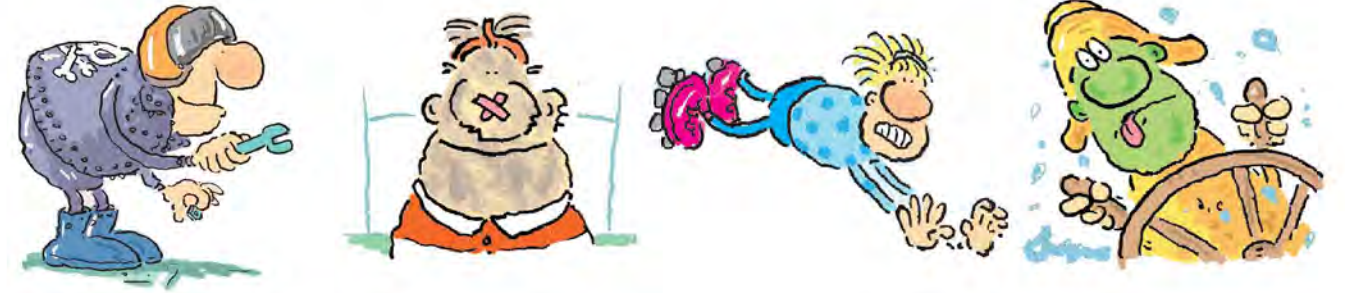

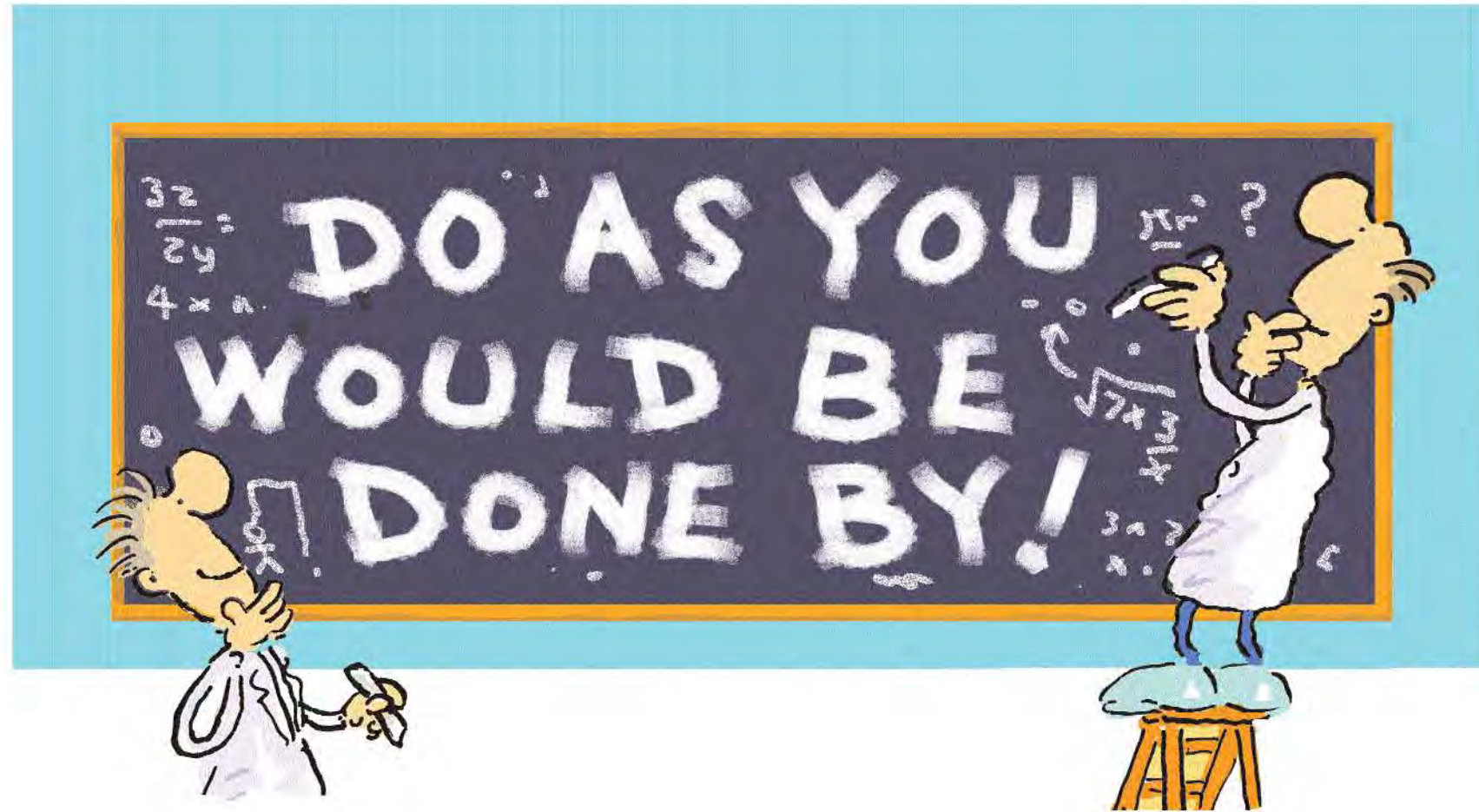

There are millions and millions and millions of people in the world.

