Wild flowers all year round

Snowdrops in February, daffodils in March – every month we can look forward to different wild flowers appearing. Here are some monthly favourites.



Meet the pollinators

Flowers produce seeds, which make new flowers. Seeds form when dust called pollen moves from the male part of one plant to the female parts of another. Animals often move the pollen when they feed.



Bees

Look carefully. Can you see the pollen baskets on this bee's legs?



Butterflies

As the butterfly feeds, pollen brushes onto its body.



Ants

Small ants move pollen from one flower to another.



Beetles

Beetles also spread pollen when they crawl over flowers.
