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Opening extract from **The Friendship Club**

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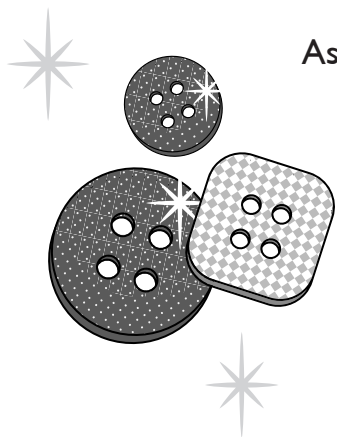

As long as you wore the school colours and looked neat and tidy, you could wear whatever dress, top, skirt





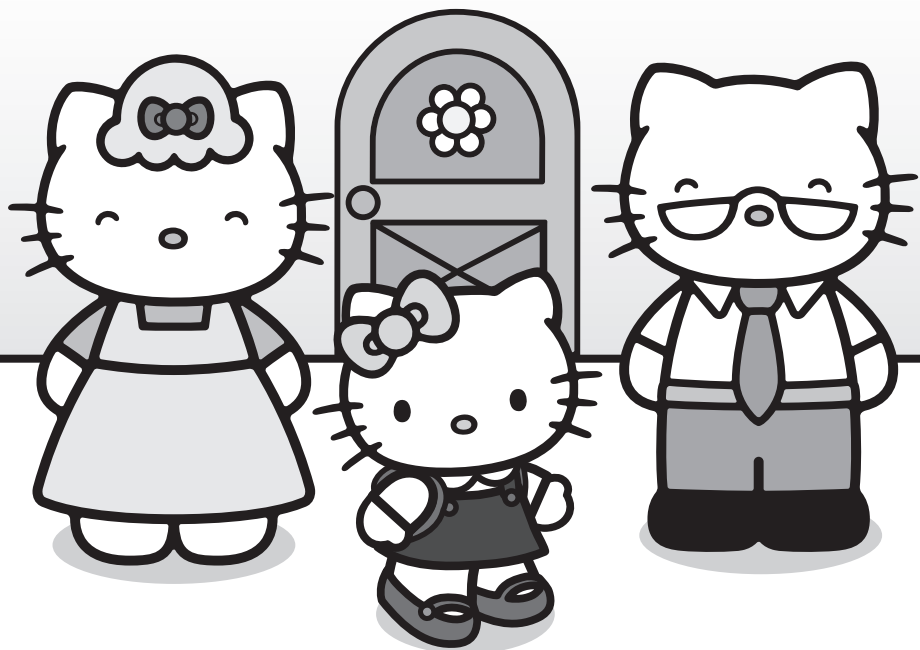
or trousers you liked. Hello Kitty had had great fun shopping with her twin sister, Mimmy, and their Mama.