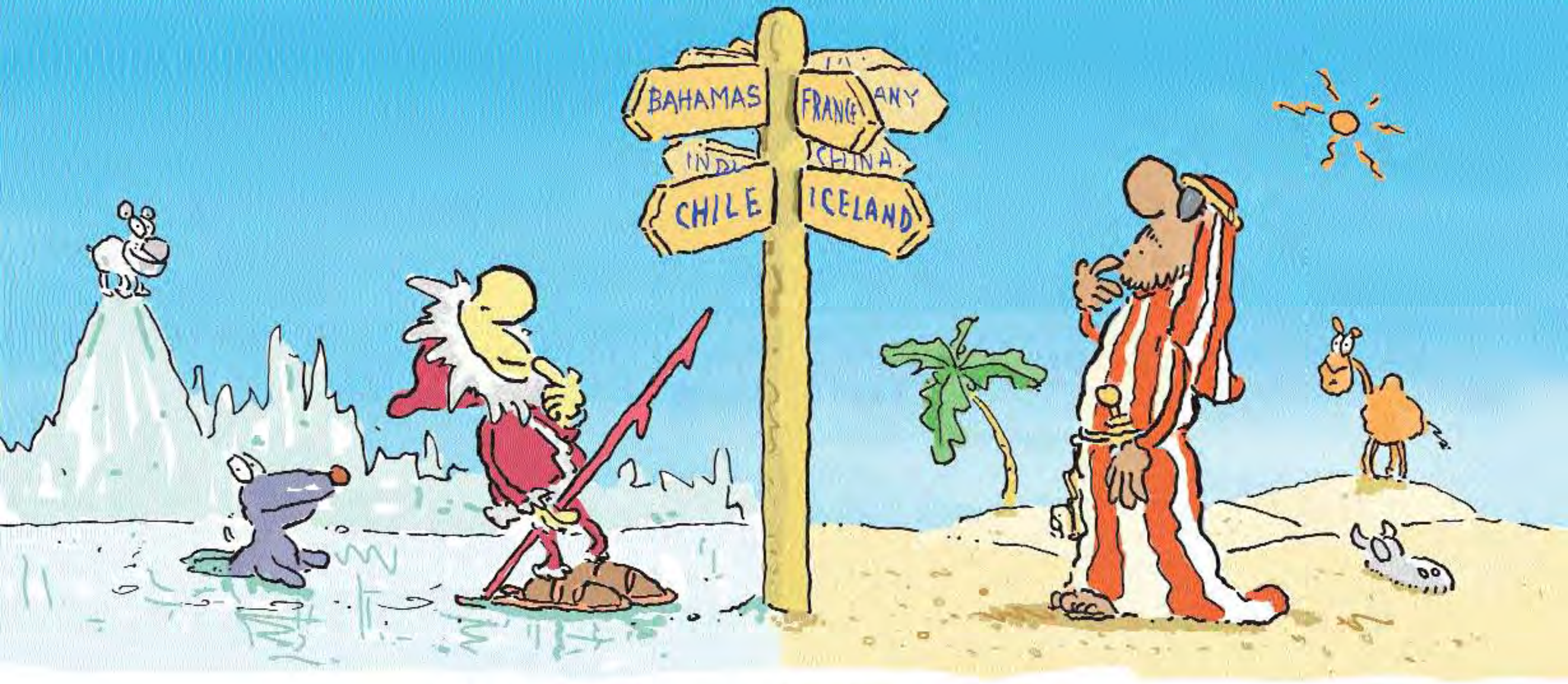


There are big people.

And there are little people.



