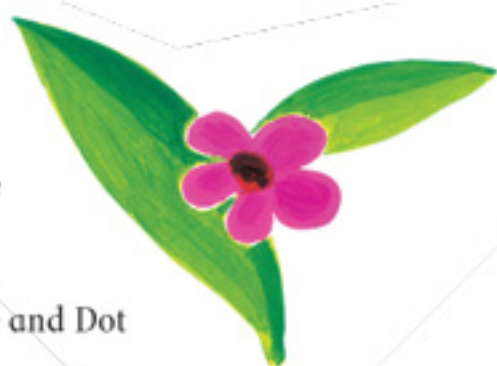

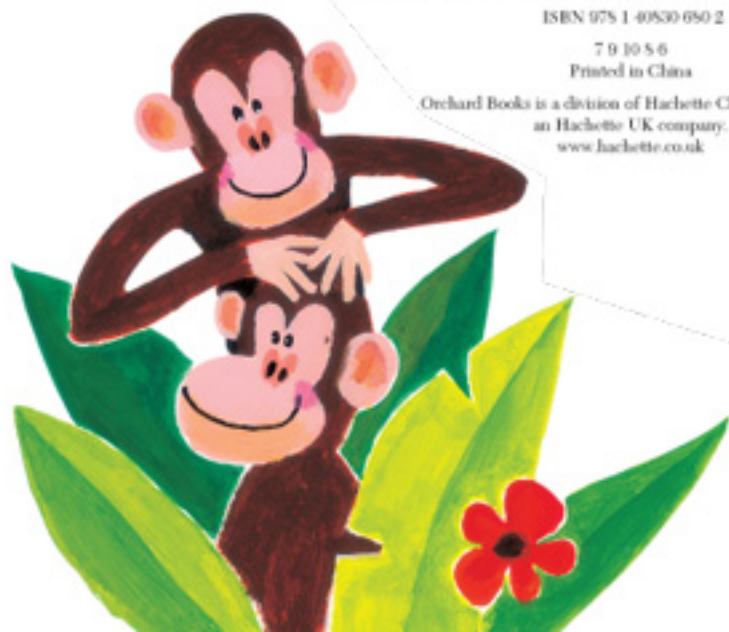

