

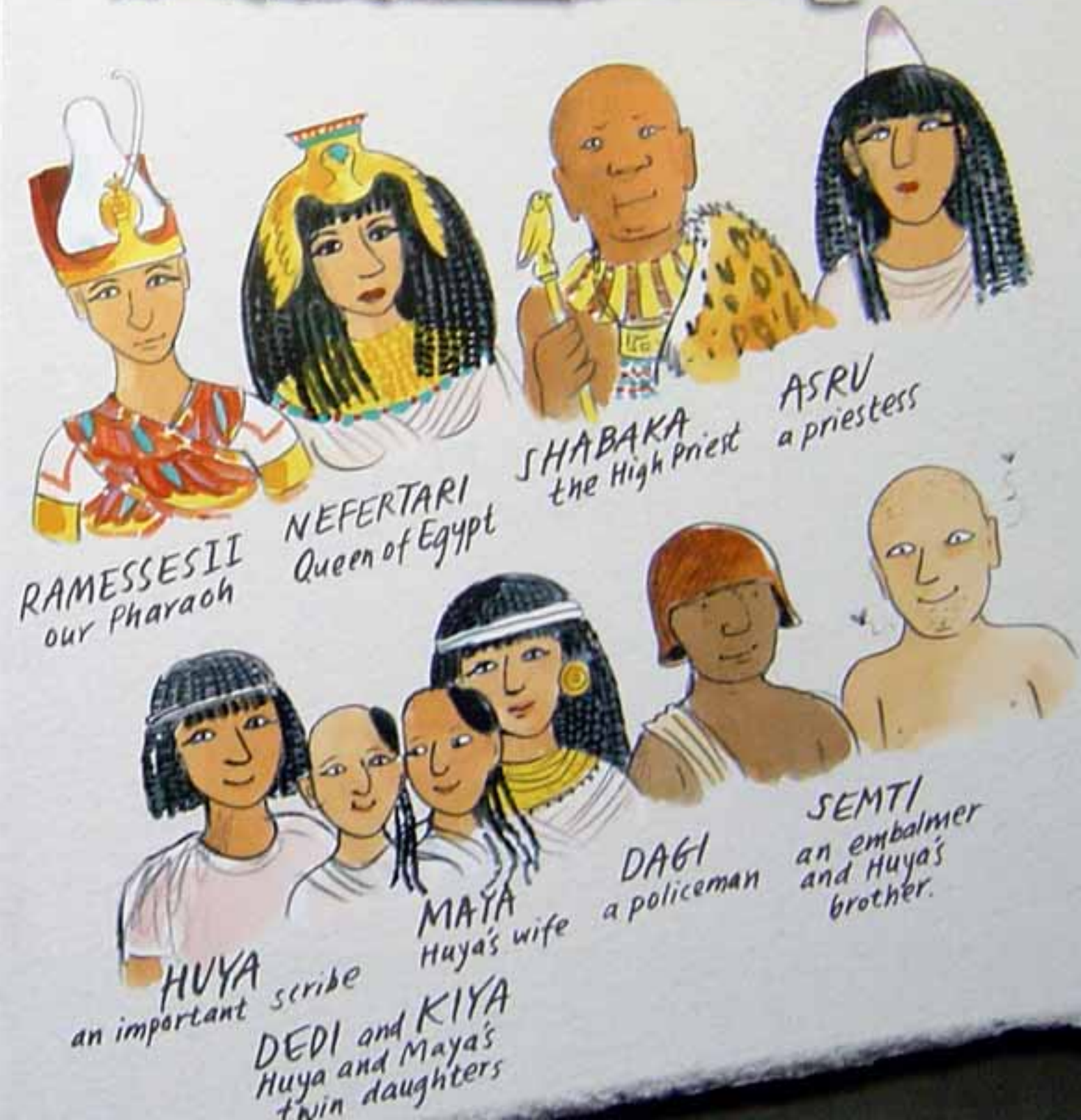
WHO WERE THE ANCIENT EGYPTIANS?

The Pharaohs ruled Egypt from about 3000 BC to about 30 BC. Egyptians were clever and inventive. They used tools made of bronze and stone to do whatever they wanted. Ancient Egypt was a wonderful place, attracting people from many lands to visit and to buy and trade goods. Many of these visitors stayed and settled there, marrying Egyptians and worshipping the Egyptian gods. The Egyptians call themselves 'Blacklanders' after the rich, fertile soil of the Nile valley

The word Pharaoh began as a nickname for the Egyptian king. It means 'great house' because everyone believed the king's human body was home to a god.

The Egyptians believed that Ra, the great sun god, drove his fiery chariot across the sky every day. They even nicknamed themselves 'Ra's Cattle'.

By the time Ramesses II was on the throne, the Pharaohs had not used pyramids as tombs for hundreds of years.

The Great Pyramid at Giza had vents pointing to the constellation of Orion so the mummy's spirit could fly straight up to the gods.