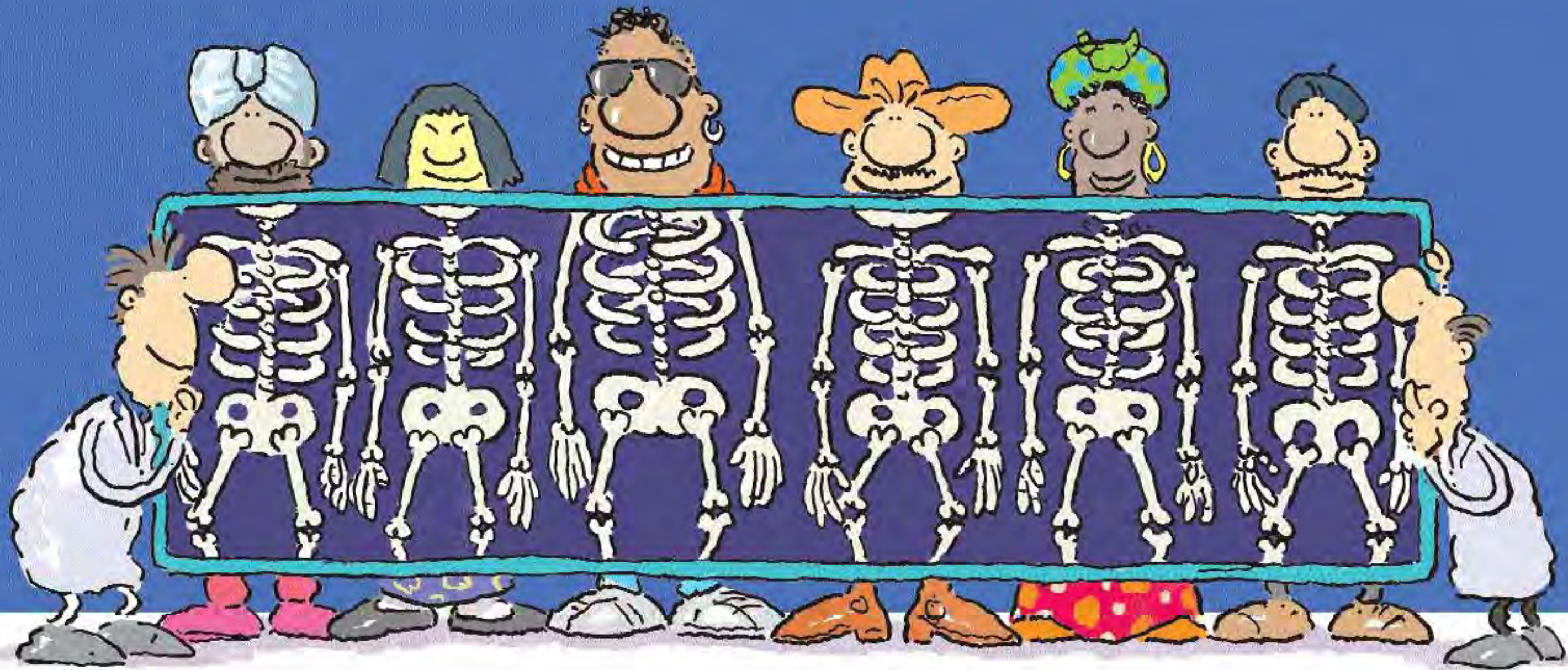
There are different coloured people.

But, really, we are all the same.

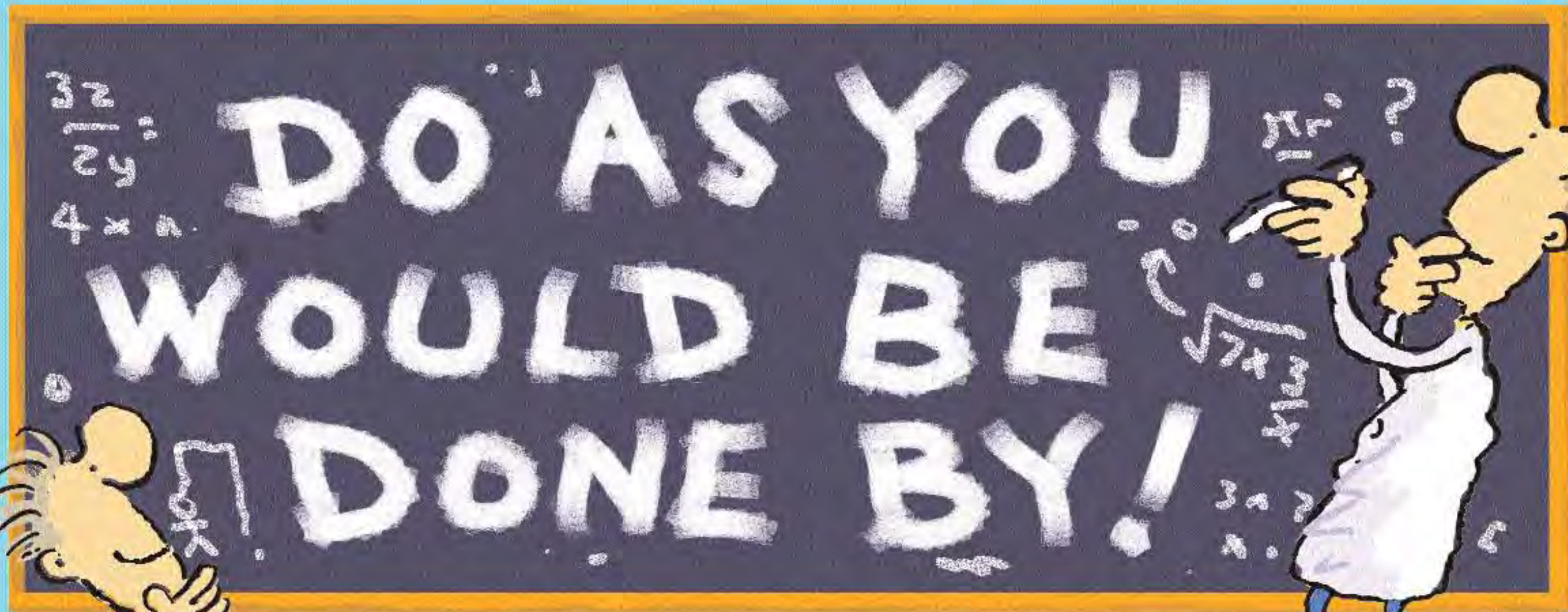
We are all people.

