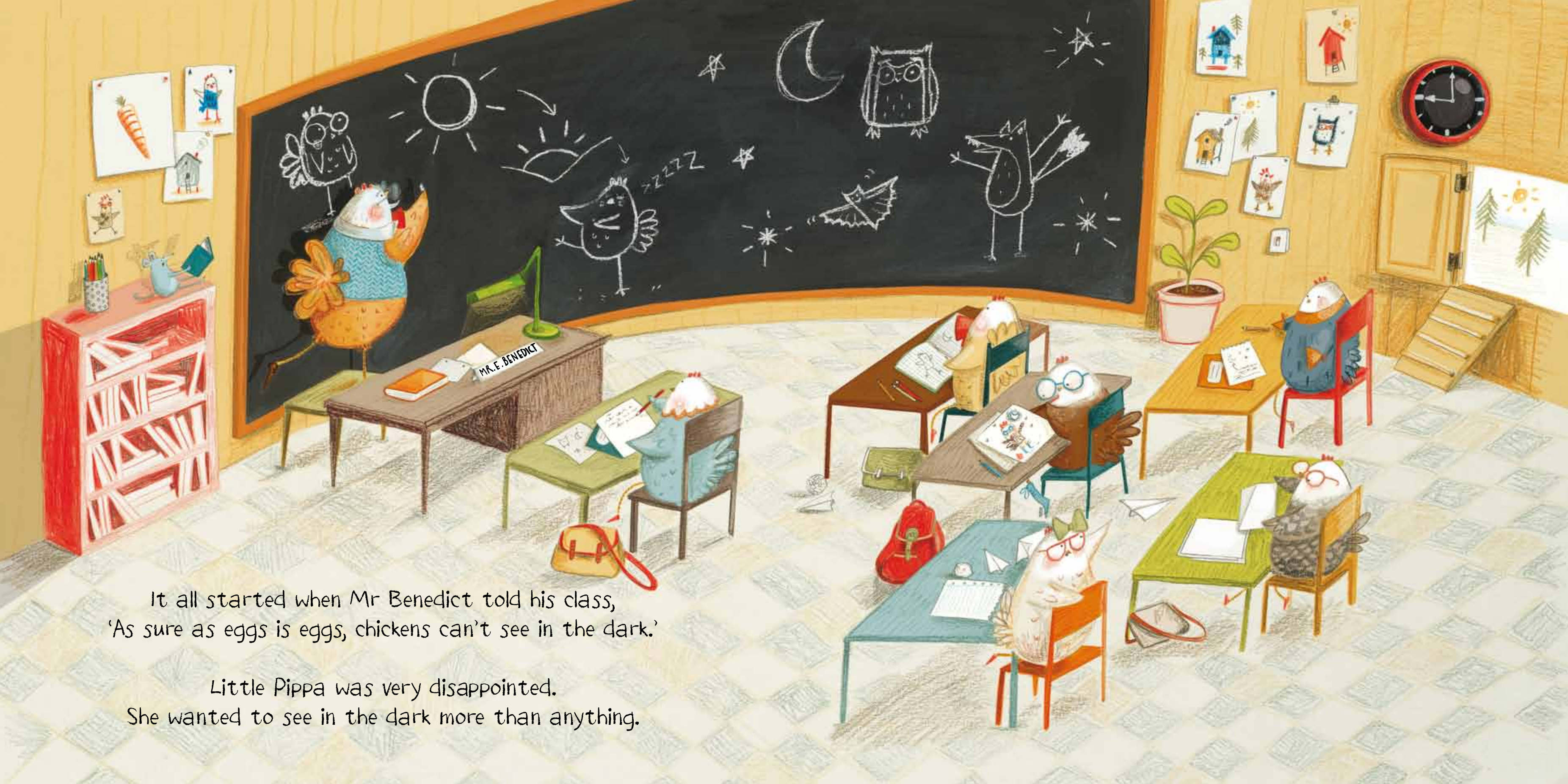
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On Sunnyside Farm, there is one chicken

She wanted to see in the dark more than anything.



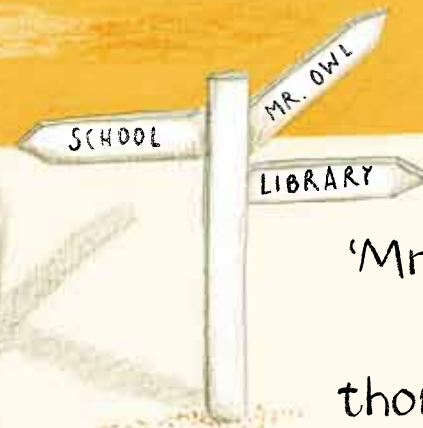
And she knew someone
