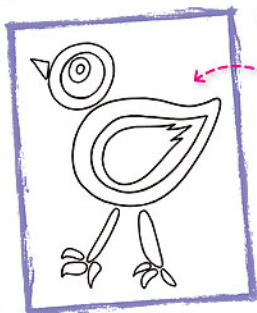
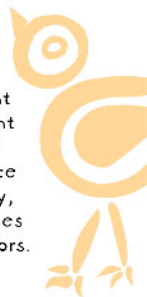
Combine painting and collage to make a bold design for a giftcard

YOU WILL NEED:

- Piece of cardboard
- HB pencil
- Acrylic paints
- Palette
- Paintbrush
- Scissors
- Thick A4 paper or cardboard, folded in half
- Glue



3 Choose your favourite paint colours to paint the shapes of your chick. Once the paint is dry, cut these pieces out with scissors.



1 On a piece of cardboard, draw an Easter chick design using simple shapes. Make sure your design will fit on an A5 piece of paper.



Yellow acrylic, with gold metallic paint dabbed over the surface using a small strip of card



Orange and yellow acrylic mixed together to make a bold orange



A dark violet for adding strong details

Violet and white acrylic to make a pale purple

2 On a separate piece of card, experiment with different colours of paint to decide how to colour your chick design.

You can make painted collage giftcards for any occasion! How about this scary pumpkin design?



4 Assemble your pieces on your folded A4 thick card or paper. You can also add a background and a border decoration. Glue these pieces into place.