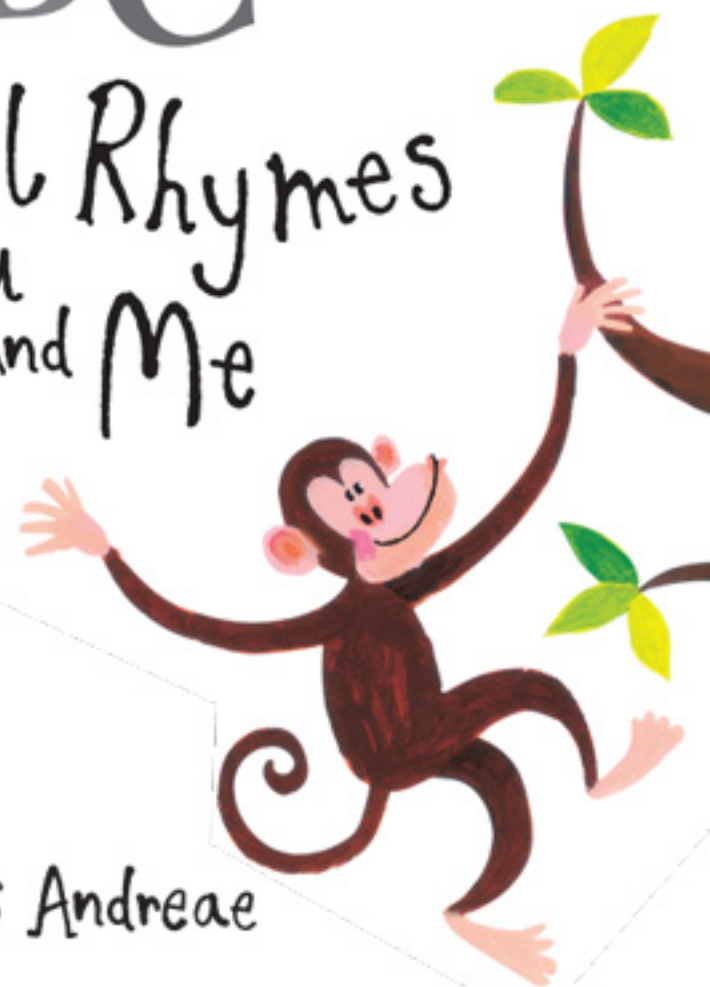

Angelfish

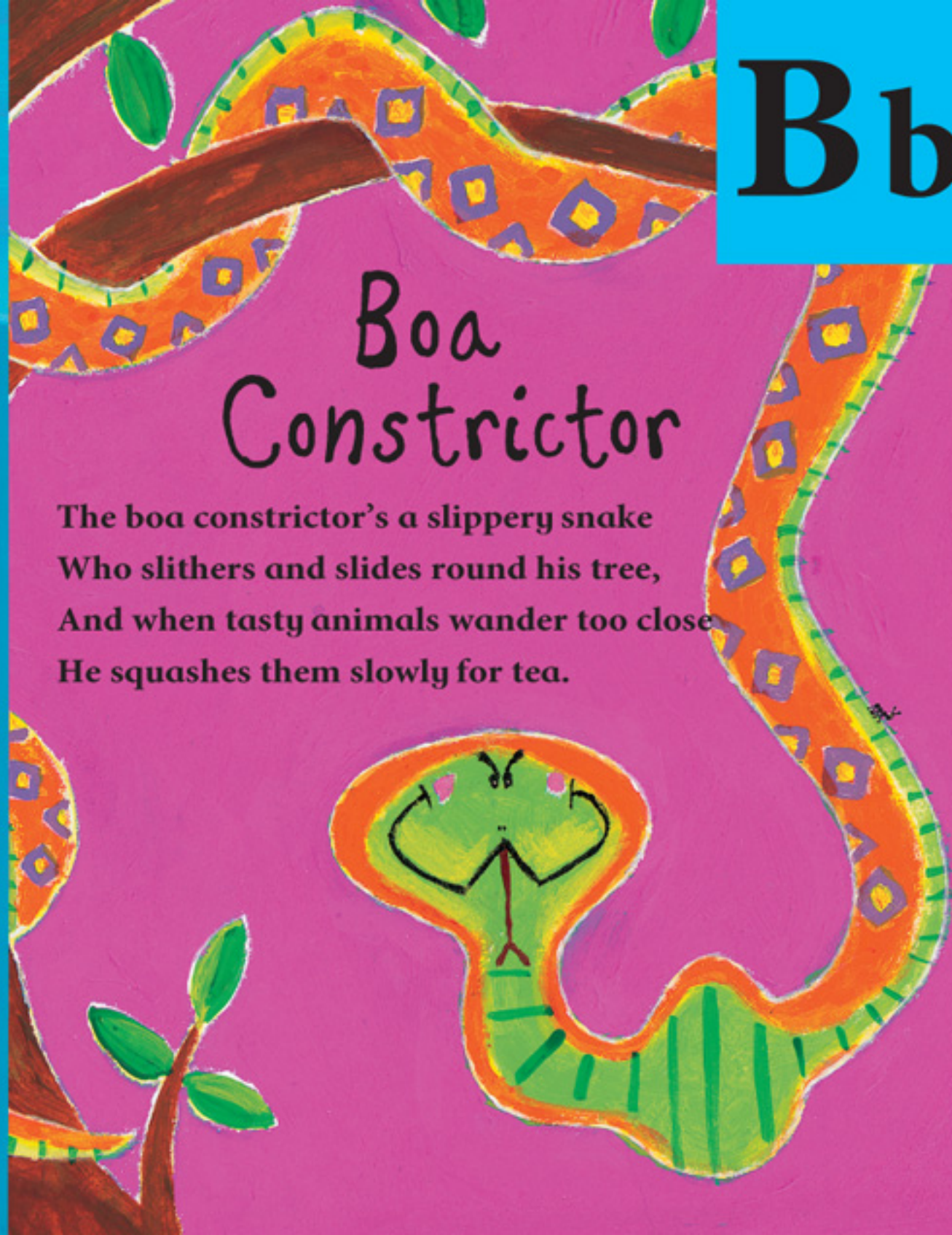
