Hercules seemed to smile. Billy sighed and switched on the TV.

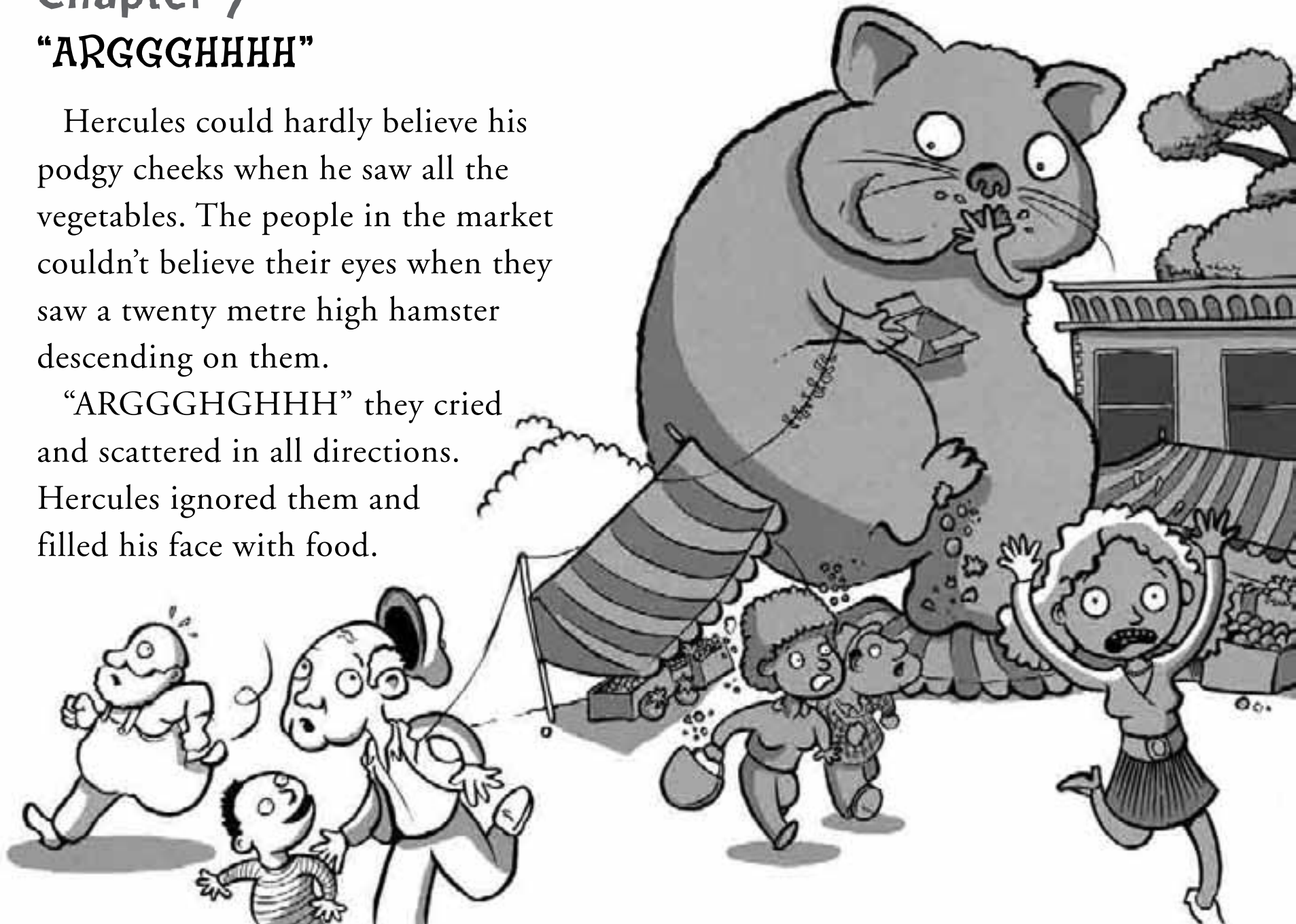