You don't like living in a dirty, smelly mess.



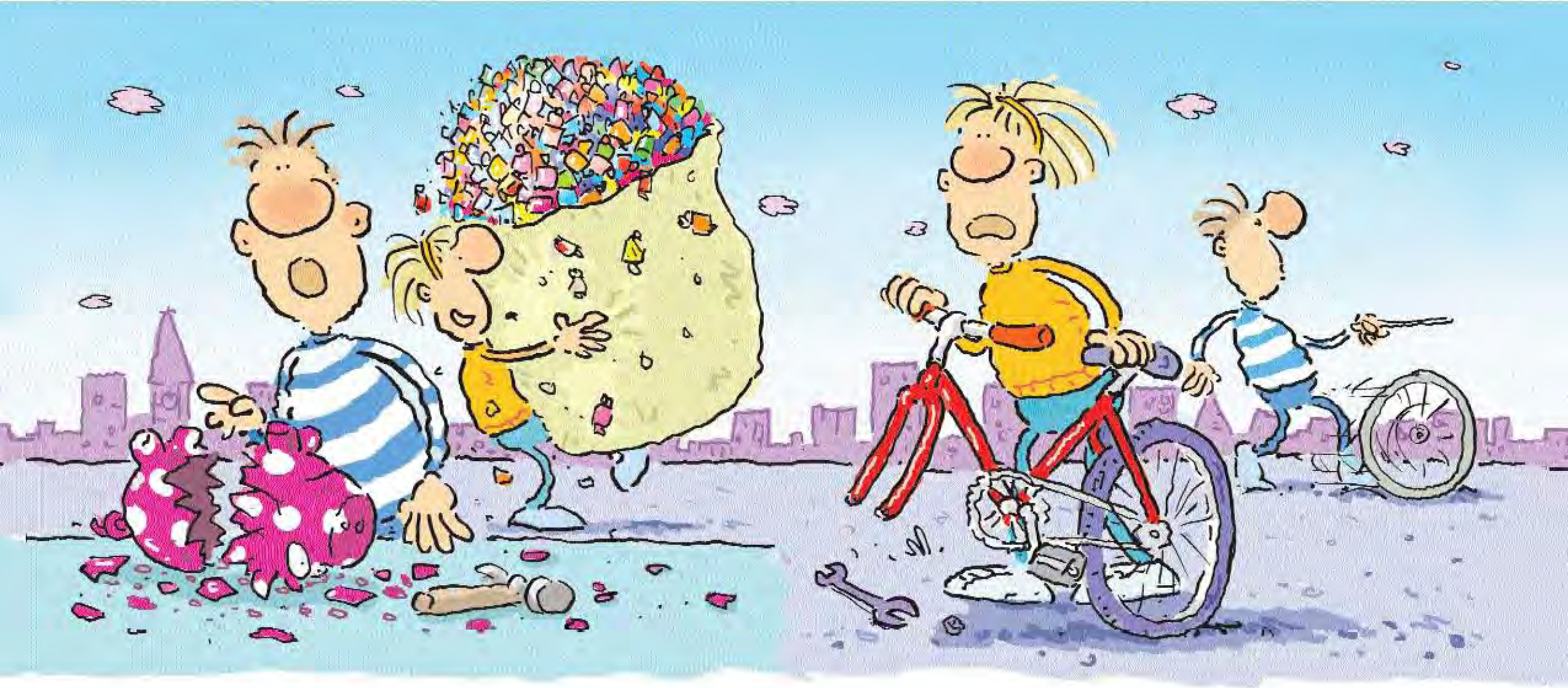
So why make a mess for others?