Hello, I'm the angelfish, darling,

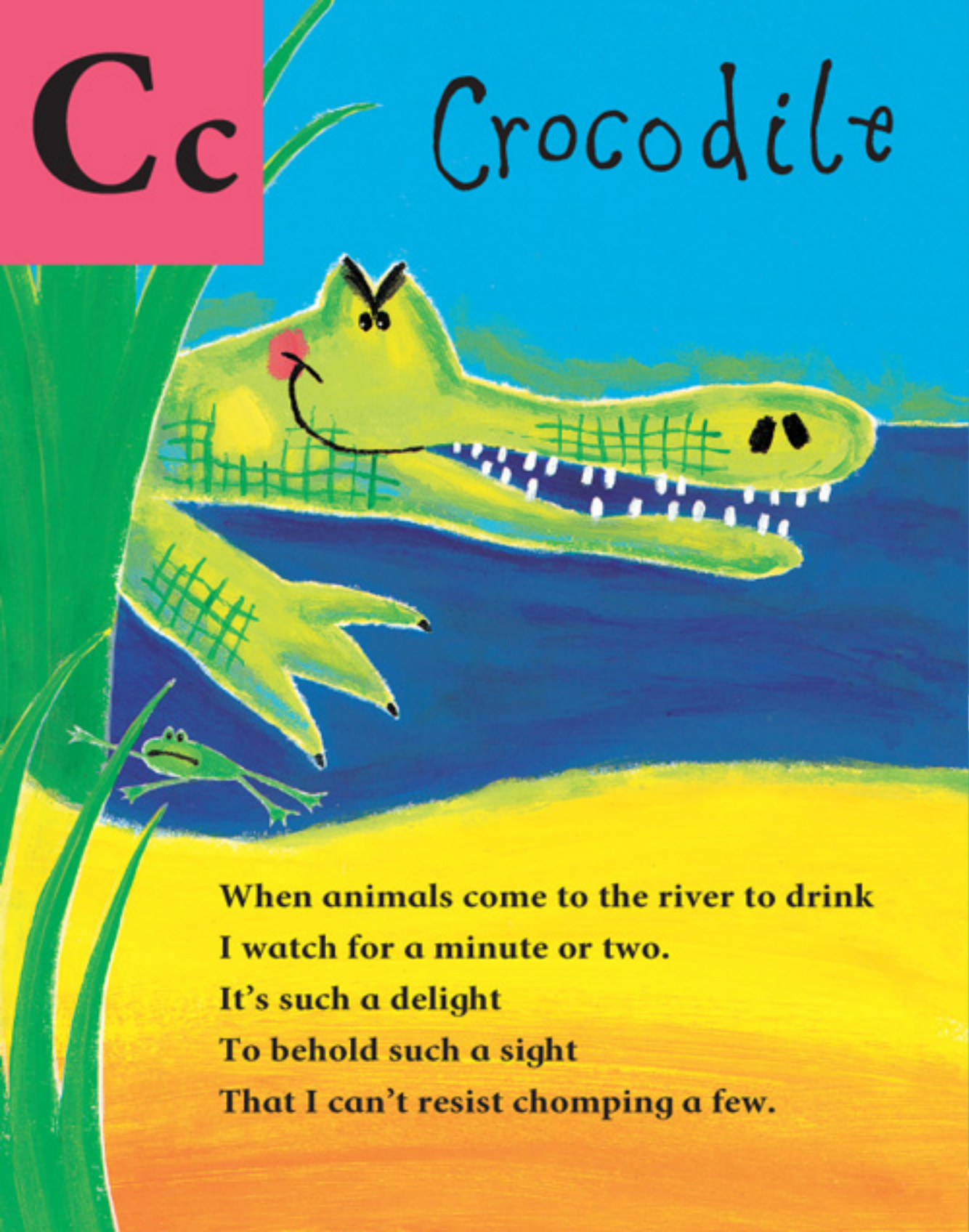
Boa Constrictor
